CHAPTER W-13.11 REG 2

The Wildlife Act, 1997

PART I

Introductory Matters

Title

- 1 These regulations may be cited as *The Open Seasons Game Regulations*.

Interpretation

- 2 In these regulations:

- (a) “**Act**” means *The Wildlife Act, 1997*;
- (b) “**antlered elk**” means an elk having an antler at least 15 centimetres in length as measured on the outside curve of the antler from the skull to the tip;
- (c) “**antlerless elk**” means a female elk or an elk born during the year in which hunting is taking place;
- (d) “**antlerless mule deer**” means a female mule deer or a mule deer born during the year in which hunting is taking place;
- (e) “**antlerless white-tailed deer**” means a female white-tailed deer or a white-tailed deer born during the year in which hunting is taking place;
- (f) “**assigned operating area**” means the area of land identified in an outfitter’s licence issued pursuant to *The Outfitter and Guide Regulations, 1988* where an outfitter is authorized to provide an outfitting service;
- (g) “**big game**” means:
 - (i) pronghorn antelope;
 - (ii) black bear;
 - (iii) bison, other than domestically raised bison; and
 - (iv) any member of the deer family, whether known as caribou, deer, elk, moose or otherwise;
- (g.1) “**buck antelope**” means a male antelope having a horn at least seven and one half centimetres in length as measured on the outside curve of the horn from the skull to the tip;
- (h) “**bull moose**” means a male moose that is at least one year old;
- (i) “**calf moose**” means any moose born during the year in which hunting is taking place;

- (j) **“Canadian resident”** means a person who has his or her principal residence in Canada and who is a Canadian citizen or has resided in Canada for the 12 months preceding the date of his or her application for a licence;
- (k) **“Cypress Hills Provincial Park (West Block)”** means that portion of Cypress Hills Provincial Park adjoining the Alberta-Saskatchewan boundary;
- (l) **“game bird”** means migratory game bird and upland game bird;
- (m) **“migratory game bird”** includes any game bird protected by the *Migratory Birds Convention Act* (Canada) or the regulations made pursuant to that Act;
- (n) **“muzzle-loading firearm”** means a firearm that is loaded through the front opening of the barrel;
- (o) **“non-resident”** means a person who is neither a Saskatchewan resident nor a Canadian resident;
- (p) **“North Game Bird District”** includes Wildlife Management Zone 43, Wildlife Management Zones 47 to 76, including Fort-a-la-Corne and Horsehide Lake Wildlife Management Units, Clearwater River, Clarence-Steepbank Lakes, Athabasca Sand Dunes, Greenwater Lake, Lac La Ronge, Meadow Lake, Narrow Hills and Wildcat Hill Provincial Parks and Bronson Forest and Round Lake Recreation Sites;
- (q) **“protected area”** means a protected area constituted pursuant to *The Parks Act*;
- (r) **“provincial park”** means a provincial park constituted pursuant to *The Parks Act*;
- (s) **“recreation site”** means a recreation site constituted pursuant to *The Parks Act*;
- (t) **“Saskatchewan resident”** means a person who:
- (i) is a Canadian resident, has his or her principal residence in Saskatchewan and has resided in Saskatchewan for the three months preceding the date of his or her application for a licence; or
 - (ii) is a member of the regular force of the Canadian Armed Forces or of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police and is stationed and residing in Saskatchewan;
- (u) **“South Game Bird District”** includes Wildlife Management Zones 1 to 19, 21 to 42, 44 to 46, and Saskatoon and Regina-Moose Jaw Wildlife Management Zones, including Duck Mountain and Moose Mountain Provincial Parks;
- (v) **“special”** means, with respect to a licence, a big game computer draw licence issued in accordance with Part IX of *The Wildlife Regulations, 1981*;

(w) “**upland game bird**” means the birds of all species of the following families:

(i) tetraonidae, commonly known as grouse, including ruffed grouse, spruce grouse, sharp-tailed grouse and ptarmigan;

(ii) phasianidae, commonly known as pheasants and partridges, including ring-necked pheasants and European grey or Hungarian partridges;

(x) “**white geese**” means Ross’ geese and Snow geese, including blue colour phase Snow geese;

(y) “**wildlife management unit**” means a wildlife management unit constituted by *The Wildlife Management Zones and Special Areas Boundaries Regulations, 1990*;

(z) “**wildlife management zone**” means a wildlife management zone constituted by *The Wildlife Management Zones and Special Areas Boundaries Regulations, 1990*.

