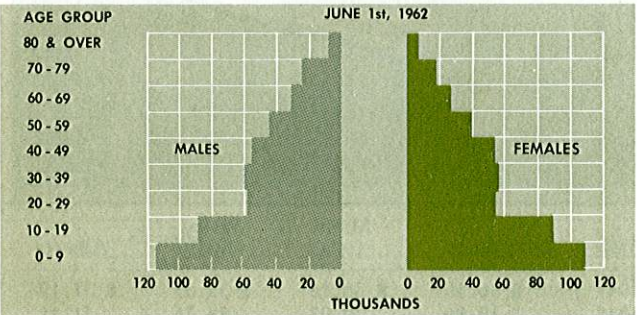

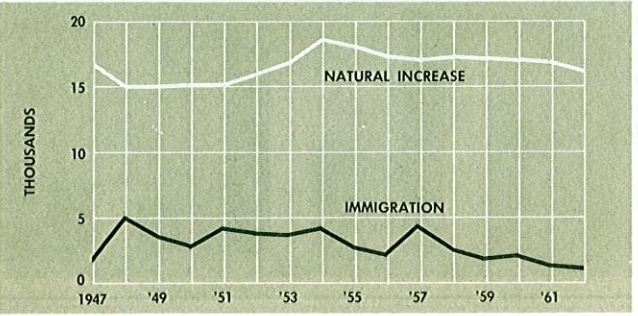

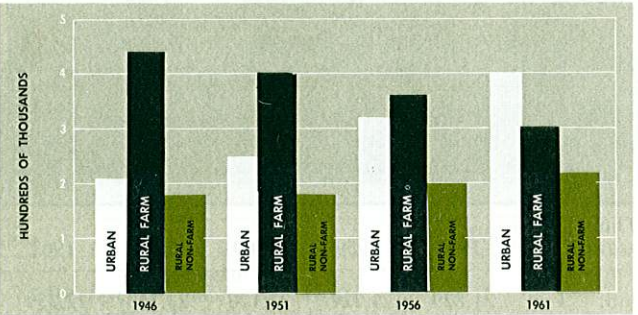

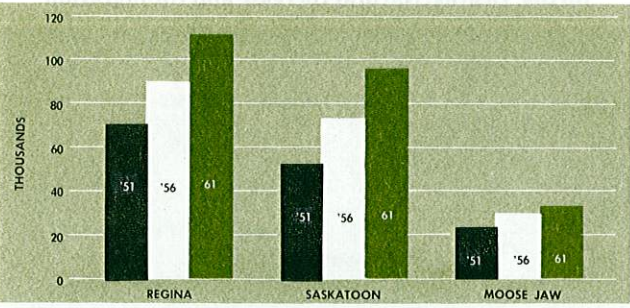

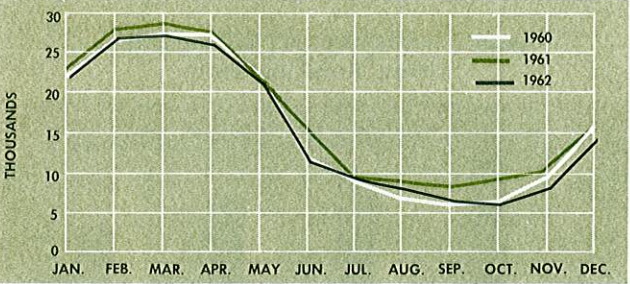

