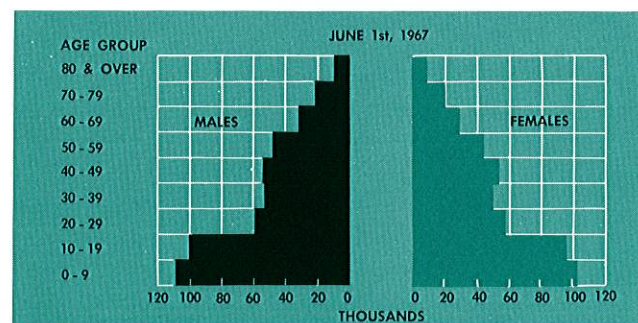

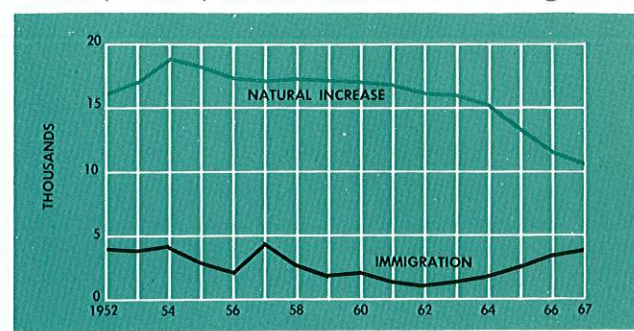

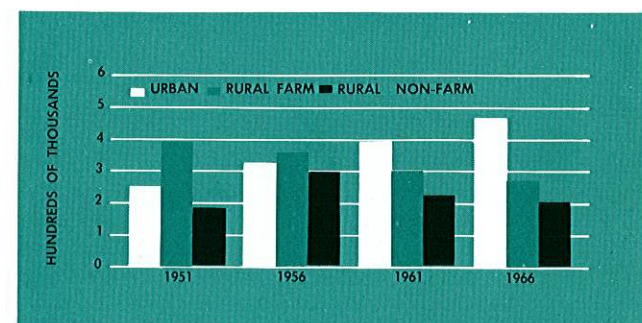

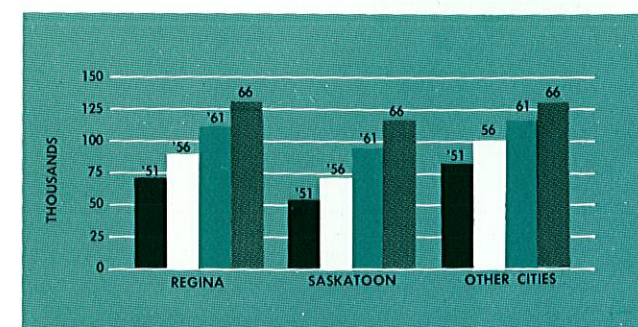

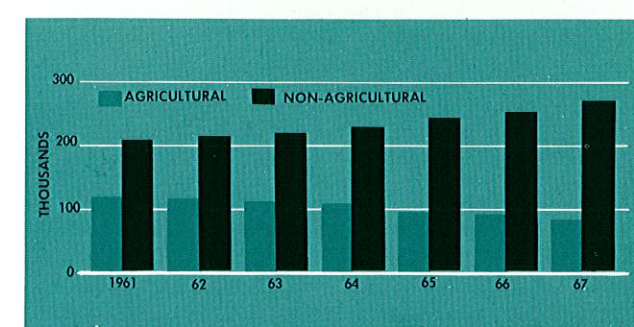

Table 6: LABOUR FORCE CHARACTERISTICS, Saskatchewan

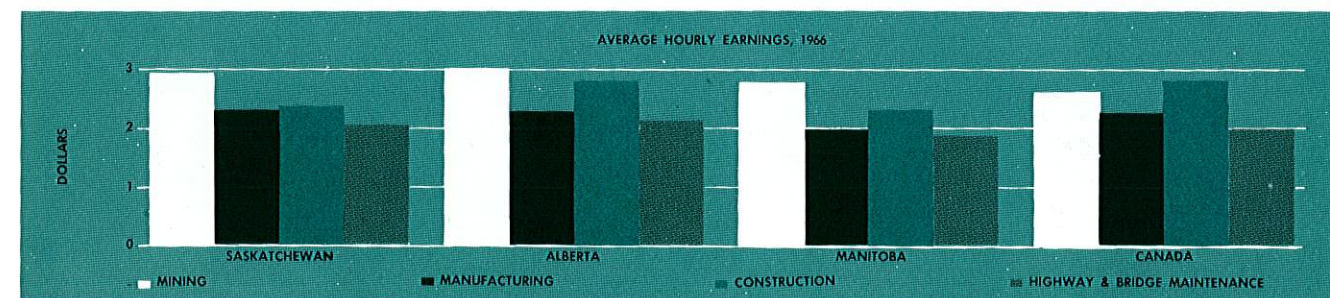

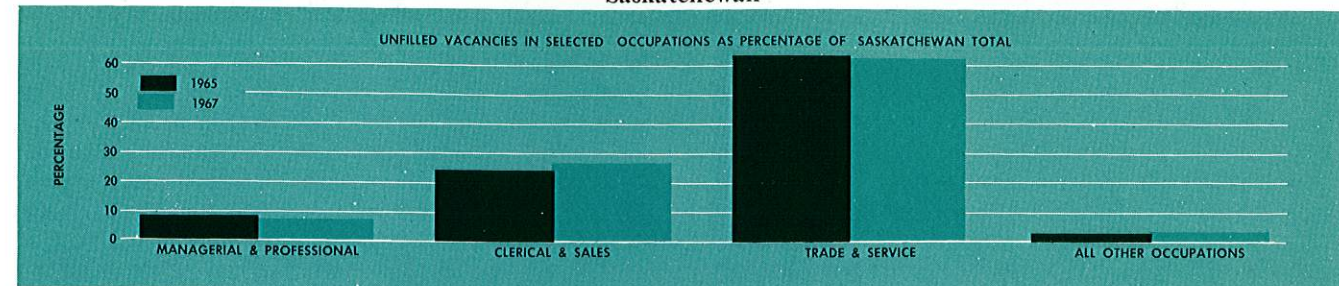

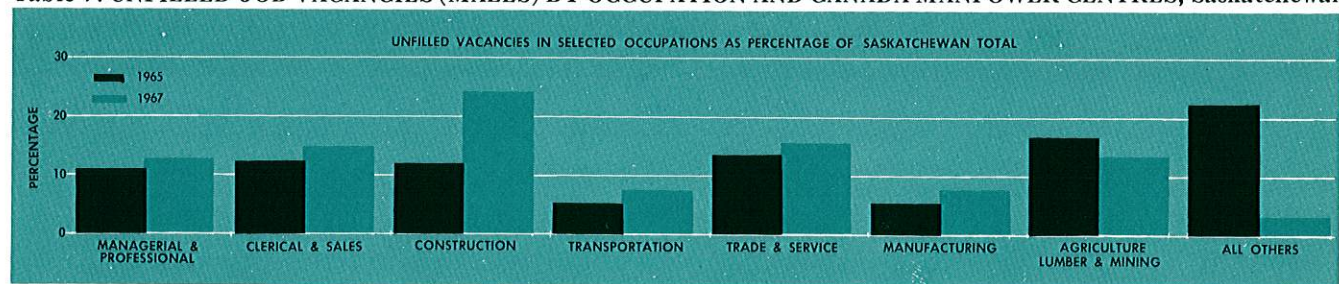

