Linda FISHER'S sincerity or integrity are not in doubt or in issue. However, there are discrepancies in her statements that can not be ignored.

It is a possibility that Linda may be confused as to which day she heard and confronted Larry FISHER. If one considers the time she confronted Larry, which according to statements offered by Linda, occurred between 9:00 AM and 11:00 AM plus the fact that a knife had been found would logically indicate Saturday the 6th FEBRUARY as being the date that coincides with her recollection.

ANALYSIS:

Beating in mind that in Linda FISHER'S statements given to Eugene WILLIAMS, Paul HENDERSON and subsequently to GAGNE/HOMENIUK, Linda states she confronted Larry FISHER with the words "my paring knife is missing you probably are the one out stabbing that girl" or similar words. Also in the first statement to the City Police and the one to Paul HENDERSON she refers to the stabbing murder of the nurse. There is no reference as to occupation in the broadcast.

Although, we do not have the benefit of the CKOR broadcast time of the murder story and we don't know which station Linda was listening to it seems that the story didn't break until sometime after 12:00 Noon the 6th JAN 31.

The aspect of a knife being found or the potential murder weapon did not break until the following day 6th 9/02/01.

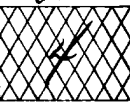

2. It is possible that she also learned of a 'knife' being used at 12:15 PM on the 6/9/02/01.
3. Unable to absolutely confirm this as records from the other radio-station not available.

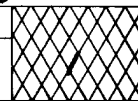
