[redacted] Lane 400 Block, Avenue G and H South, October 21, 1968.

268

Description: 18 years, 5' 2", tall, small, dark hair, short at back and over face at front. Dark sweater and slacks.

Miller File -

Page 352 [redacted] shown 19 spread on table from which she picked Milgaard and another. Done on April 7, 1969.

349 [redacted] Blood Group "O".

337 [redacted] clothing revealed to Crime Laboratory that her attacker was "A" Group Secretor.



MILLER FILE -

Page 151 Item "I" - two lumps frozen in snow under where body was found.

289 Identified as sperm of "A" group blood secretor. Contained pubic hair of Gail Miller who was an "O" blood group.

367 Item "S" - blue wool touque found in yard of house north of 334 Avenue "O" South.

369 Lab. found human blood on touque but too minute to group.

339 Wallet found in snow on boulevard in front of 326 Avenue "O" South. Two Hospitalization cards also found in Miller's name at edge of sidewalk and snow on boulevard.

52 Brown fiber found on name pin of Gail Miller.

Statement 9 Mrs. Marie Indyh - 7:05 AM, January 31st, waiting near St. Mary Church - Avenue "O" and 20th Street, for church to open.

Page 107 Woman ran from east on 20th Street - across street to about 3 feet from her - walked north on Avenue "O" west side - looked distressed.
Description: 25 - 30 years, black coat and black color dark high boots, white scarf over head, one end hanging down side, dark hair. No further knowledge as she went to church.

Page 116 Henry Diewold - Caretaker St. Marys Church, opened church a little late. When he did he saw car headlights down lane at about rear of funeral home.

Page 135 Simon Doell - X-Ray, City Hospital.
- Rides bus to work and is certain Gail Miller caught bus at Avenue N and 20th Street.
- Miller told him she was getting ride to work when asked about not being on bus.

Page 355 Nichol John - Regina, 817 Victoria Avenue
Statement 81 Came to Saskatoon January 31 with Ron Wilson, David Milgaard, in Wilson's
March 11/69 auto.
- Milgaard wore brown suede jacket with lighter color knit cuffs, collar and stripes on front.
- Dark color touque - which she has not seen since.
- Admits Milgaard acted strange on AM, January 31, 1969.
- Admits seeing nurse (looked like nurse) near funeral home. Asked directions.
- Nichol John wore purple parka with brownish white fur trim on hood and on bottom, slacks.
- Saw no blood on Milgaard's trousers but admits he changed at 334 Avenue "O" South, because they were ripped.
- Wilson and Milgaard changed at Wilson's home in Regina because of acid on cloths when putting battery in Wilson's car - information of Mrs. Wilson.
- Says friend Barb Berard was told by Milgaard that he was going to be picked up for murder.

Page 374 Wilson Blood Group "B".
Cadrain Blood Group "O".
Milgaard Blood Group "A".

Statements 74 & 75 Albert Cadrain, 334 Avenue "O" South.
- Went to Alberta January 31st with John, Milgaard and Wilson.
- On return from Alberta goes to Police stating Milgaard changed cloths at his home after 9:00 AM, January 31st.
- Milgaard drove Wilson car to Alberta PM, January 31st.
- Milgaard alleged that he had to get out of town - seemed excited.
- Clothing changed - shirt and trousers, both alleged to have blood stains.
- After changing believed put in suitcase and taken out to car.
- Had taken keys from Wilson and on return had got stuck.

- On way to Calgary, John and Cadrain in rear seat, Wilson front and Milgaard driving.
- Everyone alleged afraid of Milgaard.
- Bought paring knife in Rosetown on way to Alberta.
- Karst and Lt. Short told by Cadrain that Milgaard had wanted to get a gun if he would help him get rid of (murder?) John and Wilson. This was an January 31st.
- Wilson, John, Milgaard out of money on arrival in Saskatoon.

Statement 70 Aline Cadrain - knows Milgaard and her opinion is that he has no respect for women.

- Milgaard lived at their home 4 or 5 days.

Statement 82 Sharon Williams - St. Albert.

- Tell of her association while traveling with Milgaard.

- Sex relations with Milgaard.

- Use of drugs while with Milgaard.

- Milgaard had no money when in St. Albert, February 1, 1969.

- Albert Cadrain paid bills.

Lt. Short - Detective Karst -

- Albert Cadrain advised them that Milgaard spoke to him about getting a gun and wanting his help to get rid of (murder?) Nichol John and Wilson.

Statement 72 Wally Danchuk - 129 Avenue "T" South.

- Mrs. Danchuk - Tell of getting stuck in alley at rear of their home and of another vehicle assisting and also getting stuck.

- Tow truck called and occupants of Wilson car waited in their house.

- This occurred about 7:40 AM, January 31st.

May 6/69

Lt. Penkala -

- contacted S/S Paynter - Crime Lab.

- S/S Paynter cannot say saliva test for secretor is positive.

- If cloth used for sample had soap in fiber it would destroy ABO antigens.

May 5/69 D/S Mackie - Betty Ann Smyth - Red Cross.

- Interviewed on Secretors.
- Cannot say saliva test is positive as insufficient knowledge available on subject.
- Suggests semen test to be certain in this case.

Lt. Short & Det. Karst -

- Father of Milgaard made statement to effect that he was not surprised and had suspected something like this might happen.

SUMMARY -

- Milgaard alleges he could not find Cadrain's house even though he lived there a few days.
- On his travels he seems to have no problem finding any particular address to obtain drugs or other things he wants.
- From where some articles were found it would appear that possibly no lights on at Cadrain's house when the three first arrived from Regina or shortly after, therefore, they did not call at the house.
- All were out of funds and may have gone driving with a view to getting money.
- On seeing nurse (Miller) she was approached on pretence of getting directions with a view to stealing her purse.
- This would be around funeral home which would coincide with statements of Nichol John - Diewold seeing lights in alley - Doell saying Miller took bus at Avenue N.
- Wilson appears to be driver of car, therefore, Milgaard would leave car to get purse - having seen Miller closer his sex drive takes over and he forces her down alley to where she is found.
- Nichol John knows or suspects results and leaves car. Runs west on 20th Street in 1400 Block and is girl seen by Indyh at St. Mary Church. At this point she changes her mind about saying anything and goes north on Avenue "O" where she meets car again.
- Milgaard after murder returns to car with boot and sweater (car possibly followed down lane) to which Wilson objects to and as a result are buried in the snow.
- Purse thrown in garbage on way through alley from Avenue "N" to "O" - possibly when Nichol John returns to car and is picked up.
- Wallet and touque are in car and when Milgaard gets keys from Wilson at Cadrain's to put suitcase in car, he disposes of touque and wallet at this time.
- Nichol John says Milgaard wore a dark touque which she has not seen since Jan. 31st.
- Milgaard has removed wallet from purse at scene and retains it without Wilson or Nichol John knowing he obtained it.
- He may have been intent on keeping the purse and it is put in garbage after Wilson looks for money in it, and at time Nichol John returns to car.
- Or did Wilson and Milgaard both become involved in theft of purse and Milgaard intent on rape assaults and murders Gail Miller. Wilson has purse, goes through it and puts it in the garbage can while waiting on Milgaard who he is aware is raping Miller.

SUGGESTIONS -

- Nichol John, Wilson and Cadrain be brought to Saskatoon where with all present the true story can be obtained ever if hypnosis or polygraph are necessary.
- Milgaard be located and a sperm sample be obtained if possible.
