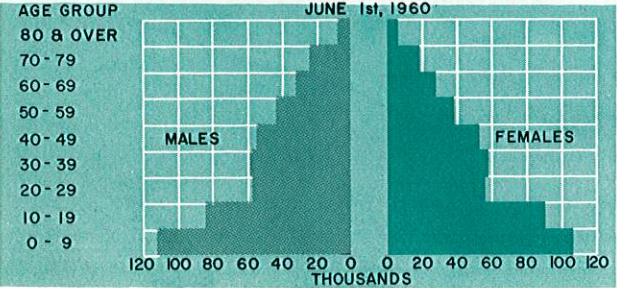

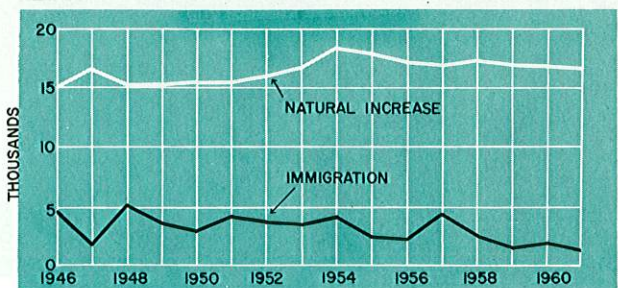

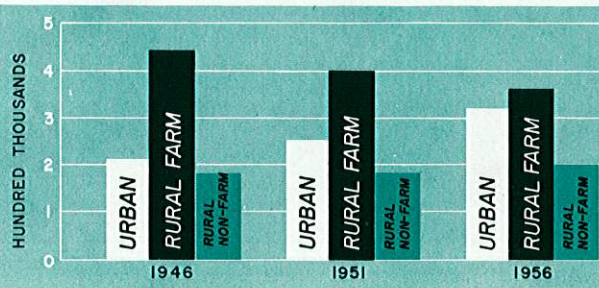

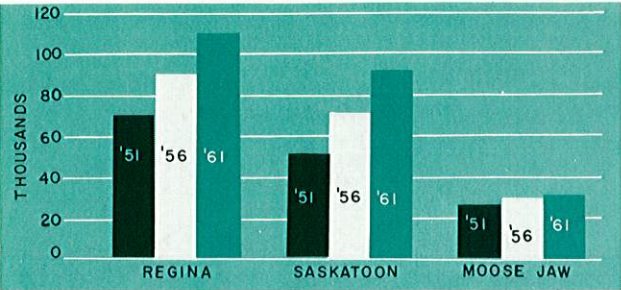

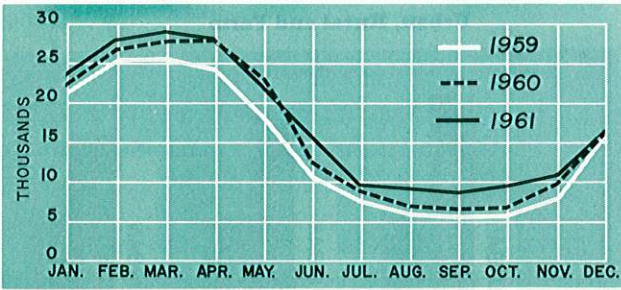

Table 5: CITY POPULATION, SASKATCHEWAN, and Percentage Increases from 1951 to 1961



