

# *The Feed Grain Adjustment Program Regulations*

*The Government Organization Act*

PART I

**Title and Interpretation**

**Title**

**1** These regulations may be cited as *The Feed Grain Adjustment Program Regulations*.

**Interpretation**

**2** In these regulations:

- (a) **“applicant”** means a person who applies for a grant;
- (b) **“eligible animal”** means:
  - (i) a culled cow;
  - (ii) an elk;
  - (iii) a fallow deer;
  - (iv) a kid goat;
  - (v) a heifer;
  - (vi) a hog;
  - (vii) a horse;
  - (viii) a lamb;
  - (ix) a mule deer;
  - (x) a steer;
  - (xi) a virgin bull;
  - (xii) a white-tailed deer;

fed in Saskatchewan for slaughter for the entire period that it is owned by the applicant;

- (c) **“grant”** means financial assistance by way of a grant made pursuant to section 9;
- (d) **“minister”** means the minister of Agriculture and Food;
- (e) **“person”** includes a partnership and an unincorporated association;

(f) “**program**” means the Feed Grain Adjustment Program established pursuant to section 3;

(g) “**quarter**” means any three consecutive months commencing with the first day of the month of January, April, July or October, as the case may be.

## PART II

### Program Requirements

#### Program established

**3** The Feed Grain Adjustment Program is established.

#### Application

**4** Every applicant shall:

- (a) apply to the minister in the form required by the minister;
- (b) provide the minister with a declaration, in a form satisfactory to the minister, that all animals which are the subject of the application, have been sold for slaughter; and
- (c) provide the minister with any information that the minister considers necessary.

#### Application deadline

**4.1** In order to be eligible for a grant with respect to eligible animals that are the subject of an application, the applicant shall ensure that the application is:

- (a) received by the minister; or
- (b) sent by mail and post-marked;

#### Documentation required

**6(1)** Every applicant shall include with the application made pursuant to section 4 with respect to each eligible animal sold by the applicant:

- (a) a record of sale showing:
  - (i) the applicant’s name and address;
  - (ii) the buyer’s name and address;

- (iii) the type of animal sold;
  - (iv) the weight of the animal sold;
  - (v) the price obtained for the animal;
  - (vi) the date of sale;
  - (vii) with respect to a rail-graded animal, the grade obtained for that animal; or
- (b) where the animal is marketed through:
- (i) the Saskatchewan Pork Producers' Marketing Board;
  - (ii) the Saskatchewan Beef Stabilization Board; or
  - (iii) the Saskatchewan Sheep and Wool Marketing Commission;
- a marketing summary provided to the applicant by that board or commission.
- (2) Where an eligible animal is purchased for feeding, the applicant shall include with the application a receipt issued with respect to that eligible animal showing:
- (a) the purchaser's name and address;
  - (b) the vendor's name and address;
  - (c) the type of animal purchased;
  - (d) the weight of the animal purchased;
  - (e) the price paid for the animal; and
  - (f) the date of purchase.
- (3) Where an applicant slaughters an eligible animal for use by the applicant and the applicant's immediate family, the applicant shall submit with the application a record showing:
- (a) the type of animal slaughtered; and
  - (b) the animal's weight before slaughter or the animal's dressed weight.
- (4) Where an application is with respect to:
- (a) a home-grown culled cow;
  - (b) a home-grown culled breeding:
    - (i) elk;
    - (ii) fallow deer;
    - (iii) mule deer; or
    - (iv) white-tailed deer; or
  - (c) a culled mare or gelding;

the applicant shall submit with the application a declaration stating the dates on which the feeding of the animal began and ended.

(5) Where an application is with respect to a culled cow, the applicant shall provide proof of slaughter of the animal with the application.

**Minimum marketing required**

7(1) Subject to subsection (1.1) or (1.2), in order to be eligible for a grant, an applicant shall market during any year not less than:

- (a) 4 culled cows;
- (b) 4 elk;
- (c) 5 fallow deer;
- (d) 25 kid goats;
- (e) 4 heifers;
- (f) 25 hogs;
- (g) 4 horses;
- (h) 25 lambs;
- (i) 5 mule deer;
- (j) 4 steers;
- (k) 4 virgin bulls; or
- (l) 5 white-tailed deer.

