


Map showing sample RM Divisions

Rural Municipalities do not include:

- any National, Provincial or Regional Parks
- any First Nations Reserves
- any urban municipalities

Traditionally divisions are numbered starting in the south east corner of the municipality increasing numerically to the west, then starting again in the east increasing to the west.

Rural Municipality Divisions



Municipal boundaries and divisions are legally described in a Ministerial Order.

Unless the Order specifies otherwise, boundaries follow the south and west boundaries of adjoining road allowances.

Hamlets and organized hamlets are part of rural municipalities.

Incorporated urban areas are separate municipalities.

A typical Rural Municipality has 6 divisions and each division contains 1½ Townships.

A typical Township contains 36 square miles (sections) plus road allowances.

A larger Rural Municipality may have more than 6 divisions.