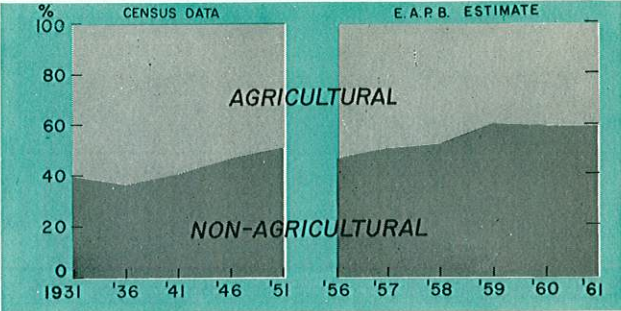

Table 7: UNPLACED APPLICANTS FOR EMPLOYMENT at N.E.S. Offices, Saskatchewan



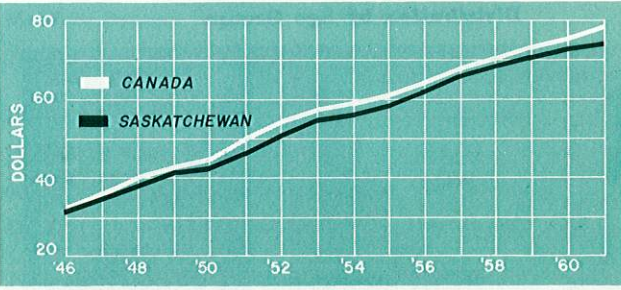

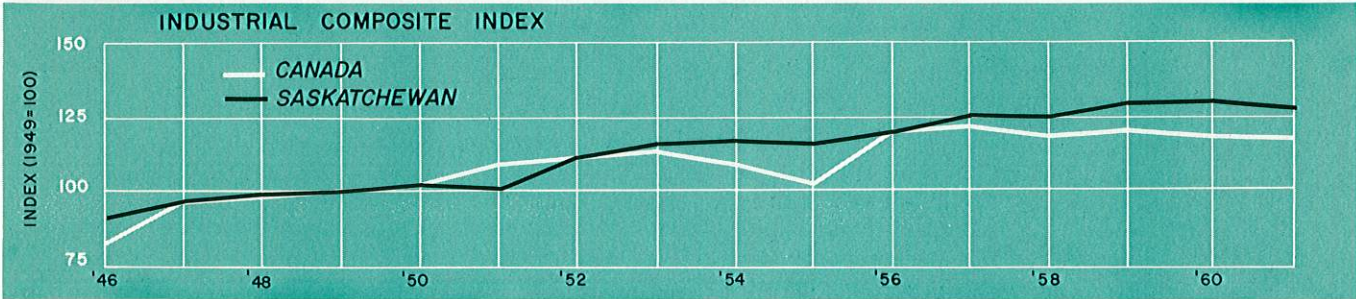

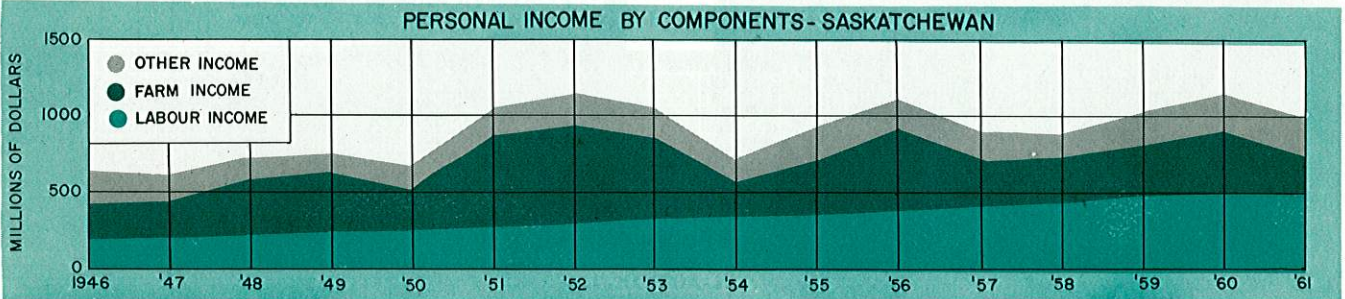

