Re: THE PROVINCIAL PUBLIC SAFETY TELECOMMUNICATIONS NETWORK

The Honourable Jim Reiter, Minister of Government Relations, is pleased to inform you the Provincial Public Safety Telecommunications Network (PPSTN) is available to meet public safety radio communication needs in our Province. This system replaced Fleetnet and will, through our partnership with SaskPower and the RCMP, provide a secure, reliable and affordable link between public safety providers in Saskatchewan.

In order to begin the process of establishing a client profile, the following **Provincial Public Safety Telecommunications Network Application** must be completed and signed as per the following:

- **Application Form:** attached document.
- Local Authority: All lines must be completed by the authority responsible for signing the Agreement; as well as confirm that invoices will be processed and paid; and ensure that Terms and Conditions are being followed by your organization.
- **Signature Required:** Authority signature and title must be clear; **signature must be in blue ink.**
- Copy of Agreement: Will be kept by the Local Authority (ensure that you retain a copy before returning the original to PPSTN). Once the application has been approved by PPSTN, a final copy will be forwarded to the Local Authority.
- **User Contact Information:** Contact information must be completed, include members of your organization that are "hands-on" users or responsible for the equipment.
- **Invoice Information:** Completion of details pertaining to client account mailing information.
- **Shipping Label:** Completion of shipping information (address for equipment delivery).

You will need to clearly indicate the appropriate response groups under your jurisdiction. Authorities responsible for individual agencies will be required to formally apply to participate on the new radio system. An application form is attached and must be returned to the address below.

Following receipt and approval of your signed application, you will be contacted to review your radio equipment and talk group requirements.