Validity of licence

4 Subject to sections 28, 43 and 50, a licence authorizes the person to whom the licence was issued to hunt only during the calendar year in which the licence was issued.

Restrictions and conditions re hunting

5 Every person who hunts pursuant to the authority of these regulations shall comply with any restrictions on and conditions relating to hunting contained in the Act, in these regulations and in any other regulations made pursuant to the Act, or specified on the person’s licence.

Regulations subject to restrictions

6 These regulations are subject to any restriction on and conditions relating to hunting contained in the Act, the *Migratory Birds Regulations C.R.C., 1978, c.1035*, these regulations and any other regulations made pursuant to the Act.

Protected areas and recreation sites

7 Where a wildlife management zone is opened for hunting a species of big game, the following protected areas and recreation sites lying within that wildlife management zone are deemed to be open for hunting that species during the open season in accordance with these regulations:

- (a) Anderson Island Protected Area;
- (b) Waskwei River Protected Area.

Means of hunting

8(1) Except in Wildlife Management Zones 6, 7, 33, 37 and 39, a person who is the holder of a Regular Moose Licence, a Special Moose Licence, a Guided Moose Licence, a Regular Elk Licence or a Special Elk Licence who is also the holder of a Saskatchewan Resident White-tailed Deer Licence, a Canadian Resident White-tailed Deer Licence or a Non-resident White-tailed Deer Licence may hunt white-tailed deer at the times and places for which the Regular Moose Licence, Special Moose Licence, Guided Moose Licence, Regular Elk Licence or Special Elk Licence is valid.

(2) A holder of a Saskatchewan Resident Elk Licence who also holds a Saskatchewan Resident Big Game Depredation Licence issued pursuant to section 38.1 of *The Wildlife Regulations, 1981* may hunt antlerless elk during the times and in the places specified on the Saskatchewan Resident Big Game Depredation Licence.

(3) A holder of a Saskatchewan Resident Special Antlerless Mule Deer Licence who also holds a Saskatchewan Resident Special Mule Deer Licence may hunt antlerless mule deer during the time for which the Resident Special Mule Deer Licence is valid.

(4) Subject to subsection (5), in all open areas within the North and South Game Bird Districts, from September 1 to the Sunday closest to October 21, or October 21 if it falls on a Sunday, the open season for all geese includes only that part of the day from one-half hour before sunrise to noon.

(5) In Wildlife Management Zones 21 and 37 to 41, the open season for white geese includes that part of the day from one-half hour before sunrise to one-half hour after sunset.

PART II
White-tailed Deer Open Seasons

White-tailed deer archery open seasons

9(1) No person shall hunt white-tailed deer by any means other than a bow and arrow during the white-tailed deer archery open seasons established pursuant to this section.

(2) A person who is the holder of a First Saskatchewan Resident White-tailed Deer Licence may hunt a total of one white-tailed deer of either sex:

(a) in Wildlife Management Zones 1 to 55, including Brokenshell No. 1, Brokenshell No. 2, Elbow, Fort a la Corne and Horsehide Lake Wildlife Management Units, from:

- (i) August 30 to October 30 in 1999;
- (ii) September 4 to November 4 in 2000;
- (iii) September 3 to November 3 in 2001;
- (iv) September 2 to November 2 in 2002; and
- (v) September 1 to November 1 in 2003;

