

Mr. WILLIAMS expressed concern, stating, "Is there basis to doubt the conviction? Would jury convict if known about FISHER at the time?" WILLIAMS seems to have concerns that the polygraph results are not admissible and could be persuasive in terms of disposition of the case. My position is this - we asked FISHER once to take the polygraph test, which came back inconclusive. Why would we not continue in our attempts again? WILLIAMS'S advice is that he wishes to talk to his superiors on this point.			
91-09-18	1010	261. Mr. WILLIAMS called to advise that a decision has not yet been made regarding the polygraph testing of FISHER.			
		262. Also during this time frame I contacted the Sask Pen officials, looking for any FISHER file material which would indicate when FISHER was in the Stony Mountain Institution. I was advised there was nothing in P.A. of value. I then placed a call to Bruce PACHINSKI, IPSO at Stony Mountain, 796-2231, who advises that FISHER may have gone from Stony Mountain to the Psychiatric Centre in Saskatoon in the early '70's. I explained to PACHINSKI the nature of my inquiries and that I wished to determine if FISHER, during counselling or therapy, ever mentioned anything of the MILLER murder. I also indicated an interest to PACHINSKI of travelling to Mountain Institution and reviewing the institutional files that are held on Larry FISHER, the purpose being to determine if there is anything that could be construed as evidence on that file.			
	1315	263. PACHINSKI called back to advise he had discussed my request with the Warden and it was ok for me to review all prison files with the exception of the medical file, which is protected information.			
		264. I contacted Mr. WILLIAMS and advised him I would be arranging to fly to B.C. for the purpose of reviewing FISHER's 21 year file history at the institution.

I called Mr. WILLIAMS, who advised the decision on whether FISHER should be given a polygraph examination was put off until 3:00 p.m. today as he has a further meeting with his superiors. I also discussed with Mr. WILLIAMS my intention of travelling to B.C. to review the FISHER penitentiary file.

266. This a.m. I had a conversation with Supt. GOODMAN, who indicated he had been at a social with several City Police members, one being retired Insp. PARKER, who was talking about having seen what he believed to be moccasin tracks at the scene of the MILLER murder. Apparently it was initially thought that a Native Indian may have been responsible. I discussed this matter with WILLIAMS and the fact that evidence at trial suggested that MILGAARD was in his stocking feet at certain times during the morning of the murder. Could what was believed to be moccasin tracks actually be sock impressions in the snow? I will attempt to interview PARKER and determine if he has notes left on this point, and what he has to say.

91-09-20 1010 267. I returned a call to Mr. WILLIAMS, who advised that a decision has been made not to have FISHER take the polygraph examination. His superiors have met and decided, "the down side risks outweigh the benefits". He went on to say, "the testing procedure is highly subjective and cannot be converted to evidence." WILLIAMS did not indicate if polygraphist SHALK had been consulted.

268. Mr. WILLIAMS also advised that the Federal Justice Dept. was currently negotiating with another witness but WILLIAMS would not tell me who this was. (I asked). I understand this interview is to take place in British Columbia.

269. I asked WILLIAMS whether or not WILSON had ever taken a polygraph test based on his recent revelations. Mr. WILLIAMS said WILSON has agreed to take the test, however the conditions were so difficult that Federal Justice could not comply.

270. I again expressed concern that we had once asked FISHER to take the polygraph, which he did, how do we now justify in our own minds not pursuing this particular aspect of the investigation, particularly when the new Application is directed to the activities of FISHER, and he is the prime suspect. We have to ask ourselves, is



		<p>FISHER's criminal activity at the time sufficient to be considered circumstantial evidence, if so, it should be developed fully. In my view, a polygraph examination is an approach that should not be overlooked if the opportunity does arise, however, in the past FISHER has been very reluctant in his cooperation with me. It was agreed that Mr. WILLIAMS would recontact Mr. PICK and determine if in fact his client would agree to submit himself to a polygraph test. I believe this is being done after some prodding on my part, however, that is an opinion only.</p>		
91-09-20	1425	<p>271. Mr. WILLIAMS called to advise he had spoken to Harold PICK and that FISHER will not take a polygraph test and will not grant any more interviews to the police. There is one window of opportunity which exists, that being that CBC reported Carl KARP is doing a program on the FISHER angle on "The Fifth Estate". If this does not go well for FISHER, he may grant further interviews with us. Indications are that FISHER and his current wife are fed up with the publicity and the hounding by the media.</p> <p>272. During my previous conversation with Mr. WILLIAMS, I asked him to ensure that the questions concerning the Redacted complaint be covered with Mr. PICK, who in turn was to ask the questions of Mr. FISHER. I have been advised FISHER indicates he does not know where Redacted is located and does not know what we are referring to when we talk of this incident; i.e., Redacted. Mr. PICK advised that FISHER indicated he knows where Avenue "H" in Saskatoon is located, however denies being there on 31 JAN 1969, re the Redacted complaint.</p>