Table 9: UNFILLED JOB VACANCIES (MALES) BY OCCUPATION AND CANADA MANPOWER CENTRES, Saskatchewan



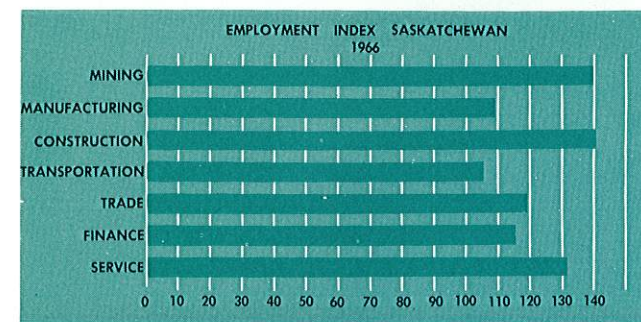

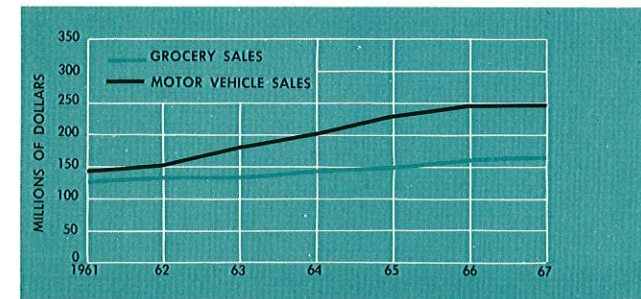

Table 12: RETAIL TRADE, BY KIND OF BUSINESS, Saskatchewan

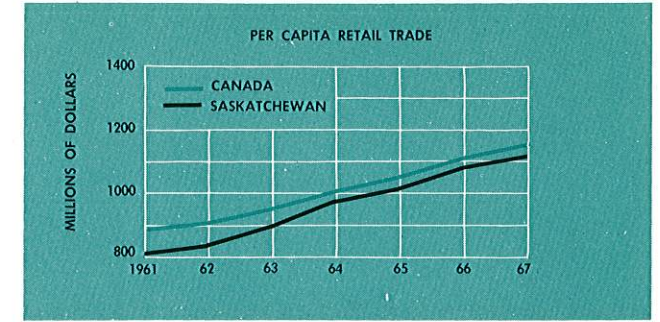

Table 11: RETAIL TRADE, Canada, Prairies and Saskatchewan

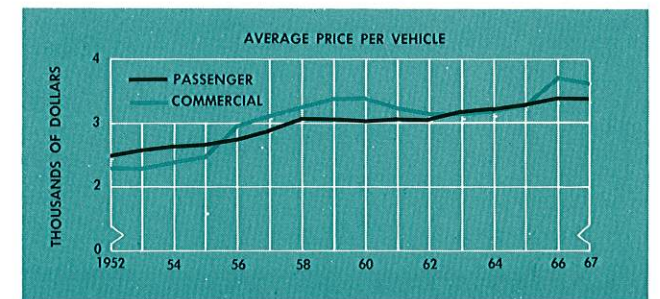

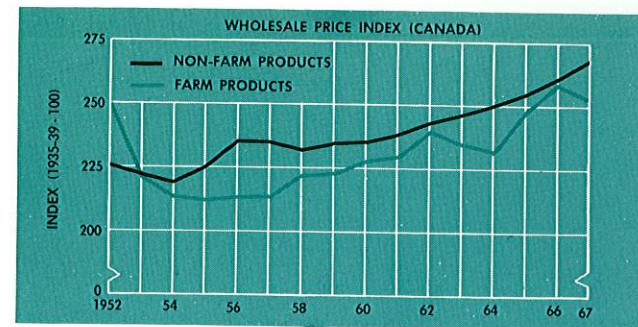

Table 14: WHOLESALE PRICE INDEX, Canada (1935-39=100)

