### Real Economic Growth Maintains Strength

2008 will be remembered as perhaps one of the most volatile years for the world economy since the end of World War Two. Fortunately, Saskatchewan's economic performance for 2008 continued to demonstrate many of the trends that underscore the prosperity currently enjoyed by the province. Saskatchewan's economy, as measured by the rate of increase in Real Gross Domestic Product, expanded at an annual rate of 3.9 per cent in 2008. Real personal expenditure on goods and services, gross fixed capital formation, and higher farm inventories accounted for most of the increase.

Real personal expenditure on goods and services increased by 5.5 per cent last year. The rate of annual growth for gross fixed capital formation (investment) was 12.5 per cent. Real government current expenditure on goods and services grew by 3.1 per cent. Meanwhile, strong consumption demand combined with a high Canadian dollar in 2008 kept the value of imports high. Real exports experienced a marginal movement upwards.



### Commodity Prices Continue to Boost GDP and Corporate Profits


Saskatchewan's nominal GDP increased at an annual rate of 25.5 per cent in 2008. This is the highest annual growth rate with respect to nominal GDP growth the province has posted since 1974. Strong market demand and the accompanying increase in commodity prices boosted the value of exports by 31.9 per cent last year. The dollar value of potash exports rose 144.3 per cent while the value of crude oil exports increased by 59.7 per cent. The value of grain exports also grew considerably from 2007.

Alongside these, total corporate profits before taxes advanced at an annual rate of 57.9 per cent, an even better performance than the healthy 18.5 per cent increase in 2007.


**Chart 3: Corporate Profits Before Taxes,

## Employment Shows Continued Robustness

In 2008 total employment reached 512,700, the highest in the history of the province. This exemplary labour market performance in the past year is demonstrated further in the 2008 unemployment rate of 4.2 per cent. This is the second lowest annual rate of unemployment since 1976. Full-time employment in Saskatchewan expanded by 3.2 per cent in 2008 to 421,100; a growth rate that was higher than that of any other province.

## Personal Income Moves Upward

The average weekly earnings of paid employees increased by 4.8 per cent in 2008. As a result, wages and supplementary labour income expanded by 8.4 per cent while total personal income went up by 12.4 per cent.

## Population Continues Advance


The population of Saskatchewan had grown for eleven consecutive quarters as of the end of 2008. The provincial population as of January 1, 2009, was estimated to be 1,023,810. This is a 1.5 per cent increase from the January 1, 2008, population estimate of 1,008,679. Saskatchewan experienced the third highest rate of population growth among Canadian provinces in 2008.

26,507 individuals moved to Saskatchewan from other provinces in 2008 while 20,948 left to go elsewhere in Canada. Therefore, the net population growth caused by interprovincial migration was 5,559. Additionally, the end of 2008 brought eight consecutive quarters of net migration from Alberta to Saskatchewan. In 2008 there were 13,145 Albertans who came to Saskatchewan while only 10,883 people here relocated to Alberta.

## Prairie Consumers Are Confident

Total consumer expenditure on all goods and services rose by 8.6 per cent in 2008 when expressed in current dollars. Consumer spending continues to increase across Canada in general, but in 2008 Saskatchewan retail trade per capita exceeded the Canadian value for the second year in a row. In 2008, Canadian per capita retail trade grew only marginally while the equivalent value in Saskatchewan increased almost as much as it did in 2007. Canadian per capita retail trade in 2008 was \$12,789 and in Saskatchewan it was \$14,134.

& the Prairie Provinces, 1999-2008**




## Saskatchewan: A Leader in New Housing

The level of building permits granted in Saskatchewan in 2008 was \$2.19 billion, a 32.8 per cent increase over 2007. Last year's residential building permits of \$1.10 billion were 27.5 per cent ahead of the 2007 total.

Construction was started in this province on 6,828 residential units in 2008, a 13.7 per cent increase from 2007. Canada as a whole experienced a decline of 7.6 per cent in new housing starts between 2007 and 2008. Construction was completed on 6,632 residential units in 2008 in this province, which was a growth of 35.9 per cent compared to the previous year. The number of completions Canada-wide rose by 2.5 per cent between 2007 and 2008.

During the last decade, the proportion of housing starts in regions of Saskatchewan outside of the Census Metropolitan Areas (CMAs) of Regina and Saskatoon has stayed relatively constant. This stability is even more significant given the clear upward trend of new housing construction.