Table 7: UNPLACED APPLICANTS FOR EMPLOYMENT at N.E.S. Offices, Saskatchewan



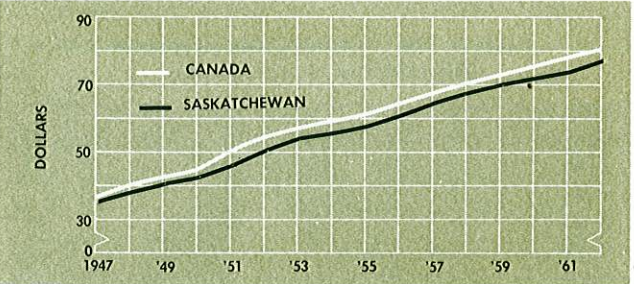

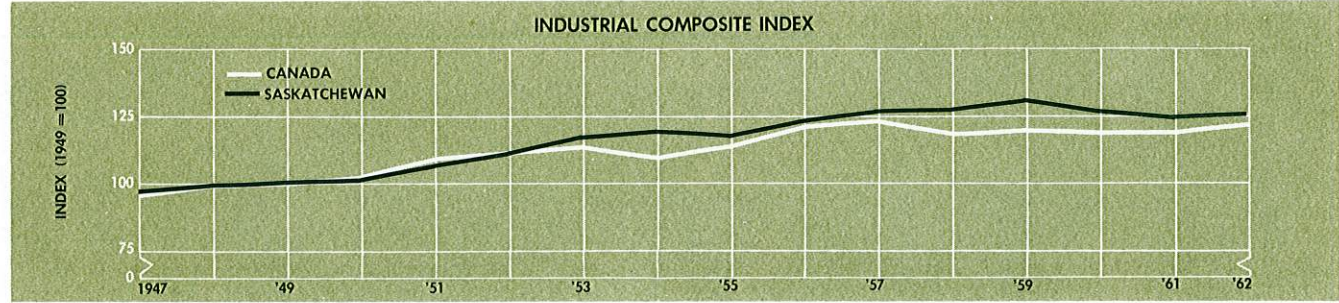