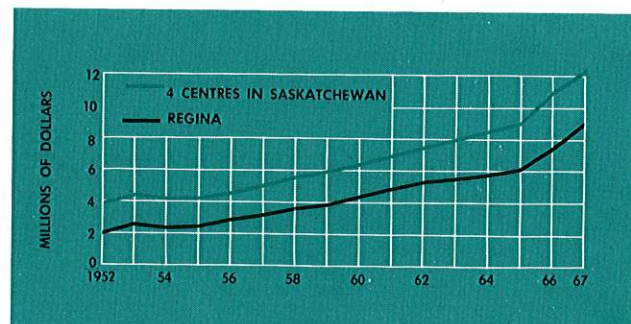

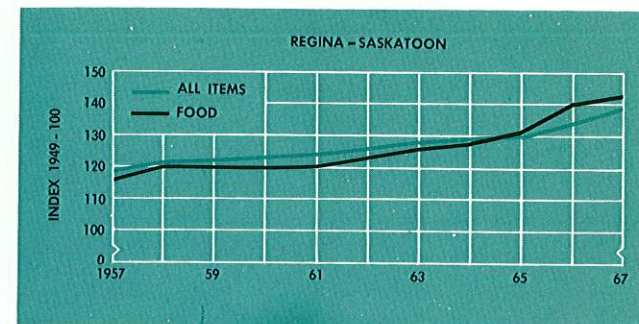

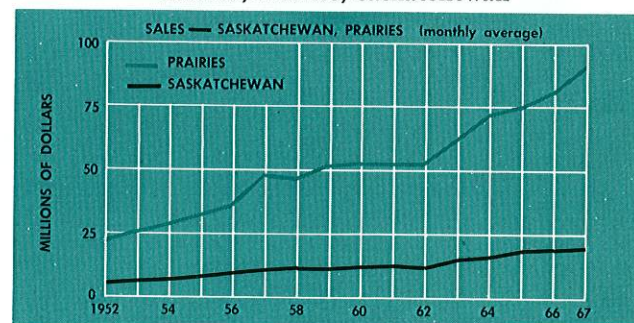

Table 17: LIFE INSURANCE SALES, Canada, Prairies, Saskatchewan