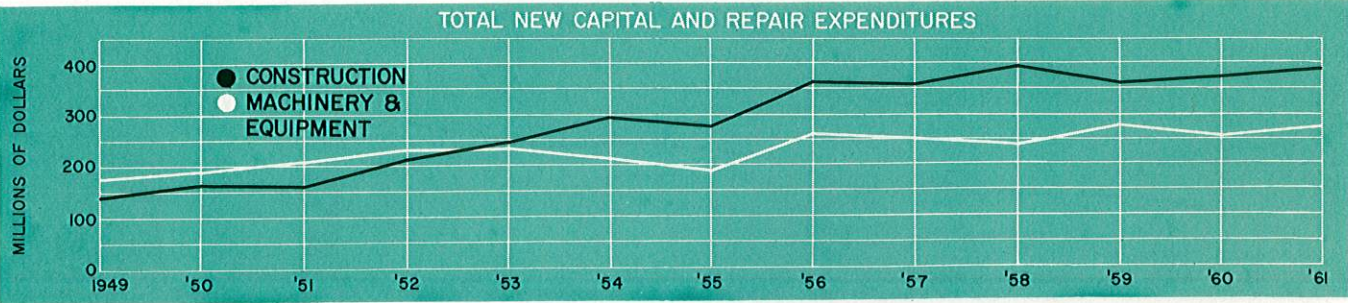

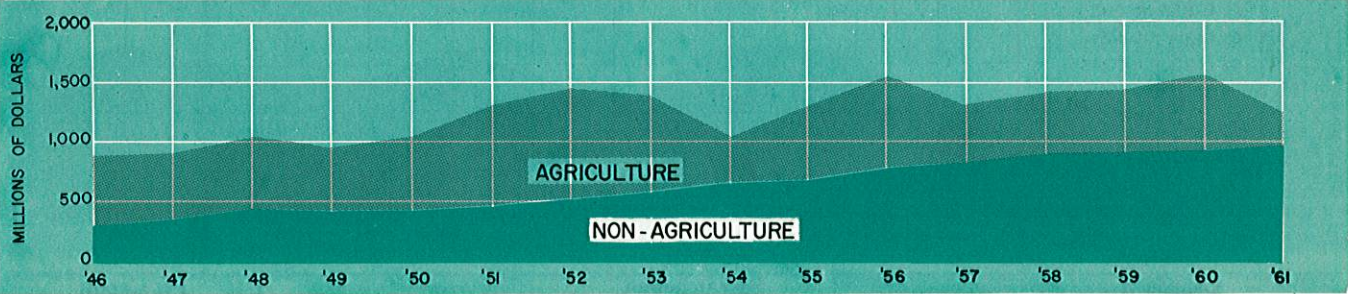

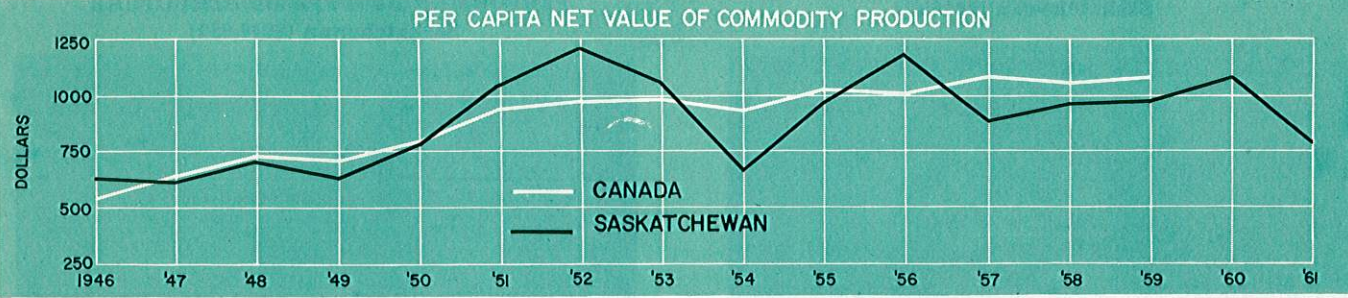

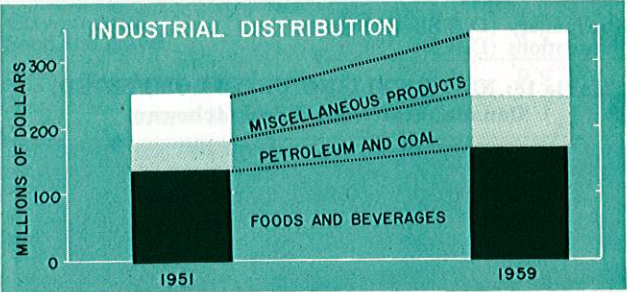

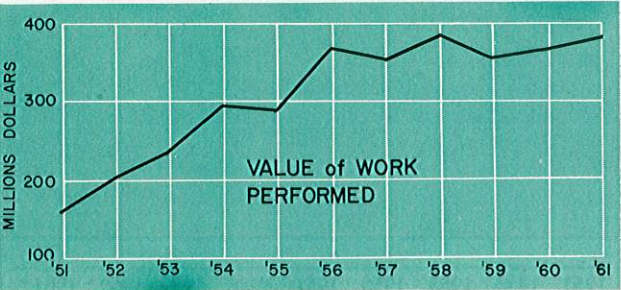