(b) in Wildlife Management Zones 56 to 69, including Narrow Hills, Wildcat Hill and Clarence-Steepbank Lakes Provincial Parks, from:

- (i) August 23 to October 30 in 1999;
- (ii) August 28 to November 4 in 2000;
- (iii) August 27 to November 3 in 2001;
- (iv) August 26 to November 2 in 2002; and
- (v) August 25 to November 1 in 2003;

(c) in Wildlife Management Zones 70 to 76, including Clearwater River, Athabasca Sand Dunes and Lac La Ronge Provincial Parks, from:

- (i) August 23 to December 4 in 1999;
- (ii) August 28 to December 9 in 2000;
- (iii) August 27 to December 8 in 2001;

- (i) September 8 to October 30 in 1999;

 - (iii) September 5 to November 3 in 2001;
 - (iv) September 4 to November 2 in 2002; and
 - (v) September 3 to November 1 in 2003;
- (f) in Saskatchewan Landing Provincial Park from:
- (i) September 8 to October 30 and November 15 to December 4 in 1999;
 - (ii) September 6 to November 4 and November 20 to December 9 in 2000;
 - (iii) September 5 to November 3 and November 19 to December 8 in 2001;
 - (iv) September 4 to November 2 and November 18 to December 7 in 2002; and

- (g) in Great Bend Wildlife Management Unit from:
- (i) August 30 to October 30 and November 15 to December 4 in 1999;
 - (ii) September 4 to November 4 and November 20 to December 9 in 2000;
 - (iii) September 3 to November 3 and November 19 to December 8 in 2001;
 - (iv) September 2 to November 2 and November 18 to December 7 in 2002; and
 - (v) September 1 to November 1 and November 17 to December 6 in 2003.
- (2.1) A person who is the holder of a Second Saskatchewan Resident White-tailed Deer Licence may hunt a total of one white-tailed deer of either sex:
- (a) in Wildlife Management Zones 56 to 69, including Narrow Hills, Wildcat Hill and Clarence-Steepbank Lakes Provincial Parks, from August 25 to November 1 in 2003; and
 - (b) in Greenwater Lake and Meadow Lake Provincial Parks and Bronson Forest and Round Lake Recreation Sites from September 3 to November 1 in 2003.

(3) A person who is the holder of a First Canadian Resident White-tailed Deer Licence may hunt a total of one white-tailed deer of either sex:

- (a) in Wildlife Management Zones 48 to 50 and 53 to 55 from:
 - (i) August 30 to October 30 in 1999;
 - (ii) September 4 to November 4 in 2000;
 - (iii) September 3 to November 3 in 2001;
 - (iv) September 2 to November 2 in 2002; and
 - (v) September 1 to November 1 in 2003;
- (b) in Wildlife Management Zones 56 to 69, including Narrow Hills, Wildcat Hill and Clarence-Steepbank Lakes Provincial Parks, from:
 - (i) August 23 to October 30 in 1999;
 - (ii) August 28 to November 4 in 2000;
 - (iii) August 27 to November 3 in 2001;
 - (iv) August 26 to November 2 in 2002; and
 - (v) August 25 to November 1 in 2003;
- (c) in Wildlife Management Zones 70 to 76, including Clearwater River, Athabasca Sand Dunes and Lac La Ronge Provincial Parks, from:
 - (i) August 23 to December 4 in 1999;
 - (ii) August 28 to December 9 in 2000;
 - (iii) August 27 to December 8 in 2001;

 - (iv) September 4 to November 2 in 2002; and
 - (v) September 3 to November 1 in 2003; and

