

Mr. WILLIAMS called to advised he had a discussion with Jack HEWITT, regional union representative at Stony Mountain Institution during the time Ben DOZENKO went through his discipline hearings. HEWITT thought DOZENKO's suspension was severe and advised him to appeal. HEWITT recalls talking to DOZENKO and expressing the hope that MILGAARD, during his escape, does not commit another murder. DOZENKO is said to have replied something to the effect "I have no problem with that score. David has not killed anybody." WILLIAMS wants DOZENKO interviewed about this conversation, as well as whereabouts of any file, papers, etc. that DOZENKO may have filed regarding his contact with MILGAARD.		
1420		537. I contacted Cst. McDONALD, Yorkton GIS, to determine if he had released any information at all regarding the [Redacted] file. He confirmed nothing has been released.		
1445		538. I called Winnipeg GIS, Sgt. Bill MCKENZIE, and he will make contact with DOZENKO and advise. I also requested that MCKENZIE contact the Winnipeg Police Dept. and determine if they can tell me more about McIVOR, possibly contact Darcy JONES, 986-6028.		
1600		539. MCKENZIE called back, he wanted clarification on notes and file material requested of DOZENKO. Same provided.		
1640		540. Met with Supt. GOODMAN and Insp. MURRAY, Saskatoon Sub/Division, and updated them on my concern about Brian BERESH's revelations that he received information from the RCMP. I explained to both Officers the facts. Supt. GOODMAN suggested the statement may have been released to Mr. BERESH by [Redacted] lawyer in Regina, who she contacted earlier about laying criminal charges against MILGAARD. It is recalled that her lawyer did request a copy of her original statement, as well as the one that [Redacted] recently provided. This was in turn provided to him, either by Sask Justice or RCMP HQ in Regina.

92-01-24	1005	541. Mr. WILLIAMS called, stating that WILSON has been cited for contempt of court, which I was aware of via the news media.	
	1035	542. Mr. WILLIAMS called, had a transcript indicating "S/Sgt. PEARSON had provided statement yesterday re victim #1." According to the transcript, BERESH's comments could have two meanings: (a) I gave him a statement, or (b) he has a statement which was taken by myself. I am extremely concerned about the confidential nature of enquiries and the sensitive process we are involved in; I have asked Mr. WILLIAMS to ensure that this matter is clarified to the Court as I do not wish the Court or anyone else to believe that information has been provided directly to Mr. BERESH. I have requested of Mr. WILLIAMS to ensure this point is clarified and that the confirmation is provided to me in writing. Mr. WILLIAMS will pursue this and be in touch.	
	1100	543. I called Cst. KOCH, Regina Provost, looking for McIVOR. He is in Winnipeg for Court. I questioned KOCH on McIVOR's statement. He indicates McIVOR is very believable and convincing, stating, "I believed him, I really did." KOCH has seven years service on Provost and claims to have taken 40 or 50 prisoner statements. According to this member, McIVOR said something like, "Can I make a deal? Something I got to get off my chest." Knowing what McIVOR's reputation is within the Corrections system, we must be sure that we are not getting caught up in a con scheme by someone who may be fabricating or making up a story. I will locate and re-interview McIVOR myself and determine further details. I advised Cst. KOCH to secure the original tapes and to provide me with two copies, one of which will be forwarded to Federal Justice for their information.	
	1200	544. I received a telephone call from Colleen CLEGG (nee URB nee SWEENEY), Sicamous, B.C. phone 836-4188. She related a story that in 1969 she lived in Prince Albert and that her son Bobby, who was 16 years at the time, was selling magazines in Saskatoon in 1969. In reading the newspaper articles, Bobby saw a picture of David MILGAARD and his involvement in the MILLER murder. Bobby then advised his mother that he in fact had been working with MILGAARD during the magazine selling in Saskatoon. Colleen in turn phoned the Prince Albert RCMP and a member came to their home and took Bobby to the police station, where he viewed photos. Bobby then returned home, half crying, stating that David MILGAARD was the person involved in this murder.



