CHAPTER G-5.1 REG 65
The Government Organization Act

Title

1 These regulations may be cited as *The Extraordinary Assistance (HIV-infected Persons) Regulations*.

Agreement to provide financial assistance

2 The Minister of Health is authorized to enter into and execute agreements for the provision of financial assistance to HIV-infected persons, their spouses and dependants that are substantially in the form set out in Part I or Part II of the Appendix to these regulations.
