CHAPTER P-8 REG 1

The Pest Control Products (Saskatchewan) Act

Title

1 These regulations may be cited as *The Pesticide Prohibition Regulations, 1985*.

Designation of pesticides

2(1) The herbicides 2, 4, 5-trichlorophenoxyacetic acid (2, 4, 5-T), 2, 4, 5-trichlorophenoxypropionic acid (fenoprop) and other chemicals formed from the 2, 4, 5-trichlorophenoxy base molecule are designated as pesticides.

(2) The chemical 2, 4-dichlorophenyl p-nitrophenyl ether, which is commonly known as niclofen or nitrofen and which may be marketed under the trade name TOK, is designated as a pesticide.

Prohibitions

3(1) No person shall use any preparation or formulation containing any herbicide described in subsection 2(1) or apply any of it to water, land or vegetation growing on the land.

(2) Any person owning any preparation or formulation containing any herbicide described in subsection 2(1) shall dispose of it only in accordance with written instructions from the Department of the Environment.

(3) No person shall use in any way or sell the chemical, or a preparation or formulation containing the chemical, described in subsection 2(2).