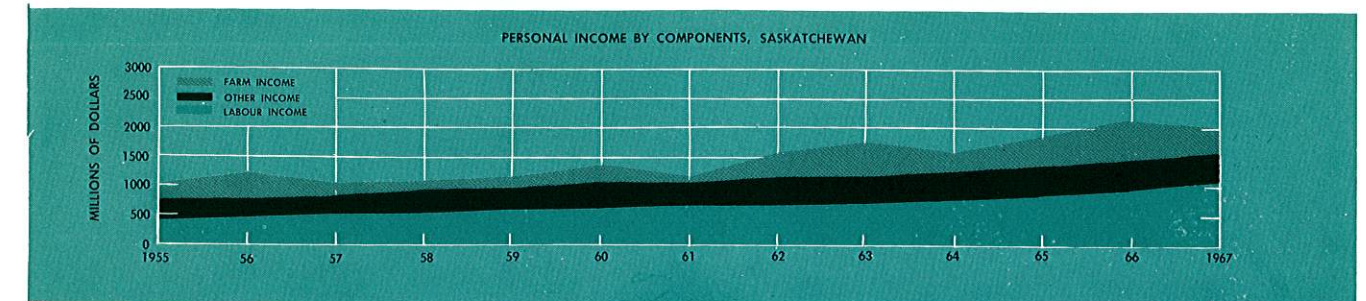

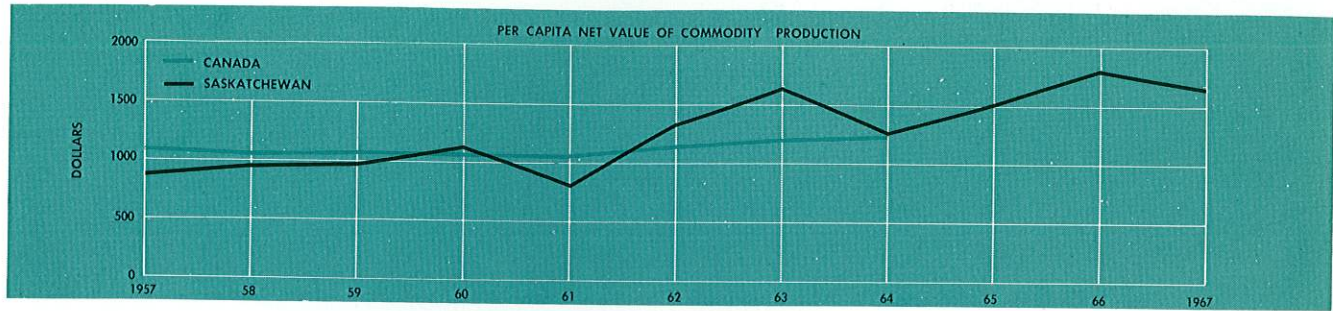

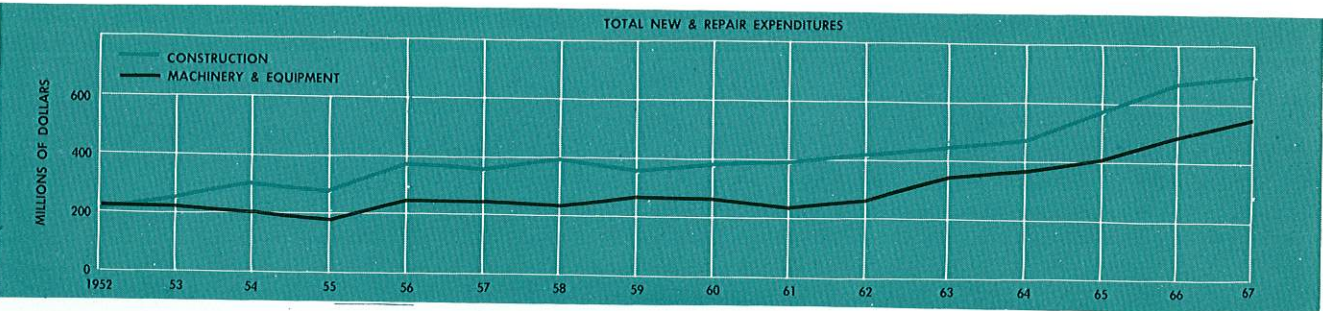

Table 21: PRIVATE AND PUBLIC INVESTMENT BY INDUSTRY, Saskatchewan



