## CHAPTER 100

### An Act to provide for Tax Exemption of Certain Property of Sisters of Charity, Providence Hospital, Moose Jaw

(Assented to April 1, 1939)

#### Preamble

WHEREAS a petition has been presented praying for an Act of the Legislative Assembly of Saskatchewan to provide for permanent exemption of the property hereinafter mentioned from all taxes, rates, levies and assessment of every nature and kind, save and except special assessment taxes under Part XII of *The City Act*; and

Whereas the City of Moose Jaw has, by resolution, consented to such exemption; and

Whereas it is expedient to grant the prayer of the said petition:

Therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

#### Exemption from taxation

1 The whole of Block "A", in the City of Moose Jaw in the Province of Saskatchewan, Plan No. R.4723, excepting 51/100's of an acre more or less taken for a roadway as shown on Plan No. C.S. 2944, property of Sisters of Charity, Providence Hospital, Moose Jaw, of Moose Jaw, in the Province of Saskatchewan, and all real and personal property of the said institution now or hereafter acquired, shall, while used for a Home for the lame and aged or other like charitable purpose, be exempt from all taxes, rates, levies and assessment of every nature and kind, save and except special assessment taxes under Part XII of *The City Act*.