(1.1) Where an applicant makes an application with respect to eligible animals that includes eligible animals marketed during the quarter of 1989 commencing with the first day of October 1989, in order to be eligible for a grant the applicant shall market the required number of animals prescribed in subsection (1) before December 31, 1990.

(1.2) Where an applicant makes an application with respect to eligible animals that includes eligible animals marketed in 1992, in order to be eligible for a grant the applicant shall market the required number of animals prescribed in subsection (1) after December 31, 1991 and on or before October 31, 1992.

(2) Where an application is made with respect to more than one category of eligible animal:

- (a) each category is deemed to be the equivalent of every other category; and
- (b) the sum of any combination of animals which meets the minimum requirement prescribed in subsection (1) is deemed to meet the requirements prescribed in that subsection.

**Livestock requirements**

**8** An applicant may make an application only with respect to eligible animals that:

- (a) are owned by the applicant;
- (b) are marketed on or after October 1, 1989 and on or before October 31, 1992 for slaughter;
- (c) in the case of animals slaughtered for use by the applicant or the applicant's immediate family, are slaughtered on or after October 1, 1989 and on or before October 31, 1992; and
- (d) meet the requirements prescribed in Part III with respect to that type of eligible animal.

**Grant**

**9** The minister may provide financial assistance by way of a grant, calculated in accordance with the Appendix to these regulations, to an applicant who has complied with these regulations.

**PART III****Livestock Requirements****Heifers, steers and virgin bulls**

**10(1)** Every heifer, steer and virgin bull is to be owned by the applicant for a period of not less than 60 days:

- (a) in the case of a home-grown animal, following weaning; and
  - (b) in the case of a purchased animal, following the day on which it is purchased.
- (2) Where a heifer, steer or virgin bull is marketed through a slaughter house that grades animals, that animal is to obtain a grade not lower than C.
- (3) Where no proof of slaughter is provided:
- (a) a heifer is to weigh a minimum of 408.23 kilograms;
  - (b) a steer is to weigh a minimum of 476.27 kilograms; and
  - (c) a virgin bull is to weigh a minimum of 476.27 kilograms and a maximum of 635.03 kilograms;

when sold.

(4) Where proof of slaughter is provided for a virgin bull, the maximum weight for the bull is to be 635.03 kilograms when sold.

**Culled cows**

11(1) Every culled cow is to be:

- (a) owned by the applicant for a period of not less than 30 days; and
- (b) fed for a period of not less than 30 days:
  - (i) in the case of a home-grown animal, following culling; and
  - (ii) in the case of a purchased animal, following the day on which it is purchased.

(2) Where a culled cow is marketed through a slaughter house that grades animals, that animal is to obtain a grade of D1 or D2.

**Hogs**

12(1) Every hog is to be owned by the applicant for a period of not less than 60 days:

- (a) in the case of a home-grown animal, following weaning; and
- (b) in the case of a purchased animal, following the day on which it is purchased.

(2) Where a hog is marketed through a slaughter house that grades animals, that animal is to obtain an index not lower than 80.

(3) Where a hog is slaughtered, that animal is to have a dressed weight of not less than 60 kilograms.

(4) Where a hog is sold live, that animal is to have a weight of not less than 77 kilograms.

**Lambs**

13(1) Every lamb is to be owned by the applicant for a period of not less than 45 days:

- (a) in the case of a home-grown animal, following weaning; and
- (b) in the case of a purchased animal, following the day on which it is purchased.

(2) Where a lamb is marketed through a slaughter house that grades animals, that animal is to obtain a grade not lower than B.

(3) Where a lamb is sold live, that animal is to have a weight of not less than 43.09 kilograms.