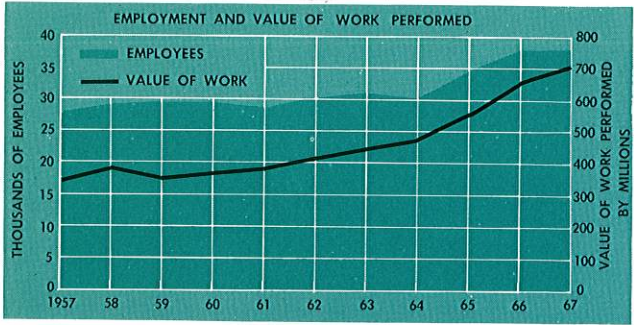

Table 25: NEW DWELLING UNITS STARTED, by Type, Saskatchewan



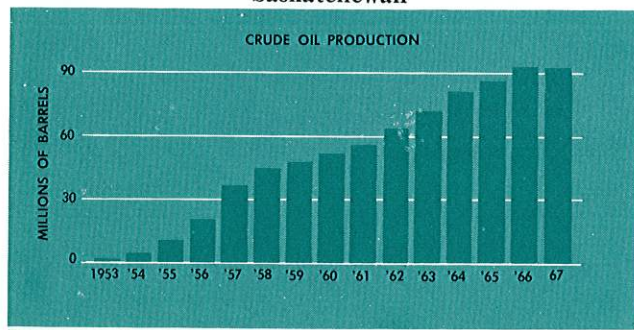

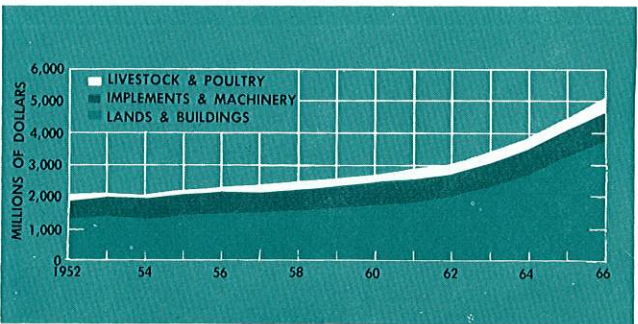