1999-2008




Saskatchewan's CPI was marginally lower than the nation-leading Prince Edward Island level of 3.4 per cent.

Saskatoon led non-northern Canadian cities with an annual CPI increase in 2008 of 3.9 per cent while Regina was in fifth place at 3.1 per cent.

The chart below illustrates the unusual path of inflation throughout 2008. Each data point indicates the year-over-year percentage increase in this province for the All-items CPI, gasoline, and new housing (called replacement cost by Statistics Canada). For example, the value for May 2008 indicates the percentage change since May 2007. The All-Items CPI seems to remain within a relatively narrow range over this period, while gasoline and housing are more volatile. Components of any price index tend to show more variation than the index itself, but the range of both gasoline and new housing price changes over such a relatively short period are unusual for Saskatchewan.

Commodities, 2007-2008





## Inflation: A Turning Point?





**Table 10: Employed by Industry, Saskatchewan**





Table 19: Indexes of Farm Costs (1992=100)





Table 20: Industrial Product Price Indexes, Canada (1997=100)





**Table 50: Air Traffic - Inbound and Outbound Passengers**













# Saskatchewan Economic Accounts

The Saskatchewan Bureau of Statistics has developed a set of economic accounts which can be used to trace the development and growth of the Saskatchewan economy.

The purpose of the accounts is to measure the value of economic activity in each sector of the economy. This is done by means of a balancing set of accounts similar to the annual income and expenditure statements of a commercial enterprise.

The accounts have many useful functions. They consolidate information which is now provided through a number of scattered sources and organize it into a central framework. This allows many kinds of economic analysis to be performed ranging from monitoring current economic performance to analysis of structural change in the economy.

The Saskatchewan Bureau of Statistics has adopted the Chain Fisher volume index methodology for calculating real Gross Domestic Product (GDP). This method of calculating real growth in the economy removes potential substitution bias that exists when using a constant-dollar method (the Laspeyres index).

The Saskatchewan Bureau of Statistics has available, upon request, many more detailed tables and other information concerning the Saskatchewan Economic Accounts.

## Saskatchewan Economic Accounts

In nominal terms, Saskatchewan's GDP increased by 25.5 per cent in 2008 to \$64,316 million while final domestic demand (sum of personal expenditures, government expenditures and investment) rose by 10.8 per cent. Personal expenditure on consumer goods and services rose by 8.6 per cent. Buoyed on by double-digit growth in retail sales, spending rose by 8.5 per cent on durable goods, 7.1 per cent on non-durable goods and 9.6 per cent on services. Semi-durable goods also posted strong growth (6.7 per cent) in 2008. Government current expenditure on goods and services rose by 6.9 per cent in 2008 while total investment increased by 19.3 per cent in 2008. Fueled on by strong wheat, potash and crude oil sales out of Saskatchewan, nominal exports increased 31.9 per cent from 2007 levels. Imports rose 11.8 per cent in 2008.

Real gross domestic product increased at an annual rate of 3.9 per cent in 2008 to \$41,646 million. Real personal expenditure on consumer goods and services increased by 5.5 per cent, government expenditures on goods and services increased by 3.1 per cent while real gross fixed capital formation increased by 12.5 percent. Record grain production led to massive additions to farm inventories while non-farm inventories decreased from 2007. Real exports rose marginally (0.5 percent) in 2008

while strong domestic demand led real imports to rise by 5.1 percent over 2007. Real final domestic demand increased by 6.7 per cent in 2008.

Personal income in Saskatchewan rose by 12.4 per cent in 2008. Wages, salaries and supplementary incomes (on a Gross National Product basis) rose 8.4 per cent and net income of non-farm unincorporated businesses increased by 14.8 per cent. Accrued (based on year of production) net income received by farm operators increased by over \$1.5 billion from 2007. After subtracting direct taxes, contributions to social insurance plans, and pension plan contributions, personal disposable income rose by 13.7 per cent.

For the first time since 2004 and only the second time in past decade, personal savings were positive in Saskatchewan at \$735 million in 2008. This is an increase of over \$1.2 billion from 2007.

This document represents preliminary Saskatchewan economic accounts for 2008 data. Periodic revisions are common to all economic series, as more comprehensive data is obtained, in order to improve the accuracy, reliability and consistency of the data.