**Goats**

14(1) Every kid goat is to be owned by the applicant for a period of not less than 45 days:

- (a) in the case of a home-grown animal, following weaning; and

(b) in the case of a purchased animal, following the day on which it is purchased.

(2) Where a kid goat is sold live, that animal is to have a weight of not less than 18.14 kilograms.

#### **Horses**

**15** Every horse is to be owned by the applicant for a period of not less than 60 days:

(a) in the case of a home-grown animal, following weaning; and

(b) in the case of a purchased animal, following the day on which it is purchased.

#### **Elk**

**16** Every elk is to be owned by the applicant for a period of not less than 60 days:

(a) in the case of a home-grown animal, following weaning; and

(b) in the case of a purchased animal, following the day on which it is purchased.

#### **Deer**

**17** Every fallow deer, mule deer and white-tailed deer is to be owned by the applicant for a period of not less than 60 days:

(a) in the case of a home-grown animal, following weaning; and

(b) in the case of a purchased animal, following the day on which it is purchased.

## **PART IV**

### **General**

#### **Recovery of overpayment**

**18** Where an applicant has received an overpayment pursuant to the program for any reason, the amount of the overpayment is a debt due to Her Majesty in right of Saskatchewan and may be recovered:

(a) in any manner authorized by law; or

(b) by deducting the amount of the overpayment from any amounts payable to the applicant pursuant to this program or any other program administered by the minister.

## Appendix

### PART I

#### Interpretation

##### Interpretation

**1** In this Appendix:

- (a) “A” means the kilograms of feed grain deemed to have been consumed per kilogram of body weight gained;
- (b) “B” means the actual or deemed kilograms of body weight gained;
- (c) “G” means the amount in dollars of a grant payable to an applicant.

### PART II

#### Calculation of Grant

##### Amount of grant

**2** The amount of a grant payable to an applicant with respect to an eligible animal is the amount in dollars calculated in accordance with the following formula:

##### Heifers, steers and virgin bulls

**3** For the purpose of calculating the grant pursuant to section 2 with respect to heifers, steers and virgin bulls:

- (a) the beginning weight:
  - (i) for a home-grown heifer is deemed to be 226.80 kilograms;
  - (ii) for a home-grown steer or virgin bull is deemed to be 249.48 kilograms; and
  - (iii) for a purchased heifer, steer or virgin bull is the weight shown on the purchase receipt for that animal;
- (b) the final weight for a heifer, steer or virgin bull:
  - (i) in the case of a live sale, is the weight shown on the sales receipt for that animal; and
  - (ii) in the case of a slaughtered animal, is the dressed weight as shown on the slaughter receipt times 1.77; and
- (c) the amount of grain deemed to have been fed to a heifer, steer or virgin bull per kilogram of body weight gained:
  - (i) for weight gained up to a body weight of 328.85 kilograms, is 5 kilograms;

(ii) for weight gained between body weights of 328.85 kilograms and 419.57 kilograms, is 6 kilograms; and

(iii) for weight gained over a body weight of 419.57 kilograms, is 7 kilograms.

**Culled cows**

**4** For the purpose of calculating the grant pursuant to section 2 with respect to culled cows:

- (a) in the case of animals that are purchased:
  - (i) the beginning weight is the weight shown on the purchase receipt for that animal; and
  - (ii) the final weight:
    - (A) in the case of a live sale, is the weight shown on the sales receipt for that animal; and
    - (B) in the case of a slaughtered animal, is the dressed weight as shown on the slaughter receipt times 2.0;
- (b) in the case of a home-grown culled cow, the amount of body weight gained is deemed to be a gain of 0.91 kilograms for each day the animal is fed to a maximum of 57.15 kilograms; and
- (c) the amount of grain deemed to have been fed to a culled cow per kilogram of body weight gained is 7 kilograms.