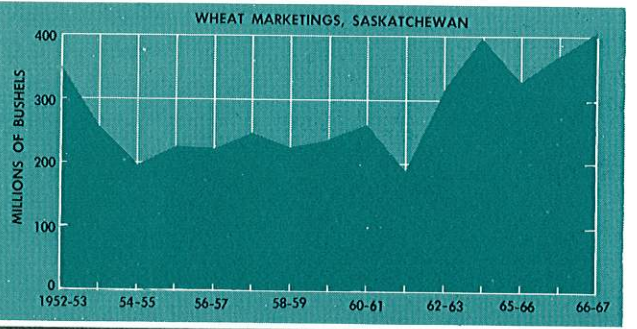

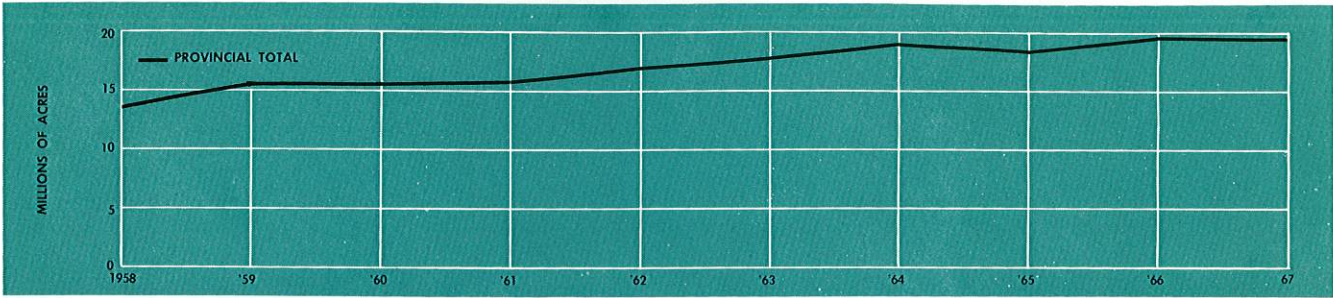

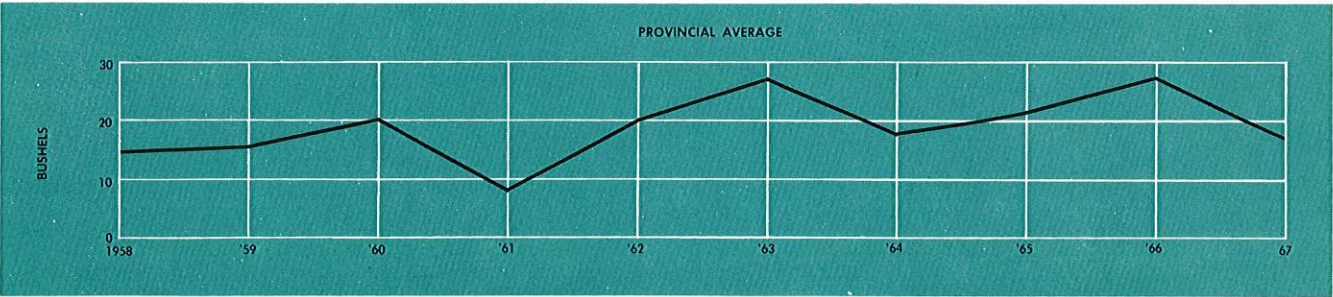

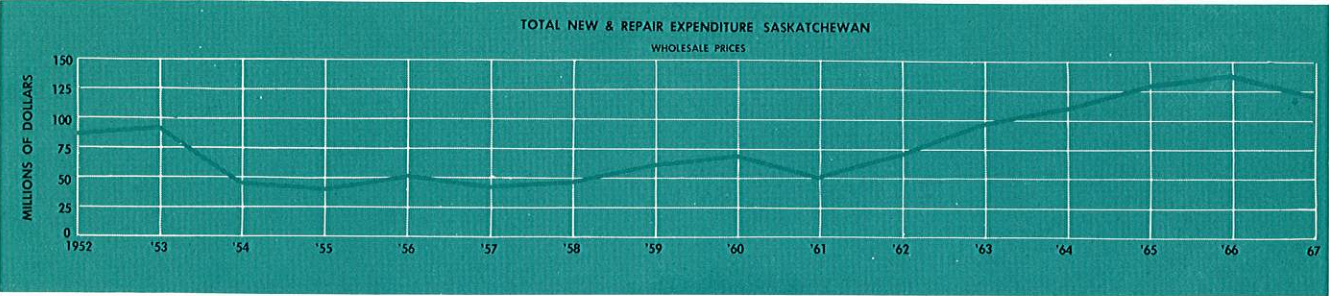

