## CHAPTER E-7.2 REG 2

# The Electrical Licensing Act

### Title

1 These regulations may be cited as *The Electrical Licensing Fees Regulations*.

### Interpretation

2 In these regulations, "Act" means The Electrical Licensing Act.

### Fees

- **3**(1) An applicant for a licence shall pay the fee set out in Table 1 of the Appendix.
- (2) The holder of a licence that is lost or destroyed may obtain a duplicate copy on payment of a fee of \$25.

### Selection of term

- **3.1** An applicant for any of the following licences shall specify in the application whether a licence with a term of one year or five years is requested:
  - (a) a restricted journeyman's licence;
  - (b) a journeyman's licence;
  - (c) a restricted contractor's licence;
  - (d) a contractor's licence;
  - (e) an employer's licence; or
  - (f) a supply house licence.

### **Expiry dates**

- 4(1) The expiry date of a licence mentioned in section 3.1 is one year or five years, as requested by the applicant, from the date of issuance.
- (2) Repealed. 31 Jly 92 SR 64/92 s4.
- (3) The expiry date of a temporary journeyman's licence is any date not exceeding one year from the date of issuance that the director may determine.
- (4) The expiry date of a limited contractor's licence is one year from the date of issuance.
- (5) The expiry date of a licence is to be shown on the licence.

## E-7.2 REG 2

### ELECTRICAL LICENSING FEES

### Reinstatement fee

- **5** A contractor shall pay a reinstatement fee of \$50 where:
  - (a) his licence is suspended; and
  - (b) he wishes to have his licence reinstated.

### No refund

6 No refund is payable for fees paid pursuant to section 3 or 5.

- 7(1) Subject to subsection (2), these regulations come into force on the day on which *The Electrical Licensing Act* comes into force.
- (2) If these regulations are filed with the Registrar of Regulations after *The Electrical Licensing Act* comes into force, these regulations come into force on the day on which they are filed with the Registrar of Regulations.
