## CHAPTER 6

### An Act respecting the Executive Council

#### SHORT TITLE

##### Short title

1 This Act may be cited as “*The Executive Council Act*.”

##### Who shall compose Executive Council

2 There shall be an Executive Council for the Province of Saskatchewan which shall be composed of such persons and under such designations as the Lieutenant Governor shall from time to time think fit.

##### Lieutenant Governor may appoint members of Executive Council to hold office, etc.

3 The Lieutenant Governor may appoint under the Great Seal of the Province of Saskatchewan from among such persons as may be appointed members of the Executive Council the following officers to hold office during pleasure, that is to say: president of the council, attorney general, provincial treasurer, provincial secretary, minister of education, minister of public works, minister of agriculture, minister of railways, telegraphs and telephones and minister of municipal affairs; and may by Order in Council from time to time prescribe the duties of the said officers and of the several departments over which they shall preside or to which they shall belong and of the officers and clerks thereof.

##### Powers and duties of members of Executive Council may be transferred

4 Any of the powers and duties which have been heretofore or may be hereafter assigned by law to the officers now constituting or who may hereafter constitute the Executive Council may from time to time by Order in Council be assigned and transferred either for a limited period or otherwise to any other of the said officers by name or otherwise.

#### GREAT SEAL

##### Great Seal of the Province

5 The Lieutenant Governor in Council is hereby empowered to adopt and provide a Great Seal of the province and may from time to time change such seal.
