## Chapter 02

An Act respecting St. Paul's Hospital (Grey Nuns) of Saskatoon, being  
an Act to amend and consolidate *An Act to incorporate St. Paul's  
Hospital (Grey Nuns) of Saskatoon*

(Assented to May 28, 1996)

**WHEREAS** a Petition has been presented praying for the amendment and consolidation of *An Act to incorporate St. Paul's Hospital (Grey Nuns) of Saskatoon*, being chapter 115 of the *Statutes of Saskatchewan, 1959*, in the manner hereinafter set forth;

**AND WHEREAS** it is expedient to grant the prayer of the said Petition:

**THEREFORE HER MAJESTY**, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

### Short title

**1** This Act may be cited as *The St. Paul's Hospital (Grey Nuns) of Saskatoon, Amendment Act, 1996*.

### Interpretation

**2** In this Act:

(a) **“corporation”** means St. Paul's Hospital (Grey Nuns) of Saskatoon, continued under section 3;

(b) **“directors”** means the directors of the corporation.

### Continuation

**3** St. Paul's Hospital (Grey Nuns) of Saskatoon, is continued as a body corporate.

### Members

**4** The persons who are members of the corporation as of the date of this Act coming into force and such other persons as may thereafter become members of the corporation in accordance with this Act constitute the corporation.

### Objects

**5** The objects of the corporation are to promote health and wellness, and care for the aged, the ill, the infirm and other persons in need through charitable and benevolent activities, including the operation of hospitals, orphanages, nursing homes, schools of nursing, and other institutions.

**Head Office**

**6** The corporation shall maintain its head office in Saskatoon or at any other place in the Province that may be determined by the bylaws of the corporation.

**Powers**

**7(1)** Subject to the other provisions of this Act, the corporation has the capacity, rights, powers and privileges of a natural person.

**(2)** The corporation may:

- (a) acquire, hold, and dispose of any real and personal property or any portion thereof;
- (b) invest all or a portion of its funds in any property or security;
- (c) borrow or raise money and secure its repayment by issuing bonds, debentures, bills of exchange, promissory notes, mortgages or any other instrument that the directors may consider necessary;
- (d) acquire, erect, construct, equip and maintain any buildings that the directors may consider necessary;
- (e) fix fees for any services rendered by the corporation and for the board and lodging of students and patients;
- (f) enter into a contract or any other arrangement to affiliate the corporation with any other corporation which has similar objects;
- (g) to adopt a corporate seal and to change it at will;
- (h) operate any industry that, in the opinion of the directors, will help to maintain its institutions.

**Revenues**

**8** The corporation shall apply any rents, revenues, and profits from its property or from any of its industries:

- (a) to maintain its institutions;
- (b) to construct and repair its buildings;
- (c) to acquire any property that, in the opinion of the directors, is required to advance its objects; or
- (d) for any other purpose that the directors consider expedient.

**Bylaws**

**9** The corporation may make, amend and repeal bylaws:

- (a) for the government and proper administration of its property, affairs and interests, including the appointment of officers, directors and/or a Board of Management, to transact the business of the corporation;

- (b) for the enforcement of discipline, and the admission, retirement, appointment and removal of its members, directors and officers;
- (c) for the distribution of its assets upon any winding up; and
- (d) for the internal government of its affairs.

**Seal**

**10** The corporation shall execute all instruments relating to real property under its seal and all such instruments must be attested in accordance with any procedure that the bylaws of the corporation may provide.

**Attorneys**

**11** The corporation may appoint one or more persons as attorneys to transact the business of the corporation.

**Transfer**

**12** Where any interest in real property is transferred from The Sisters of Charity of the North-West Territories, being a corporation incorporated by the Parliament of Canada, 45 Victoria (1882) Chapter 127, to the corporation, the registrar of the land registration district in which the real property lies shall, without fee or charge, cancel, correct, substitute or issue any certificate of title, make any memorandum or entry on a certificate of title or do any other act necessary to vest the interest in real property in the name of the corporation.

**Accounting**

**13** When directed to do so by the Lieutenant Governor in Council, the corporation shall provide an account in writing of its property and affairs.
