CHAPTER 54

An Act to incorporate the Village of Wadena as a Town Municipality.

(Assented to March 15, 1912)

Preamble

WHEREAS application has been made by petition of the council of the village of Wadena in the Province of Saskatchewan to incorporate the village of Wadena a town municipality under the name of the town of Wadena with such area as hereinafter set forth;

And whereas it is expedient that the said village should be erected into and incorporated a town municipality:

Therefore His Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of Saskatchewan enacts as follows:

Incorporation

1 From and after the coming into force of this Act the east half of the north-east quarter of section twenty-nine in township thirty-four in range thirteen west of the second meridian, the east half of the south-east quarter of section twenty-nine in township thirty-four in range thirteen west of the second meridian, the north-west quarter of section twenty-eight in township thirty-four in range thirteen west of the second meridian and the west half of the south-west quarter of section twenty-eight in township thirty-four in range thirteen west of the second meridian all in the Province of Saskatchewan are hereby constituted and incorporated as a body corporate and politic under the name of the town of Wadena.

Powers of the town

2 Upon and after the coming into force of this Act said town as such body corporate and politic shall have and possess the same authorities, rights and powers as if it had been erected from a village into a town under the provisions of *The Village Act* and sections 261 to 267 inclusive of *The Village Act* shall apply to the said town.

Lieutenant Governor in Council has power to make provisions

3 The Lieutenant Governor in Council shall have power to make all provisions not inconsistent with this Act which may be required for the better carrying out of the provisions of this Act.

Coming into force of Act

4 The Lieutenant Governor in Council shall by proclamation published in *The Saskatchewan Gazette* declare the day on, from and after which this Act shall become and be in force and the Act shall on and after such day so declared become and be in force.
