ORDER IN COUNCIL 1206/46
under *The Health Services Act, 1946*

Approved and Ordered. Administrator.

The Executive Council has had under consideration a report from the Acting Minister of Public Health, dated July 11, 1946, stating that veterans of the last war are entitled to receive free medical treatment, including hospitalization, at the expense of the Government for a period of one year from the date of discharge at the expense of the Government of Canada.

The Minister further states that it is deemed expedient to exempt from the personal tax in any municipal or regional scheme formulated under the provisions of The Health Services Act, 1946, or The Municipal Medical and Hospital Services Act, being Chapter 161 of the Revised Statutes of Saskatchewan, 1940, as amended, any person who is entitled to receive health services at the expense of the Government of Canada as a veteran, such exemption to continue for a period of one year from date of discharge of such veteran from the Armed Forces.

Upon consideration of the foregoing report and on the recommendation of the Acting Minister of Public Health, the Executive Council advises, under the provisions of Section 45 of The Health Services Act, 1946, that the approval of His Honour the Lieutenant Governor in Council do issue authorizing the Department of Public Health or any local governing authority or any regional board duly established in accordance with the provisions of The Health Services Act, 1946, to exempt from payment of the personal tax veterans of the last war who are entitled to free treatment, including hospitalization, at the expense of the Government as heretofore indicated.