		<p>545. During this time period, Bobby related to his mother that he, David MILGAARD, and another boy lived together in a motel in Saskatoon. Bobby and the other boy returned to the motel one evening to find the door locked and a girl was inside, screaming. They kicked the door in and found David apparently assaulting a girl. Colleen now cannot sleep, thinking her son may have been involved some way in the murder of Gail MILLER. Colleen indicated that Bobby and this second individual had apparently driven the girl home after removing her from the motel room. She is now asking if this was Gail MILLER that was driven home. She states that Bobby has been a life-long drug addict and is presently under charge in Terrace, B.C. and that Bobby has a poor attitude toward authority and would probably not cooperate if he was approached. Colleen sounded like a very sincere, rational person, who calmly related to me her concerns and now wants to clarify if in fact her son could be involved in any way. I advised Colleen that a Federal Justice lawyer, Mr. WILLIAMS, may be in contact with her to pursue more details. I did assure her that at the time of MILLER's death, MILGAARD had just arrived in Saskatoon and had not been to a motel, etc. prior to the murder. In my mind it would seem this incident is totally unrelated, however, the information will be passed on to Mr. WILLIAMS of Federal Justice.</p>	
1235		<p>546. I contacted Sgt. MCKENZIE, Winnipeg GIS, who stated that McIVOR is currently in their city and is a witness in the UNGER murder trial. It is unknown when McIVOR will be returning to the Prince Albert Pen for further interview.</p>	
1310		<p>547. Contacted Mr. WILLIAMS and advised him the details of the Colleen CLEGG call. He did not seem to think this was of significance to the investigation, however, will consider contacting this lady for more details. I also advised Mr. WILLIAMS of my discussion with Cst. KOCH and the fact that he believes McIVOR, and also that I have tried to locate McIVOR for follow-up interview. WILLIAMS was advised I would be sending him a copy of McIVOR's taped statement when I received same. At this time I also advised Mr. WILLIAMS of the information received from Osborne TURNER. I have not yet had the opportunity to follow up on this lead.</p>

	1600	549. Made contact with Osborne TURNER, who states he was at a drinking party in Prince Albert last week. He also advises he does not know the fellow who was talking about this, but it was a Native and he was saying that rumour around suggests that Bernard CHICKENESS, possibly from Poundmaker Reserve, was responsible for the MILLER murder. CHICKENESS was apparently working at a meat packing plant at the time and Bernard died in a motor vehicle accident many years ago. TURNER said the fellow that committed the murder felt so bad that he got into an auto accident, possibly a suicide. TURNER had no further info, however I felt that he knows who he is talking about but does not want to involve anyone else. TURNER stated that the individuals he was talking to seemed to be credible people, and the conversation took place at a Prince Albert beverage room. No further details available.

		<p>Moose Jaw, Carlyle, and Brandon during the years Florence and her husband Leonard lived in Regina. Florence does not recall any vehicle that Pierce PERRY, Larry's step-father, may have had during those years. FISHER's real father was Rocky FISHER, no other information available. I asked Florence about any necklace or medallions that Larry may have worn. She did confirm that he usually wore some type of a necklace but can't provide any details. This was asked by me in regard to the [Redacted] assault in which [Redacted] during her assault, recalled her assailant wearing a medallion or an unusual type of necklace.</p>			
1140	552.	<p>I called Linda FISHER, she has now located photos of Larry wearing various items of clothing, and the photos may be of benefit to this investigation. She also confirms she has one photo showing him wearing Mukluk type boots and also one where he is wearing an old black leather jacket with a sheep's wool collar. I was looking for a jacket with a sheep's wool collar Larry may have had, as there is a wool type material that was found on the name tag of the deceased, which has not yet been identified and is possibly from the assailant's clothing. Also, it should be noted that the assault of [Redacted] at 7:07 am on the morning of Gail MILLER's murder, described her assailant as wearing a dark leather or suede type jacket with a wool type collar. Linda also has a photo of Larry wearing a pair of work boots, however, it is of poor quality. She also now relates to me that she recalls someone telling her that a pair of blood covered coveralls were found in the attic at CADRAIN's home at 334 Avenue O South. Linda thought [Redacted] may know more about this but she is not sure. Linda also indicates she recalls something about [Redacted] being assaulted by Larry and that possibly Allan intervened. (This sounds like the same incident I told me about involving Larry and Allan PAMBRUN, at which time she was assaulted by Larry outside the truck while PAMBRUN was waiting) Linda advises that Allan PAMBRUN did not have a vehicle in those days and that Allan got his licence at the same time as Linda did and that was in 1972. Linda was questioned about any necklace or medallion that Larry may have worn at that time and she does not recall Larry wearing anything of this type.</p>