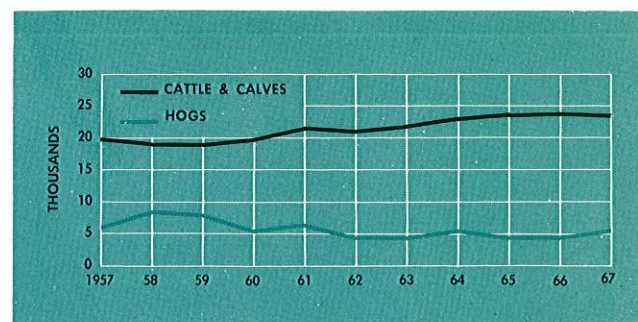

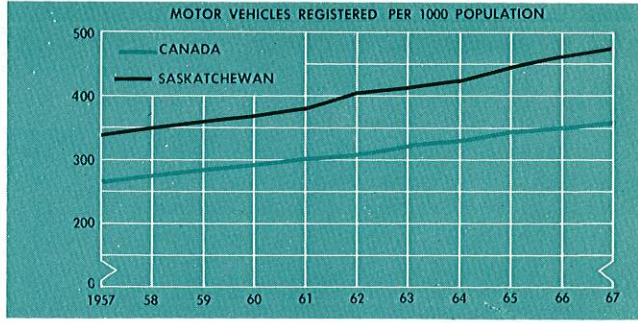

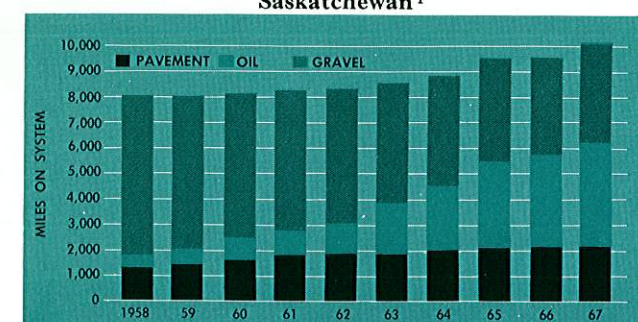

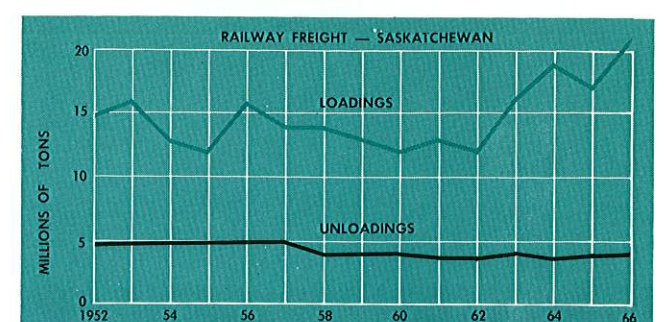

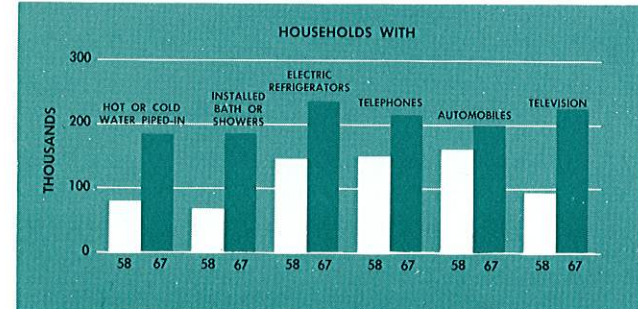