91-09-24	am	277. Received a telephone call from Gary TREBLE, Sask Police Commission, who wishes to see me tomorrow at 10 am to gather further information on his inquiries into the missing files associated to Larry FISHER's Saskatoon convictions.		
91-09-25	1050	278. I met with Gary TREBLE and Bill GRAHAM, Sask Police Commission, in my office. I offered to assist any way possible. I provided them whatever information I had which would assist them in locating the so-called missing FISHER files. At this time I also made a copy of the Redacted file which Bill GRAHAM had, as I did not believe I had the complete file on this matter, after seeing the thick material he possessed.		
		279. I also provided a photocopy of one page of the Application under Section 690 CC regarding the alleged City Police source that was deleted out. I explained to Gary and Bill I would share with them the results of the Crime Lab documentation examination when they were known.		
		280. I also went over file material provided by Saskatoon City Police regarding the examination they made of sex offences from the late 1960's and early 1970's.		
		281. GRAHAM indicated to me that he has taken possession of the micro-fiche tapes to determine if they had been tampered with or if the files had ever been entered into the system. Not much I can do to assist in this regard, but I did express to them the fact that the

		Saskatoon City Police officials have been extremely cooperative with me in my requests of them, and I am left with the impression they would like nothing better than to get this matter cleared, as the publicity is putting them in a bad light.		
	1720	282. I departed for Vancouver via Air Canada flight 214, I arrived at Waterfront Place Hotel at approximately 20 15 hrs, then walked over to Hotel Vancouver and met with Mr. WILLIAMS. At this time I was able to determine from him that the witness he had dealt with today was Nichole JOHN, who was placed under hypnosis in an attempt to bring back her subconscious memory.		
91-09-26	0810	283. Called Mountain Prison and talked with Bruce PACHINSKI and arranged to see him at 11 00 hrs today. Mr. WILLIAMS and I attended at the Mountain Institution near Agassiz, B.C. where we both reviewed a total of nine files, these being case management, discipline, and psychological. The medical file was not available to us because of protection. Our stay and the file review lasted approximately three hours.		
		284. There was nothing in the FISHER material that I reviewed which would suggest there is any association to the MILLER murder or to the death of any other person whose identity is unknown. In summary, the material was not very revealing so far as Mr. FISHER's criminal activity prior to entering the correctional system. WILLIAMS and I returned to Vancouver and had a final discussion prior to parting. It was agreed that the analytical work on the similar fact comparison if possible should be done by this Friday, as there is an urgency in getting this completed. Also it was agreed that I would interview Insp. PARKER concerning his comments about moccasin tracks being found at the MILLER scene. And also, Mr. WILLIAMS suggested that I may be called upon to re-interview the FISHER victims to ensure complete details are secured for the purposes of this review.

	1545	309. Contacted Neil MacDONALD, Social Services, requesting he check any data banks they may have for records on David MILGAARD. If any are located, we will then discuss how these can properly be accessed if in fact they have any value to this inquiry.		
91-11-04	0915	310. Received a call from Langenburg High School registry office, indicating David was in school at that location from 1965 to 1966 in grade 8. In 1966/67, David was in school with his last attendance being NOV 03, records show a transfer. The principal's secretary was a student with David and thought he moved to Winnipeg after leaving that community.		
91-11-05	1600	311. Jack PARKER called and we discussed the information that had been passed to me by the C/Supt. earlier. PARKER stated he had been at the scene sometime after 7:00 am, it was still fairly dark out and an extremely cold morning. PARKER recalls that he sees someone lying near a shack on the east side of the north/south lane, he states his first impression was that this was a drunken Indian, as he saw the auburn, reddish coloured hair. He stated he phoned and obtained the services of the coroner. He says PENKALA and KLIEV from Ident arrived. PARKER stated he could not see any fresh tracks in the snow but there was frost on the ground and that the body was getting stiff. He states that he requested that coroner FOGEL take a rectal temperature, the coroner went back to the car and apparently took the temperature of the deceased. PARKER was left alone until Ident arrived. At that time they rolled the body over and found a name tag on the uniform.		
		312. PARKER made the statement that he observed or recalls what appeared to have been a car stuck in the south lane of the east/west alley. He also stated he found women's items, no details provided, 20 feet or so from where the car was stuck. PARKER also stated that he recalled seeing some footprints in the snow that looked like moccasin tracks, this was in the east/west lane, going west away from the location where the vehicle was stuck. PARKER states, "I remember smooth tracks on the north side of the east/west lane. No sign of a scuffle in the area." And that he was called off the investigation early to work on break and enters. PARKER states there were only a couple of moccasin-like tracks, he never connected tracks to MILGAARD's stocking feet until quite some time after.