**Hogs**

**5** For the purpose of calculating the grant pursuant to section 2 with respect to hogs:

- (a) the beginning weight:
  - (i) for a home-grown hog is deemed to be 7.26 kilograms; and
  - (ii) for a purchased hog is deemed to be 18.14 kilograms;
- (b) the final weight for a hog:
  - (i) in the case of a live sale is the weight shown on the sales receipt for that animal; and
  - (ii) in the case of a slaughtered animal, is the dressed weight as shown on the slaughter receipt times 1.28; and
- (c) the amount of grain deemed to have been fed to a hog per kilogram of body weight gained is 3.5 kilograms.

**Lambs**

**6** For the purpose of calculating the grant pursuant to section 2 with respect to lambs:

- (a) the beginning weight:
  - (i) for a home-grown lamb is deemed to be 20.41 kilograms; and
  - (ii) for a purchased lamb is the weight shown on the purchase receipt for that animal;

- (b) the final weight for a lamb:
  - (i) in the case of a live sale, is the weight shown on the sales receipt for that animal; and
  - (ii) in the case of a slaughtered animal is the dressed weight as shown on the slaughter receipt times 2.0; and
- (c) the amount of grain deemed to have been fed to a lamb per kilogram of body weight gained is 4 kilograms.

**Goats**

7 For the purpose of calculating the grant pursuant to section 2 with respect to kid goats:

- (a) the beginning weight:
  - (i) for a home-grown kid goat is deemed to be 9.07 kilograms; and
  - (ii) for a purchased kid goat is the weight shown on the purchase receipt for that animal;
- (b) the final weight for a kid goat:
  - (i) in the case of a live sale, is the weight shown on the sales receipt for that animal; and
  - (ii) in the case of slaughtered animal, is the dressed weight as shown on the slaughter receipt times 2.0; and
- (c) the amount of grain deemed to have been fed to a kid goat per kilogram of body weight gained is 4 kilograms.

**Horses**

8(1) Subject to subsection (2), for the purpose of calculating the grant pursuant to section 2 with respect to horses:

- (a) the beginning weight:
    - (i) for a home-grown foal is deemed to be 181.44 kilograms;
    - (ii) for a purchased horse is the weight shown on the purchase receipt for that animal;
  - (b) the final weight for a horse:
    - (i) in the case of a live sale, is the weight shown on the sales receipt for that animal;
    - (ii) in the case of a slaughtered animal, is the dressed weight as shown on the slaughter receipt times 1.72; and
    - (iii) in the case of a foal, is not to exceed 453.59 kilograms; and
  - (c) the amount of grain deemed to have been fed to a horse per kilogram of body weight gained is 8 kilograms.
- (2) In the case of home-grown culled mares and geldings, the amount of body weight gained is deemed to be a gain of 0.91 kilograms for each day the animal is fed to a maximum of 90.72 kilograms.

(3) In the case of purchased mares and geldings, the maximum allowable weight gain is 90.72 kilograms.

**Fallow, mule and white-tailed deer**

**9** For the purpose of calculating the grant pursuant to section 2 with respect to fallow deer, mule deer and white-tailed deer:

- (a) in the case of purchased animals:
  - (i) the beginning weight is the weight shown on the purchase receipt for that animal; and
  - (ii) the final weight is the weight shown on the sales receipt for that animal;
- (b) in the case of home-grown culled breeding stock fed for slaughter, the amount of body weight gained is deemed to be 0.45 kilograms per day per animal to a maximum of 45.36 kilograms per animal; and
- (c) the amount of grain deemed to have been fed to an animal per kilogram of body weight gained is 4.5 kilograms.

**Elk**

**10** For the purpose of calculating the grant pursuant to section 2 with respect to elk:

- (a) in the case of purchased animals:
  - (i) the beginning weight is the weight shown on the purchase receipt for that animal; and
  - (ii) the final weight is the weight shown on the sales receipt for that animal;
- (b) in the case of home-grown culled breeding stock fed for slaughter, the amount of body weight gained is deemed to be 0.91 kilograms per day per animal to a maximum of 90.72 kilograms per animal; and
- (c) the amount of grain deemed to have been fed to an elk per kilogram of body weight gained is 5 kilograms.