Mr. WILLIAMS called and asked if I would be available to take the exhibits from the MILGAARD case to a London, England lab for DNA testing; i.e., underclothes, semen, blood, etc. I confirmed that I would be available to assist whenever possible and that I would be able to secure proper authority to travel, etc. I agreed with Mr. WILLIAMS only on the condition that the exhibits could be handled as carry on luggage as my concern would be continuity. This seems to be no problem. I await further confirmation and direction from Mr. WILLIAMS.</p> <p>554. Mr. WILLIAMS also advised that Winnipeg lawyer David MILES (204)942-7489 contacted Federal Justice, advising he had a client who was at the original trial. This client apparently heard someone believed to be a witness at the trial say, "If he gets out he'll kill me." WILLIAMS was now asking if we could contact MILES to get more information as to what this was all about. Mr. WILLIAMS also stated he had now received a written statement from Mr. Jack HEWITT who claims he does not believe DOZENKO's statement of MILGAARD's admission. I advised Mr. WILLIAMS I have not yet heard back from Winnipeg GIS and they are following up on this request. WILLIAMS will fax HEWITT's statement to me ASAP. WILLIAMS is also asking if we can obtain a more detailed address for Ron WILSON as the Chief Justice is asking questions of WILSON. WILSON is believed living with one Monique SARTULLY (WILSON) at Box 111, Dysart, Sask., phone 432-2179. A few minutes later Mr. WILLIAMS called back, advising he did not require any further details regarding WILSON as they had made contact with him direct.</p> <p>555. I also discussed with Mr. WILLIAMS the suspicious vehicle that was seen on the morning of Gail MILLER's murder, parked in front of her house with the lights on and someone walking in the area. This was observed by Charles CARRIERE, and I was making inquiries in an attempt to locate him. I asked Mr. WILLIAMS if anyone knew the entrance that MILLER used at her address at 134 Avenue O South, if she used the main Ave. O entrance, it makes little sense that she would be walking down the alley to the bus stop. On the other hand, if she used the back door which would lead into the alley, it would possibly make sense that she would be found in the alley on her way to the bus stop. Mr. WILLIAMS did not think this point was ever brought out during any previous trial evidence.</p>

556. I also directed Mr. WILLIAMS to the **Redacted** statement about the jacket the assailant was wearing. I advised WILLIAMS the collar description of the coat that FISHER wore had similarities to the description provided by Nicol JOHN while she was under hypnosis.

557. I am interested in obtaining CARRIERE's statement to determine if he describes the clothing or the person he saw walking around that morning. Insp. QUINN of City Police advised that CARRIERE's statement is not on their file. I will possibly review the MILGAARD police file again in an attempt to locate this file. I believe this is a significant point. I also advised WILLIAMS that I had talked recently to Leonard and Florence SONNLEITNER, attempting to get details of the vehicle Larry had borrowed and failed to return. The circumstances were somewhat suspicious.

1430 558. Jerry CARRIERE, brother to Chuck, returned my call and advised he has not seen his brother for a long time. He indicates Chuck may be in White Rock, B.C., however this is not sure. Jerry will check with his mother who is now in St. Ann's Home and try and obtain a phone number for Chuck. Jerry will call me back. Jerry recalled the murder and said he had been questioned by the police during the original investigation, indicating that he had been playing poker on Avenue C and got home about 4:00-5:00 am and that he had actually walked down the alley where MILLER's body was later found. Jerry's footprints in the snow led police to his residence. Jerry stated he lost all his money in the poker game and had no money for a cab home, therefore walked down the back alley to his home. He does not ever recall seeing a nurse in this alley. He had nothing more to offer and stated he had provided all details at that time to the police.

1620 559. I called lawyer MILES in Winnipeg, who states his client is credible but somewhat fearful of MILGAARD and reluctant to have his name brought forward if the information he has is of no value to this review. The client felt responsible to bring forward what he overheard, even though he does not know if it has any relevance. MILES states his client is almost 100% sure the person making the statement is Ronald WILSON. This is regard to the comment, "If he ever gets out he'll kill me." This comment was apparently made during the preliminary hearing and MILES's client was walking past a room containing