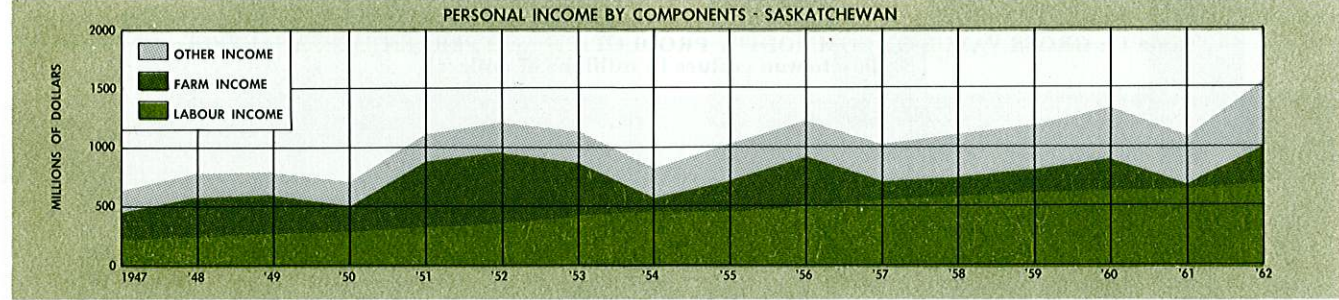

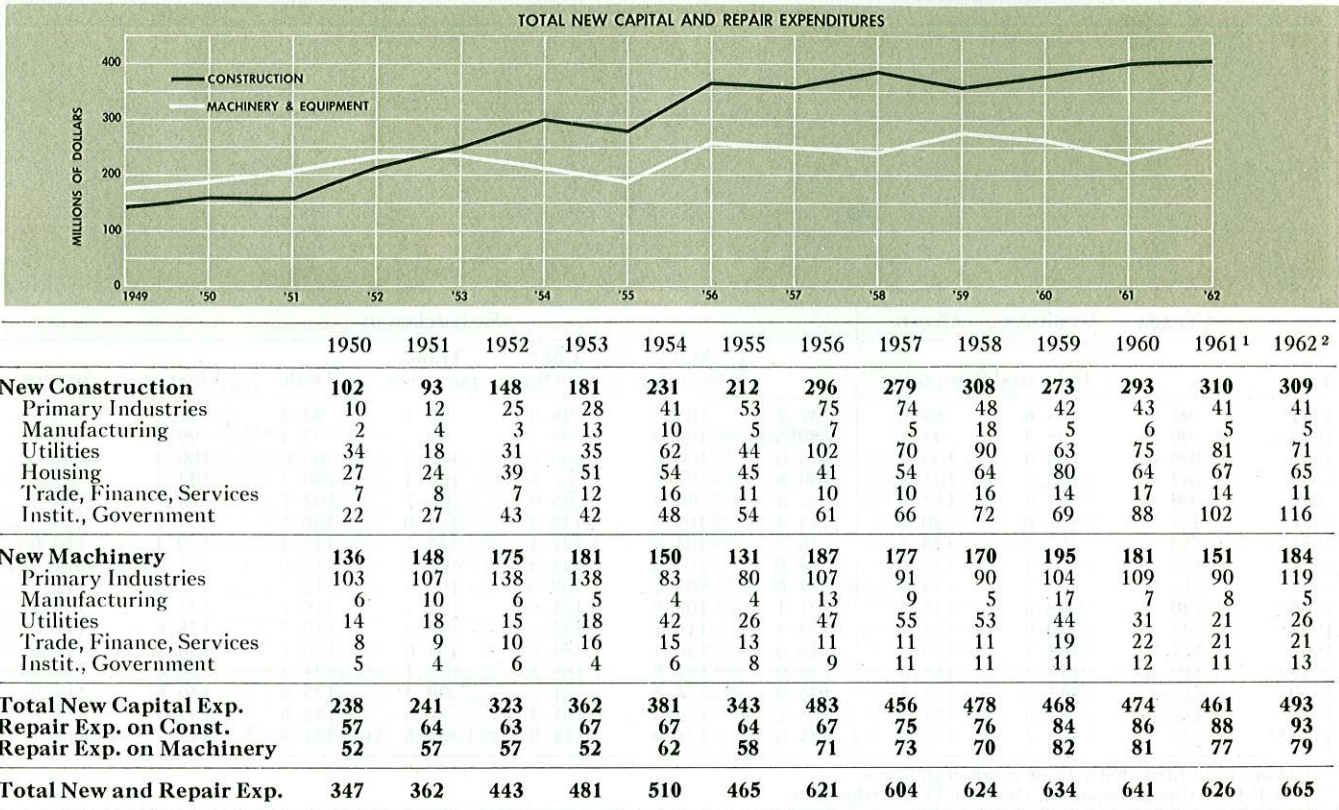

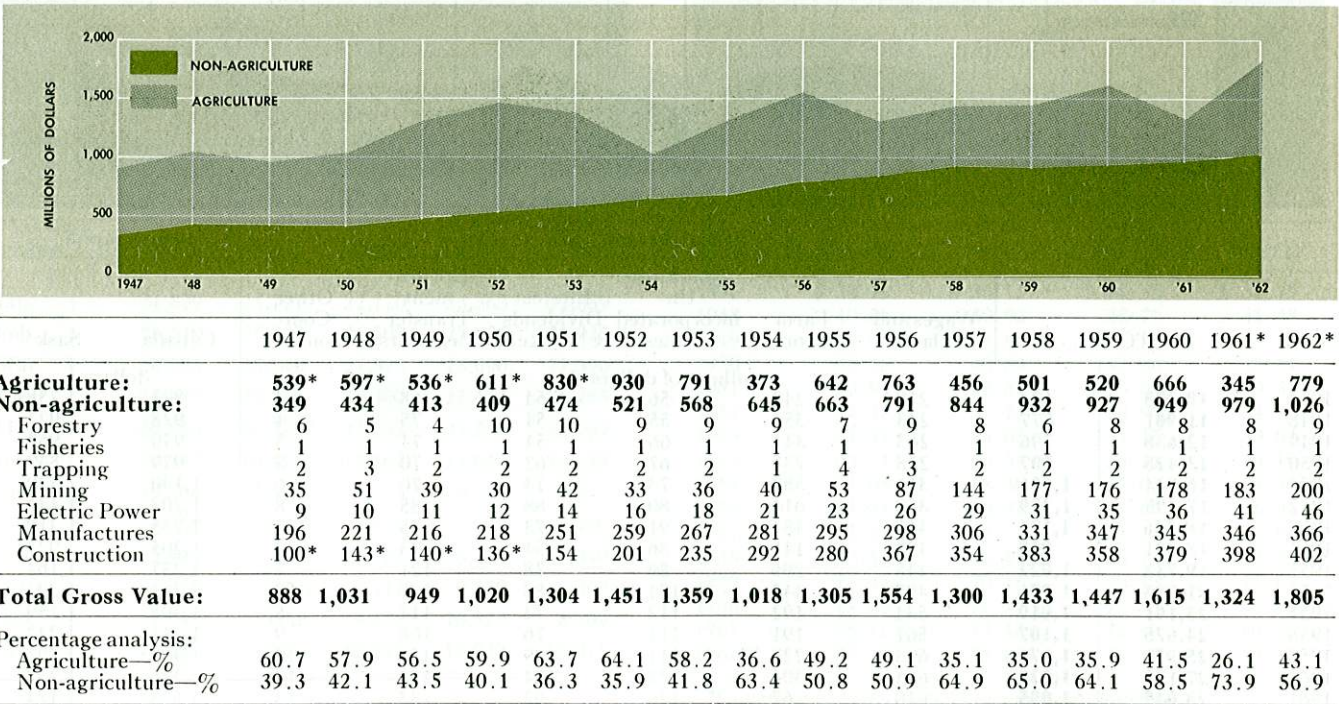


Table 11: PRIVATE AND PUBLIC INVESTMENT BY INDUSTRY, Saskatchewan, (\$000,000)