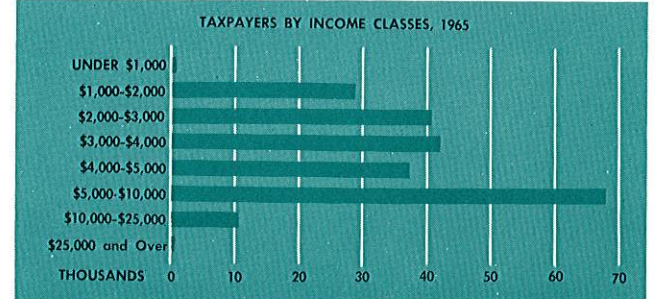

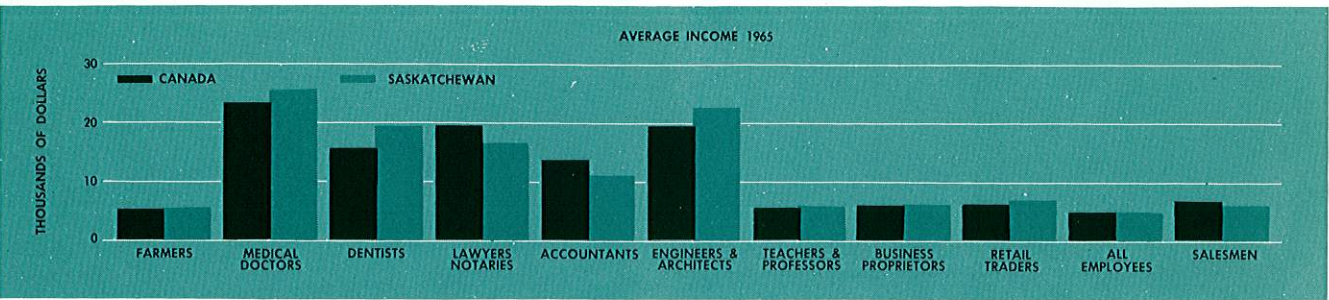

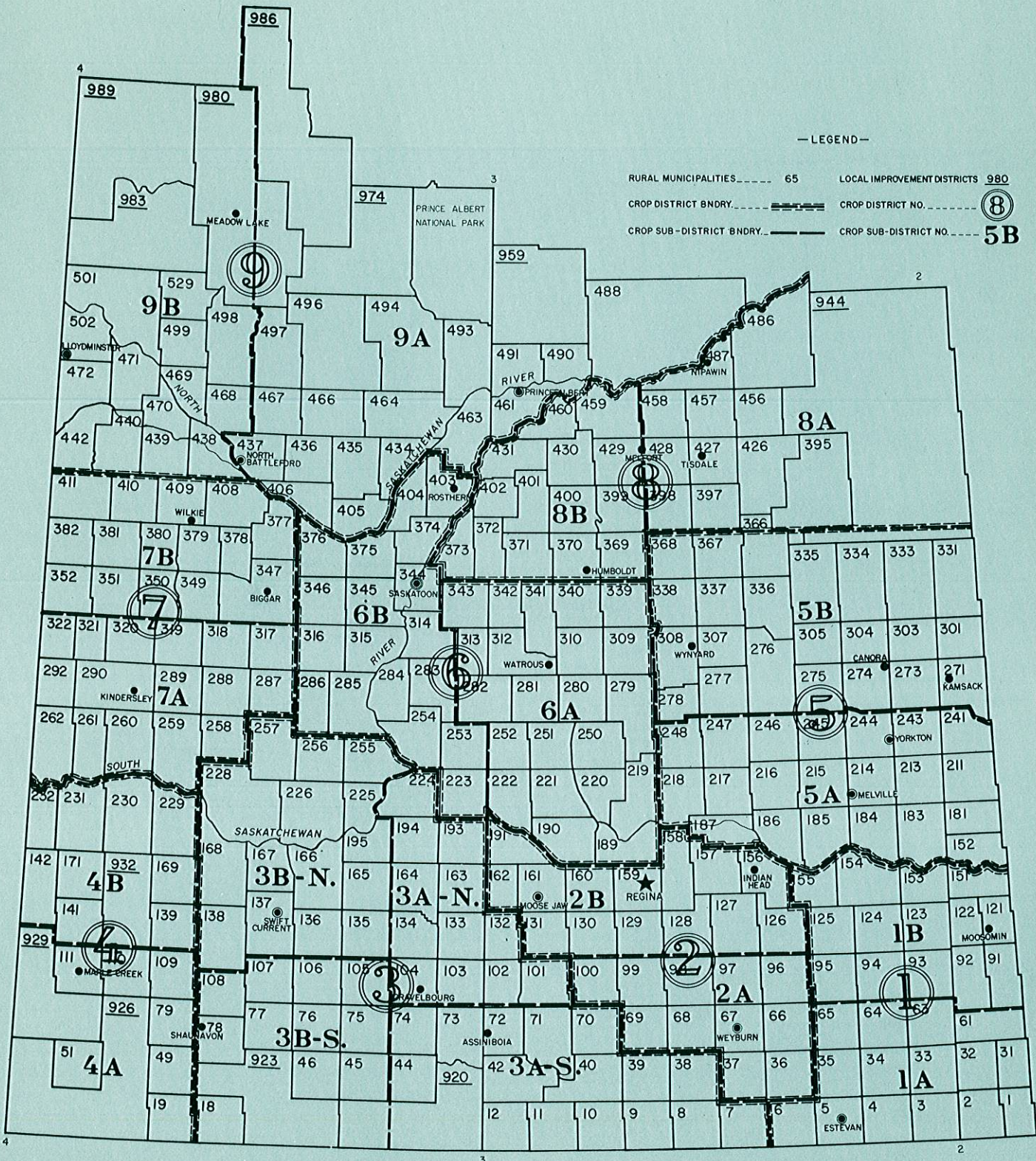

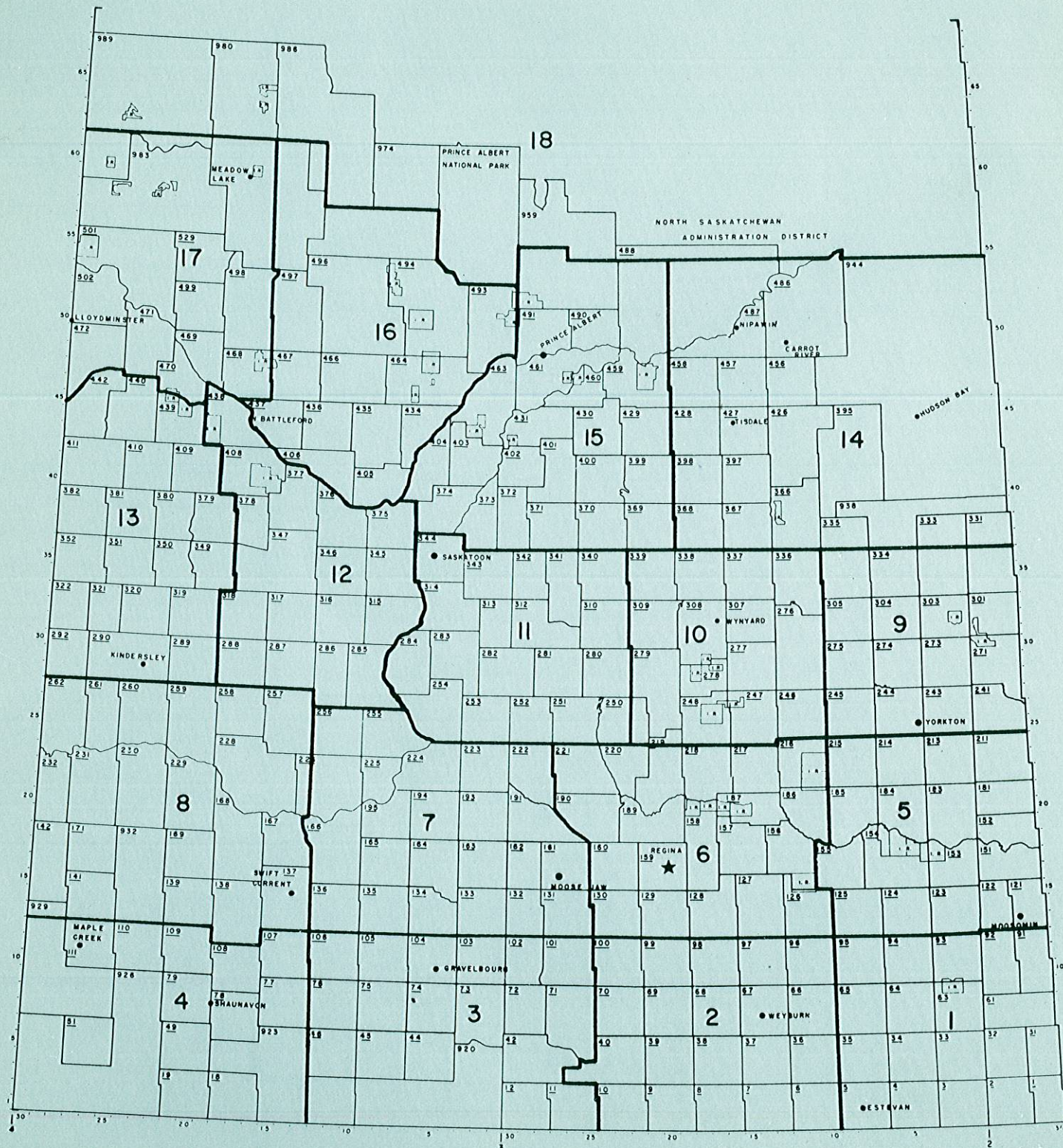