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

I wished to interview her regarding any information she may have concerning the PAMBRUNS and FISHER. It seems she is now an outsider and may be of some value here. I am interested in determining what vehicles Larry may have had access to as the possibility, in my mind, exists that MILLER was picked up, assaulted in a vehicle, and actually killed at the location but not necessarily sexually assaulted. This is little more than a gut feeling, however certainly has possibilities, particularly in view of the unusual murder scene; i.e., stabbing through the jacket and not the dress of the deceased.

408. I am also interested in talking with Terry PAMBRUN. According to Redacted she recalls Terry and Larry FISHER being together in those days. She also mentioned the vehicle being a full sized white car. This has not yet been identified.

Pursuing this vehicle angle, it is also noted in McCORRISTON's notes dated FEB 4th, 1969, the following: "6:14 am further interviewed Tony HUMEN, 216 O South, states approximately 6:30 pm JAN 30/69 noted 63 Pontiac sedan, white/blue operated alone - window down, followed bus. Sister Natlia 17 with Tony at time, saw same auto and man approximately 7:05 am JAN 31st as she was catching the bus at O and 20th. The window down, sister scared. Description early 20's, brownish hair. Natlia will be home at 5:30 pm." Can Terry enlighten us here as to what vehicles FISHER may have had accessed in those days, and was it possibly a 63 Pontiac as described by HUMEN?

Ken did say he thought Larry was a loner and would often leave the group he was with and go for a walk. He also described Larry as being somewhat weird and an individual who dressed gaudy and liked to be a "cool dude" as he described him. Ken is unaware of any conversation Larry had which would implicate involvement in crimes of molestation of women. SHOEMAKER also could not recall any vehicle Larry may have had at the time.





Natlia never knew Larry FISHER and really had very poor recollection of details as outlined in McCORRISTON's notes.
- 2115 518. I called Leonard SONNLEITNER in Calgary and we had a discussion about the vehicle that Larry had apparently borrowed from him. Leonard states the vehicle was a 1956 Pontiac, turquoise/white four door sedan. Leonard states the vehicle was parked in the Masonry Contractors compound in Regina shortly after it was recovered from where Larry FISHER had abandoned it. Leonard was of the opinion he had taken the car home prior to actually parking it in the compound sometime later. Leonard stated that he removed the transmission from the Pontiac and that he actually put it into a GMC half ton short box, possibly a 1965, he can't recall for sure. When asked why Larry would have been in Regina, Leonard thought possibly Larry and Linda may have been staying with him for a few days, but he was not sure of this as well. Leonard does not recall anything of Florence's knitted quilt, but

advises that he always had some sort of car blanket in his vehicles. He advised me he thought his ex-wife Florence may know more detail. (I did not advise Leonard I had been talking to Florence. Leonard also stated that Bob OPSETH of Saskatoon or Jake KETLER may be able to help in locating the car. Leonard could not recall if he ever asked Larry about what happened to the car and he isn't sure if he saw Larry after this incident. His mind has obviously left him on these points. Leonard could not recall driving the vehicle after Larry had borrowed it, but stated he could have. He thought possibly the car had more serious mechanical damage than he now can recall. Leonard claims he purchased one of his two cars from John VERMETTE, who stayed at Leonard's. Leonard states he worked for Masonry Contractors until 1971. He also advises that Linda FISHER had never mentioned her recent suspicions that Larry may have been involved in the MILLER murder, and states it never came up in any conversation he had with Linda.

520. Sylvia POITRAS, sister to Larry FISHER, returned my call. She sounded very upbeat and cooperative, indicating this has been very unsettling and hard to handle, and in particular, her mother was not in good health and Sylvia was reluctant to contact her to determine what vehicles Larry may have had access to during those years. She states this entire process has been very stressful for the entire FISHER family. I asked what vehicles Pierce PERRY had during the time Larry was around. Sylvia could recall PERRY having a sky blue half ton truck, he possibly had a car but she can't remember the make or the colour but will contact her mother and try to get more information. Sylvia states she is going to her home in North Battleford tomorrow, she also states she never knew Gail MILLER. She indicated she was shocked to hear the number of assaults Larry had been involved in, and that she had never heard about this until the news media covered this case last year.