MILES wishes to have one of the Court lawyers call him if they believe the comments are of value, and his client will cooperate. I indicated that if this is of any value, Mr. WILLIAMS of Federal Justice would be in touch with him.</p> <p>560. Crime Stoppers tip came via CPIC, suggesting "Gasoline Alley" - they have a filling station referred to by MILGAARD where he had the heater fixed. The old BOYD ran the station at that time and can be contacted at 373-6318.</p> <p>561. I called BOYD, who stated he got a call from Alex BARKER last night, claiming to be an investigative journalist (I know BARKER well and he is not credible). Putting two and two together, it seems BARKER provided this Crime Stoppers tip. BOYD states he did not open his Gasoline Alley until 1975. BOYD states he didn't think, "chicken soup dispensing machines" existed in Saskatoon in 1969, as was mentioned by MILGAARD during his recent testimony before the Supreme Court. BOYD states he is not sure if Circle Drive was in place at the time MILGAARD came to town. MILGAARD could have entered the city on 8th Street East, which was the old highway. The first service station on 8th St. East in those days would have been on Clarence and 8th. BOYD indicated there was also a service station by the old iron bridge at the Meewasin Valley, however it served no food. There was also a service station on the four corners on Broadway, there was no food served at this place as well. This service station was operated by a Jules KENWOOD, now of Pike Lake District. There was also a Husky Service Station on Circle and Idylwyld Drive North. There also may have been a Gulf Station near 19th Street underpass, which is Ave. A South and 1st Avenue. The station was sold to a Marvin SINES and the service station no longer exists. This becomes a question of value and Mr. Bill MESSETT of 77 Signs may be able to help, as he knows the history of the service stations during that time in the City of Saskatoon. I thanked Mr. BOYD for his information and interest, left my name and number in the event he felt he had further info to provide.</p>

		<p>offence, or at least believed they were a party to the offence by possibly not doing anything to prevent the attack. The unusual crime scene; i.e., stab wounds through the coat but not through the dress, suggests that the offence took place in two stages. It would seem possible that the coat was taken off of MILLER and that she was viciously attacked by having her dress ripped off her shoulders and then sexually assaulted. After the assault, it seems logical that she was then allowed to redress by placing her coat back on. If this assault took place inside the motor vehicle, she could have possibly escaped and began running from where the car was seen parked by Mr. DIEWOLD, north up the alley between Avenues O and N, and possibly the shadow that Mr. DIEWOLD saw going north across the headlights was someone from inside the vehicle giving chase to catch up with MILLER. She was then caught and stabbed through her coat and left to die where she was found. The seminal stains on her underpants and the semen found in the snow during the initial investigation may actually have been deposited on the clothing during the sexual act inside the car, and may have actually fallen into the snow from her clothing during the struggle at the death scene. To further support this, the fact that Nicol JOHN, from the very beginning, was a hostile witness, suggests that she told only sufficient detail to protect herself from being drawn into a murder investigation. As well, WILSON provided the 15 minute window of opportunity by stating that MILGAARD walked towards the girl they had passed while he, WILSON, went the other way to get help. It is interesting to note that there was no evidence that the MILGAARD vehicle was stuck near the scene of the MILLER murder. It is quite possible that the vehicle never was stuck and that WILSON's exiting from the scene may not have actually happened, and that it was a story only to eliminate him from being associated to MILGAARD's activities. The fact that WILSON, during his Supreme Court testimony, states that he lied during the original trial, leaves one to question why he would have lied at that time. The only rational explanation is the fact that he had to lie to prevent himself from being drawn into his involvement in the MILLER murder. The bottom line is that, if the facts support MILGAARD's involvement in this murder, I strongly suspect that Nicol JOHN and Ronald WILSON may in fact have been a party to this crime.</p> <p>Another theory I have - "The Strange Car Theory" is as follows: A vehicle driven by someone unknown, such as FISHER, may have forced MILLER into the vehicle shortly after she exited her residence. This is supported by the fact that Chuck CARRIERE and Dennis ELLIOTT both report seeing a vehicle parked at 130 Avenue O South, with the headlights on and someone actually walking in the area. ELLIOTT states the individual had his hair combed back, he had dark hair, and had an angry look about him. The possibility exists the person was waiting for MILLER and, when she left her residence, forced her at knife point inside the vehicle and then raped her as described in theory above, and it was this vehicle that was seen in the alley by Mr. DIEWOLD. Again, after the sexual attack, MILLER was given the opportunity to at least get her coat back on and she was either permitted to leave or escaped from the vehicle, and then again was chased down the alley and stabbed to death where her body was located. Mr. ELLIOTT describes the vehicle he saw as being a reddish coloured car with extensive damage to the driver's side rear quarter panel. Inquiries are presently being made to determine if Cliff PAMBRUN's reddish brown 1958 Chev ever had damage to the quarter panel. If it is determined this vehicle was damaged, there would be some indication that possibly FISHER was in the area during that time. 

The extreme cold temperatures would suggest that the sexual activity would, in all probability, have taken place inside a vehicle or residence.