- (f) in Saskatchewan Landing Provincial Park and Great Bend Wildlife Management Unit from:
- (i) November 27 to December 2 in 2000;
 - (ii) November 26 to December 1 in 2001;
 - (iii) November 25 to November 30 in 2002; and
 - (iv) November 24 to November 29 in 2003;
- (g) **Repealed.** 1 Sep 2000 SR 68/2000 s3.
- (4) A person who is the holder of a First Non-resident White-tailed Deer Licence may hunt a total of one white-tailed deer of either sex:
- (a) in those portions of Wildlife Management Zones 48 to 50 and 53 to 55 that comprise the assigned operating area of the outfitter with which the licensed hunter is hunting, from:
- (i) August 30 to October 30 in 1999;
 - (ii) September 4 to November 4 in 2000;
 - (iii) September 3 to November 3 in 2001;
 - (iv) September 2 to November 2 in 2002; and
 - (v) September 1 to November 1 in 2003;
- (b) in Wildlife Management Zones 56 to 69, including Narrow Hills, Wildcat Hill and Clarence-Steepbank Lakes Provincial Parks, from:
- (i) August 23 to October 30 in 1999;
 - (ii) August 28 to November 4 in 2000;
 - (iii) August 27 to November 3 in 2001;
 - (iv) August 26 to November 2 in 2002; and
 - (v) August 25 to November 1 in 2003;

White-tailed deer muzzle-loading firearm open seasons

10(1) No person shall hunt white-tailed deer by any means other than a muzzle-loading firearm, crossbow or bow and arrow during the white-tailed deer muzzle-loading firearm open seasons established pursuant to this section.

(2) A person who is the holder of a First Saskatchewan Resident White-tailed Deer Licence may hunt a total of one white-tailed deer of either sex:

(a) in Wildlife Management Zones 1 to 55, including Brokenshell No. 1, Brokenshell No. 2, Elbow, Horsehide Lake and Fort a la Corne Wildlife Management Units, Cypress Hills (West Block), Duck Mountain and Moose Mountain Provincial Parks, and that portion of Douglas Provincial Park lying west of Diefenbaker Lake (Gordon McKenzie Arm), from:

- (i) September 27 to October 30 in 1999;
- (ii) October 2 to November 4 in 2000;
- (iii) October 1 to November 3 in 2001;
- (iv) September 30 to November 2 in 2002; and
- (v) September 29 to November 1 in 2003;

(b) in Wildlife Management Zones 56 to 69, including Narrow Hills, Wildcat Hill, and Clarence-Steepbank Lakes Provincial Parks, from:

- (i) September 6 to October 30 in 1999;
- (ii) September 4 to November 4 in 2000;
- (iii) September 3 to November 3 in 2001;
- (iv) September 2 to November 2 in 2002; and
- (v) September 1 to November 1 in 2003;

- (2.1) A person who is the holder of a Second Saskatchewan Resident White-tailed Deer Licence may hunt a total of one white-tailed deer of either sex:
- (a) in Wildlife Management Zones 56 to 69, including Narrow Hills, Wildcat Hill and Clarence-Steepbank Lakes Provincial Parks, from September 3 to November 1 in 2003; and
 - (b) in Greenwater Lake and Meadow Lake Provincial Parks and Bronson Forest and Round Lake Recreation Sites from September 3 to November 1 in 2003.

(3) A person who is the holder of a First Canadian White-tailed Deer Licence may hunt a total of one white-tailed deer of either sex:

(a) in Wildlife Management Zones 56 to 69, including Narrow Hills, Wildcat Hill and Clarence-Steepbank Lakes Provincial Parks, from:

- (i) September 6 to October 30 in 1999;
- (ii) September 4 to November 4 in 2000;
- (iii) September 3 to November 3 in 2001;
- (iv) September 2 to November 2 in 2002; and
- (v) September 1 to November 1 in 2003;

(b) in Wildlife Management Zones 70 to 76, including Clearwater River, Athabasca Sand Dunes and Lac La Ronge Provincial Parks, from:

- (i) August 23 to December 4 in 1999;
- (ii) August 28 to December 9 in 2000;
- (iii) August 27 to December 8 in 2001;
- (iv) August 26 to December 7 in 2002; and
- (v) August 25 to December 6 in 2003;
