CHAPTER 106

An Act to incorporate The Mohyla Institute (1958)

(Assented to March 18, 1958)

Preamble

WHEREAS Alexander Danylchuk, Physician, of Canora, Reverend William Matthew Seneshen, Principal, of Saskatoon, Walter Mysak, Agricultural Representative, of Canora, Michael Fred Kushnir, Hospital Manager, of Canora, William Taciuk, Municipal Secretary, of Hvas, Michael Trofanenko, Farmer, of Yorkton, and John Kreptul, Municipal Inspector, of Regina, all in the Province of Saskatchewan, have presented a petition praying that they and such others as may hereafter from time to time be associated with or substituted for them may be constituted a body corporate under the name of The Mohyla Institute (1958); and

Whereas it is expedient to grant the said prayer:

Therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

Incorporation

1 Alexander Danylchuk, Physician, of Canora, Reverend William Matthew Seneshen, Principal, of Saskatoon, Walter Mysak, Agricultural Representative, of Canora, Michael Fred Kushnir, Hospital Manager, of Canora, William Taciuk, Municipal Secretary, of Hvas, Michael Trofanenko, Farmer, of Yorkton, and John Kreptul, Municipal Inspector, of Regina, all in the Province of Saskatchewan, and such others as may hereafter from time to time be associated with or substituted for them shall be and are hereby constituted a body corporate and politic under the name of The Mohyla Institute (1958) for the purpose of constructing, establishing, maintaining and conducting in the City of Saskatoon, in the Province of Saskatchewan, residential and educational facilities for students of Ukrainian descent and to give moral and religious guidance and instruction in the matters of faith, dogma, ritual and teachings of the Ukrainian Greek Orthodox Church of Canada to such students and to formulate a course of studies in Ukrainian literature, history and arts and to foster and promote the finest cultural elements and traditions of the Ukrainian people including language, folk music, folk dancing, handicraft and domestic arts and crafts and generally to serve as a centre for all cultural activities for Canadians of Ukrainian descent in the Province of Saskatchewan.

Powers

2 In addition to the powers, rights and privileges conferred upon or vested in corporations by the laws of Saskatchewan, the corporation shall have full power and authority:

Acquisition of property

(a) to acquire by gift, devise, purchase, exchange, lease or otherwise, real and personal property of any and every nature and kind whatsoever and to possess, hold and enjoy the same as owner; provided that the corporation shall not acquire or hold as purchaser any land except for the actual use and occupation of the corporation for the purposes of the corporation exceeding in the whole at any one time the annual value of \$5,000 and that lands, tenements or hereditaments acquired by gift, devise or bequest and not required for the actual use and occupation of the corporation, the annual value of which together with the other land of the corporation exceeds \$5,000, shall not be held by the corporation for a longer period than seven years and within such period the same shall be absolutely disposed of by the corporation and in the case of failure to dispose of the same within such seven years such land shall be forfeited to the Crown in the right of the province;

Disposal of property

(b) to sell, mortgage, lease, exchange or otherwise deal with or dispose of its real and personal property or any portion of either and with the proceeds thereof to acquire other real and personal property to such extent as may be deemed advisable or desirable, and to make and execute all necessary or proper conveyances, transfers or other instruments for carrying the same into effect;

Investments

(c) to invest all or any sums of money belonging to the corporation in any property or security whatsoever for the use and purposes of the corporation;

Acquisition of property pledged to the corporation

(d) to acquire, take possession of and hold as the corporation may deem proper all such property, real, personal or mixed, as may at any time be mortgaged, hypothecated or pledged to the corporation by way of security or conveyed to it in satisfaction of obligations or debts due or owing to it from any person, firm or corporation; provided that any real estate acquired in satisfaction of any debts due to itself and not required for the actual use and occupation of the corporation or for the purposes of the corporation, the annual value of which together with other lands of the corporation exceeds \$5,000 shall be sold by the corporation within seven years after such acquisition or within such further period to which the term shall be extended by order of the Lieutenant Governor in Council, otherwise such real estate shall be forfeited to the Crown in the right of the province;

Borrowing

(e) to borrow from any person, firm or corporation such sum or sums of money as may be found or deemed to be necessary for the purposes of the corporation, and to secure any loans to the lender or lenders by bills of exchange, promissory notes, mortgages, or any other instrument or instruments that may be required or deemed necessary or desirable by the lender or lenders;

Acquisition and erection of buildings

(f) to acquire by purchase or otherwise, build and erect, and to manage and conduct all such halls, houses and other buildings as may be found or deemed necessary or convenient for carrying on the residential and educational work of the corporation, including the organization, conduct and management of houses and halls of residence for students;

Fees

(g) to fix, charge and collect fees for any services rendered by the corporation, including fees for the instruction and for the board and lodging of students;

Affiliation

(h) to make and enter into treaties, contracts and arrangements for affiliating with the corporation and its work any other corporation having similar objects;

Corporate seal

(i) to adopt a corporate seal and to change it at will;

General powers

(j) to do all such other matters and things as it may deem necessary or conducive to the attainment of its objects.

Board of directors

3 The persons named in section 1 shall be the first directors of the corporation and shall hold office until directors are elected in accordance with and in the number provided for by the bylaws of the corporation.

Bylaws, rules, etc.

4 It shall be lawful for the corporation to make bylaws, rules, orders and regulations for the government and proper administration of the property, affairs and interest of the corporation and to repeal and amend the same from time to time, including the determination, election or appointment of officers, the enforcement of discipline and the admission and retirement of members, the appointment, deposition or removal of any person as member of the corporation or bearing office therein and generally for the internal government of the affairs of the corporation.

Use of revenues

5 The revenues, issues and profits of all property held by the corporation shall be applied to the maintenance of the institutions carried on by it, to the construction and repair of buildings and the acquisition of property requisite for its purposes and for the promotion of its objects and purposes in general and no dividends shall accrue or be paid to its members.

Head office

6 The head office of the corporation shall be at Saskatoon, in the Province of Saskatchewan or at such other place as may from time to time be determined by bylaw.

Liability of members for debts

7 No member or officer of the corporation shall be personally liable for the debts thereof.

Winding up

8 Upon the winding up of the affairs of the corporation the net assets of the corporation in the hands of the trustee or liquidator after payment of the costs of winding up and the debts of the corporation shall be paid or delivered to the such charitable or other similar corporations and educational institutions which may be prescribed by the by-laws of the organization to be used for purposes similar to those of the corporation.

Returns

9 The corporation shall at all times, when called upon to do so by the Lieutenant Governor in Council, render an account of its property and affairs.