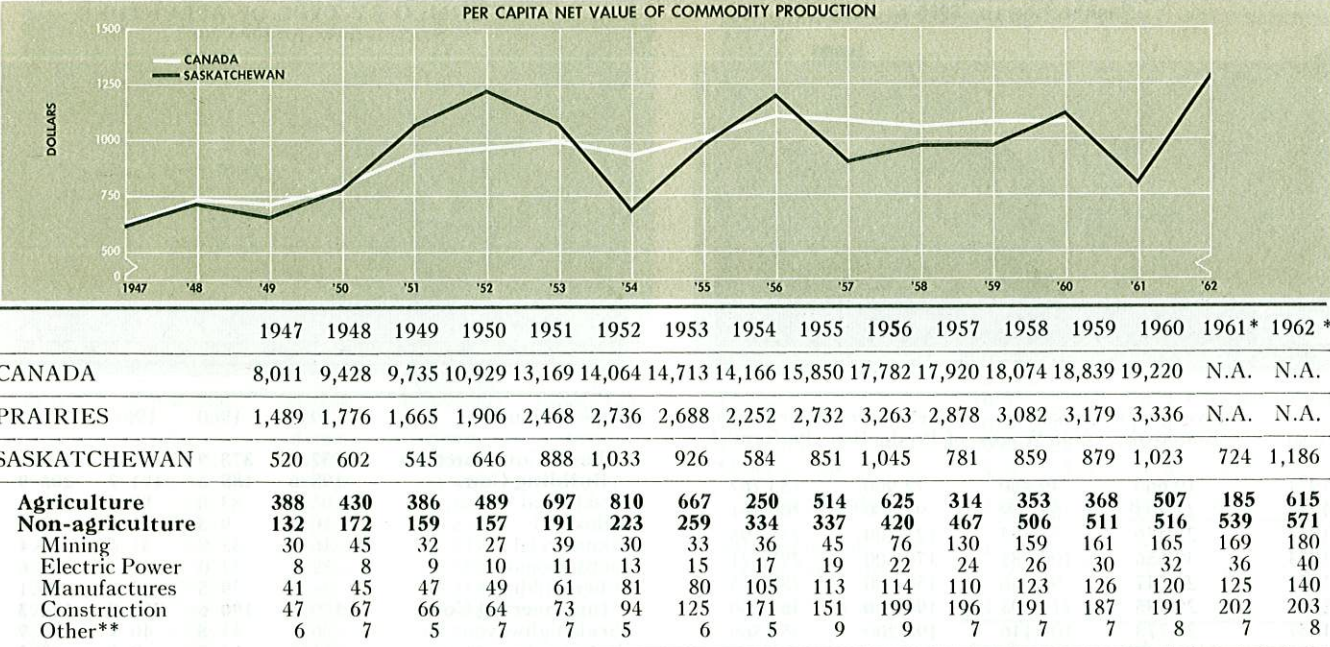

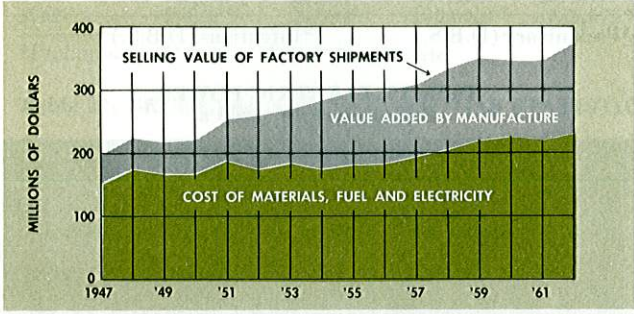

Table 15: LEADING MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES, Saskatchewan, 1959

