Information was received in the last day or so from MILGAARD's lawyer Hershe WOLCH, 904-444 St. Mary Avenue, Winnipeg, who is claiming that they received information from an individual who calls himself Sidney WILSON. WILSON states that the person responsible for the murder is an individual by the name of Larry FISHER and that FISHER's wife saw her husband with blood covered clothing on the morning of the murder, and that she apparently told WILSON later on that it was Larry who committed this murder.			
	✓	2. WILLIAMS advises there is potential for publicity and media interest in this case, and it is requested that we conduct our investigation as sensitively as possible. I advised WILLIAMS to send his instructions in writing with a brief history on the information that he was in possession of, and we would provide whatever assistance we could.

	✓	11. Penitentiary Service has a letter on file addressed to Chief KETTLES, Saskatoon Police Department, dated 20 OCT 70, indicating that members of the Winnipeg department interviewed FISHER and he denied any involvement in these offences (not sure which offences he was interviewed on).

Had a telephone conversation with Eugene WILLIAMS, indicating he had been in contact with David ASPER and it is now believed that no such person as Sidney WILSON exists so far as being involved in this case is concerned. It is believed that the person who supplied the information may be Brian WRIGHT, Linda's common-law husband, during the late 70's, early 80's. ASPER apparently obtained this information from Joyce MILGAARD, and it is not known exactly how accurate this is. Sometime during the past weekend, Joyce MILGAARD went to Cando, Sask. and interviewed Linda, and also went to North Battleford and talked to Larry FISHER's mother, Maria. Mrs. MILGAARD apparently made inquiries to determine if the Justice Department has been investigating her complaint. Maria FISHER apparently called the RCMP members in North Battleford as she felt she was being bothered unnecessarily by Mrs. MILGAARD.</p> <p>20. Larry LAFLEUR, P.A. Pen Security, advised that there were approximately 172 WILSON's in the federal system. No Sidney which would possibly relate to this incident, and the name WILSON is very common and there is no Sidney that we know of that is associated to the MILGAARD case.</p> <p>21. Mrs. MILGAARD provided her lawyer with information as follows. Larry and Linda FISHER were married in 1967 and they lived at the CADRAIN residence. The night before the murder of Gail MILLER, Larry FISHER went out in the evening and did not return, while Linda waited up until the early hours of the morning. When Linda awoke about 9 am the day of the murder, Larry was present in the suite and wearing good clothes, not his working clothes. Larry and Linda had an argument concerning Larry's extra-curricular activities, and at some point during their discussion, Linda heard a report on the radio of the discovery of the body of Gail MILLER. Linda immediately accused Larry of the crime, and went into a rage of accusations. Larry is said to have dropped his hands to his side and took on a look of shock.</p> <p>22. Linda has two uncles, Roy and Cliff. At the time Cliff loaned his car to Larry. There are also indications that Gail MILLER's boyfriend at the time said he saw a red car parked near Gail on the early morning of the murder. Apparently Uncle Roy observed Larry throw a new pair of boots into a garbage can and burn them. Unknown exactly when this took place.</p>

This was explained to Mrs. MILGAARD and everyone departed.

She is a very open, sincere individual and did not appear to be motivated through revenge, and seemed sincerely concerned about the facts surrounding the death of MILGAARD, and the information that she possesses. She indicated to me the MILLER murder had been on her mind since Larry FISHER, her ex-husband, was convicted of the rapes in Winnipeg in 1970. Linda admitted having an alcohol problem in the past for which she received counselling, and that her personal life had not been easy, however she does come across as being an honest and sincere person. She did indicate that she had told many people of her belief that Larry FISHER could have been involved in the murder of Gail MILLER. Linda states she gave a statement to Saskatoon City Police uniform member in 1980. It was late at night, she had been drinking at the time, and because the MILLER death bothered her, she attended at the Saskatoon City Police station and gave a statement. At this time she was in the company of her then common-law husband Brian WRIGHT, who actually drove her to the police station. Everything Brian or anyone else may have said about Larry's activities at his home during the period of JAN 30 to 31 1969, would have come from Linda, as she was alone with Larry at that time, and everything else would actually be heresy.		
		32. Linda does not know anyone by the name of Larry Brian FISHER or Sidney WILSON. The only WILSON Linda is associated to is a David WILSON, who was at one time married to Donna PAMBRUN, who is Uncle Roy's daughter. The following key points were raised by Linda during our interview.
