## CHAPTER P-31 REG 19

### *The Forest Resources Management Act*

#### **Title**

1 These regulations may be cited as *The Seabee Surface Lease Agreement Regulations, 2007*.

#### **Agreement re surface lease**

2 The Minister of Environment and the Minister of Northern Affairs are authorized to enter into and execute an agreement granting surface rights to Claude Resources Inc. that is substantially in accordance with the provisions set out in the form of the agreement contained in the Appendix.