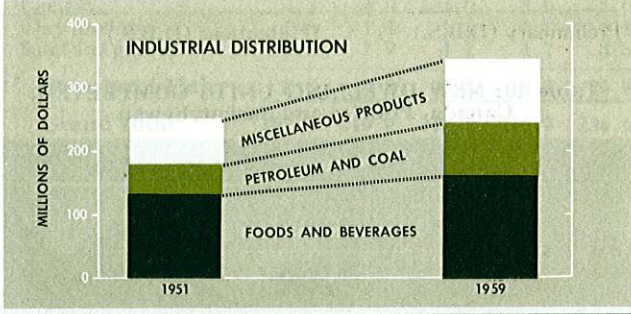
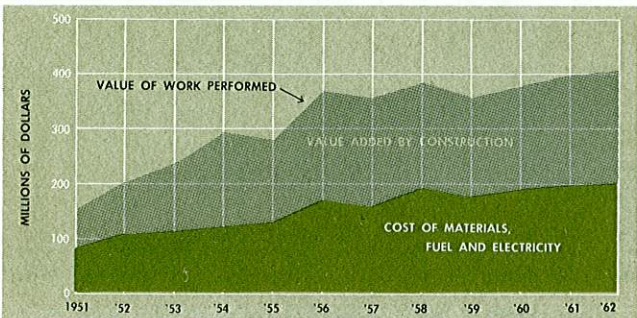




