CHAPTER D-5.1 REG 1
The Dental Profession Act, 1978

Title

1 These regulations may be cited as *The Dental Profession Appeal Tribunal Payment Regulations*.

Interpretation

2 In these regulations:

(a) “**appeal tribunal**” means an appeal tribunal established pursuant to subsection 41(1) of *The Dental Profession Act, 1978*;

(b) “**member**” means a member of an appeal tribunal.

Remuneration generally

3 Each member is to be paid an amount equal to the expenses that he necessarily incurs in travelling to, attending and returning from a meeting of the appeal tribunal and in otherwise attending to the affairs of the appeal tribunal.

Remuneration re certain members

4 In the case of a member appointed by the president of the University of Saskatchewan when that member would otherwise be engaged in the practice of dentistry, he is, in addition to the amount specified in section 3, to be paid the sum of \$150 for each full day and \$75 for each half day necessarily spent by him in travelling to, attending and returning from a meeting of the appeal tribunal and in otherwise attending to the affairs of the appeal tribunal.

Interpretation

5 For the purpose of section 4:

(a) a full day is deemed to mean more than four consecutive hours; and

(b) a half day is deemed to mean four consecutive hours or less.