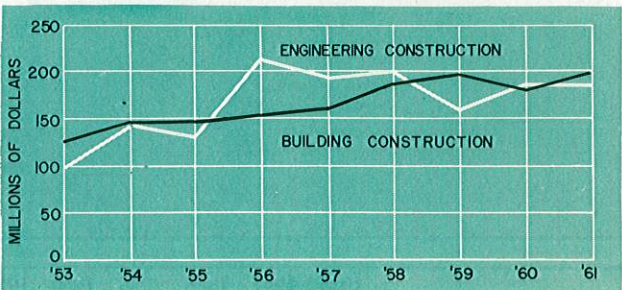

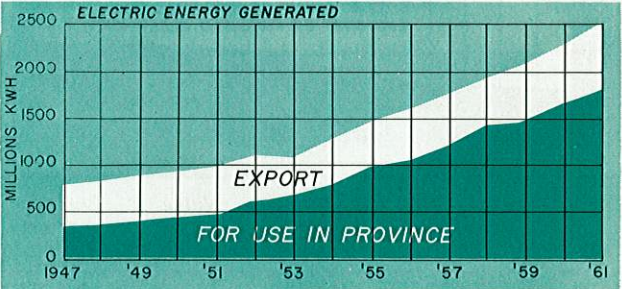

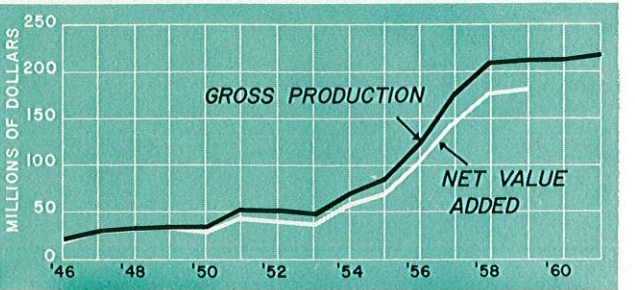

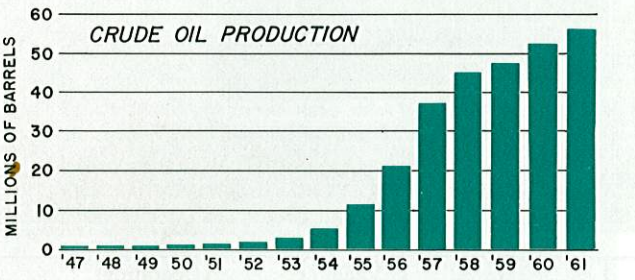
Table 20: PRINCIPAL STATISTICS OF THE MINERAL INDUSTRY, Saskatchewan