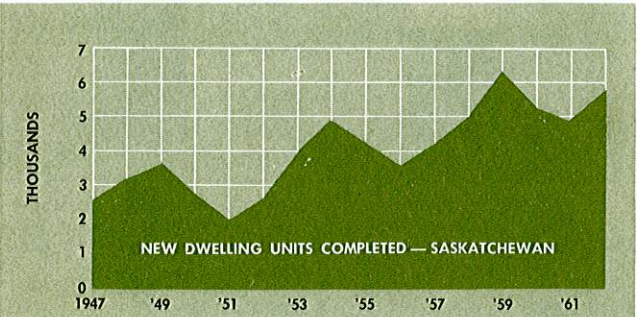

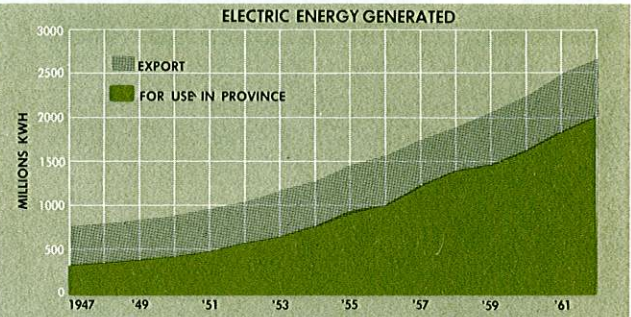

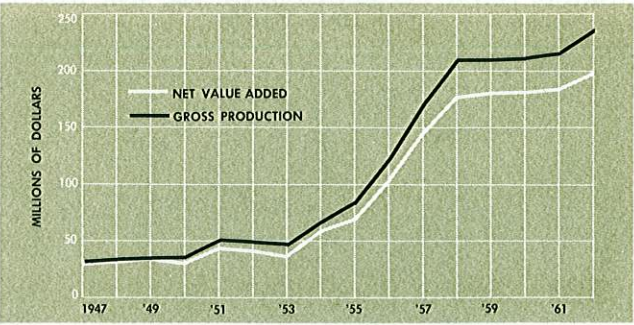

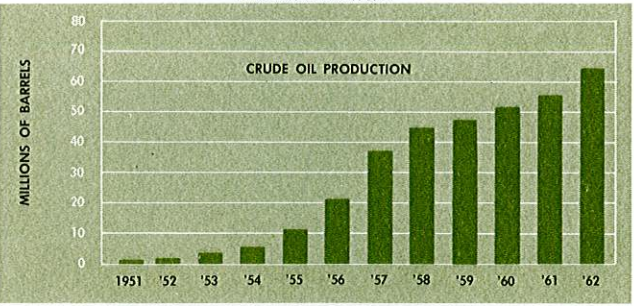

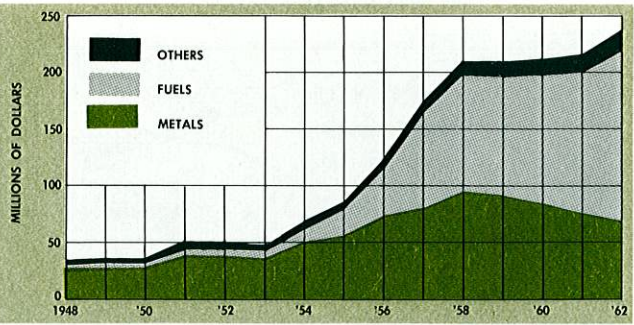

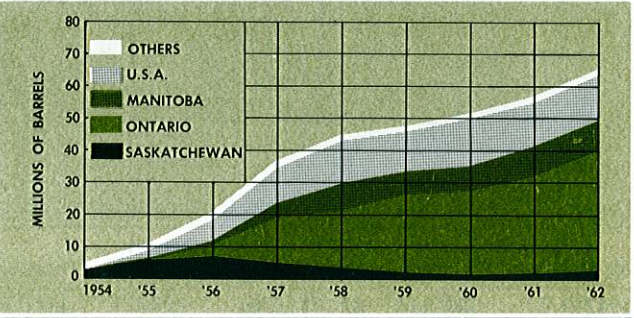

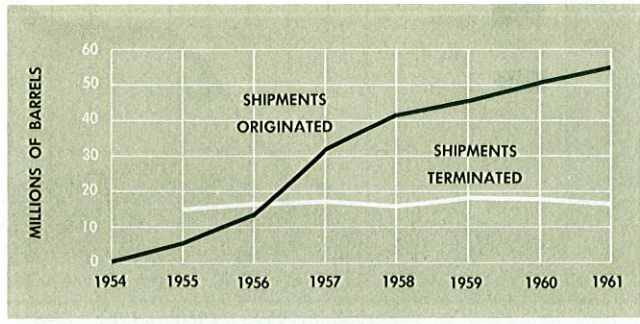

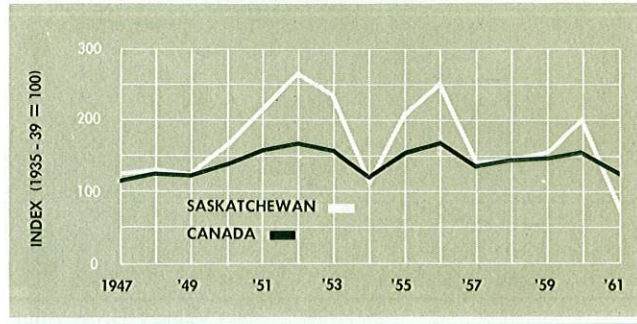

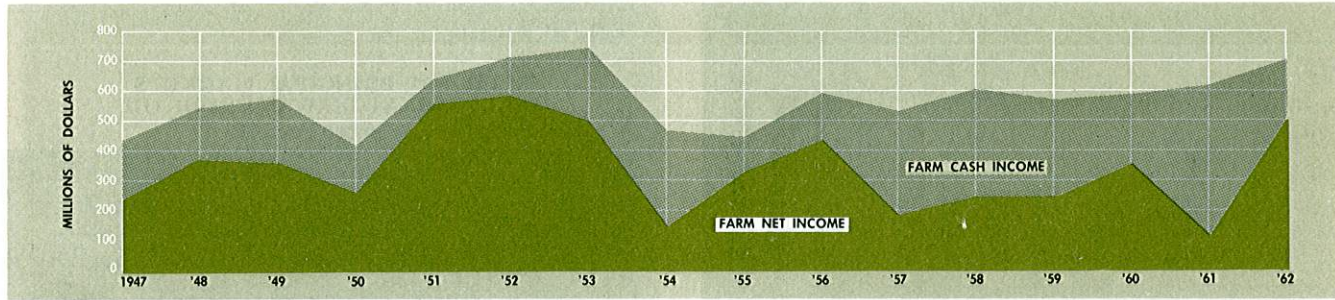
