
Introduction

Saskatchewan's economy is influenced by the state of the global economy, commodity prices and the weather, but is also diversified across a number of sectors providing a high level of resilience. While 2014 saw some flooding and a late-year downturn in oil prices, the province experienced growth across most sectors.

Global economic growth

The United States, Saskatchewan's largest trading partner, grew by 2.4 per cent in 2014, well above its 10-year average of 1.5 per cent. Canada's economy grew by 2.5 per cent in 2014, well above its 10-year average of 1.9 per cent.


China and the Eurozone, two important markets for Saskatchewan, had vastly different fortunes. The Eurozone came out of recession and expanded by 0.9 per cent, the same as its 10-year average. China grew by 7.4 per cent, slower than its 10-year average of 9.9 per cent, but remains one of the fastest growing economies in the world.

In 2014, the global economy grew by 3.4 per cent, below the 10-year average of 3.7 per cent. Saskatchewan's economy grew by 1.4 per cent, below its 10-year average of 2.5 per cent.

Saskatchewan's low growth in 2014 is mainly the result of the record-breaking harvest in 2013 not being repeated in 2014. However, over the past five years Saskatchewan's economy has grown by 21 per cent.

Oil & natural gas

The price for WTI crude oil averaged US\$93.00/barrel in 2014, about the same as it has been for the past three years.

In 2014, a total of 3,665 oil and natural gas wells were drilled to a total cumulative depth of 5,400 kilometers.

In 2014, Saskatchewan produced a record 29.9 million cubic meters of oil, breaking the 2013 record of 28.3 million cubic meters. Over the past 10 years Saskatchewan's output has increased approximately 20%. An increasing share of the production was light crude.

Potash

In 2014, the average price of a tonne of potash was \$508.19/tonne, down from \$582.68/tonne in 2013. However, potash production in 2013 was up 1.589 million tonnes to 11.216 million tonnes. Potash is Saskatchewan's second-largest mineral export with \$5.7 billion in sales in 2014, up from \$5.6 billion in 2013.


The United States accounts for almost half of Saskatchewan's potash exports with Brazil, Indonesia, China, India and Malaysia making up the bulk of the remainder.

Agriculture

Saskatchewan farmers had a good year in 2014. Wheat yields across the province averaged 2,700KG/hectare, the second highest ever, behind only the record breaking year in 2013 and well above the 10-year average of 2,345KG/hectare. Above average yields were also had in canola, barley, oats, peas, lentils and flax.

Total production across all crop types totaled 30,514,500 tonnes in 2014, the second highest behind only 2013.

Total land used for crops has continued its long term downward trend falling to 17,223,500 hectares in 2014, the lowest since 1966.



Net farm cash income from operations hit an all-time high of \$4.626 billion in 2014, surpassing the previous record of \$3.823 billion in 2011. Rising cattle prices and inventory liquidation was the primary driver of the record-setting year.

Employment & income

Saskatchewan added 5,600 new jobs in 2014. Unemployment in Saskatchewan averaged 3.8 per cent in 2014, 0.7 percentage points lower than the 2013 average of 4.1 per cent.

Average weekly earnings in Saskatchewan went up 3.1 per cent in 2014, and in the past five years have increased 15.7 per cent.


In 2014, the mining, quarrying, oil and gas sector continued to offer the highest average hourly wages in the province at \$43.77/hour.

Investment

New capital investment in 2014 was \$20.945 billion, down \$0.4 billion from 2013 with \$21.345 billion. Investment was led by the mining, oil and gas industry at \$7.460 billion, followed by housing at \$3.596 billion.

Population

In 2014, there were 15,538 births in Saskatchewan and 9,745 deaths, resulting in a natural population increase of 5,793. Additionally, there were 11,603 more people that moved to Saskatchewan than left. Combined, the natural increase and net immigration resulted in a total population increase of 17,603 over the year. At the end of 2014, the population of Saskatchewan reached a record high of 1,132,640.



Housing

In 2014, there were 8,257 housing starts, down from 8,290 in 2013, but still up over 800 per cent from the lows of 1991.

Retail trade

Retail trade hit an all-time record high of \$19.129 billion in 2014, an increase of \$828 million over the record-setting year of 2013.

Utilities

Economic growth has been driving increases in Saskatchewan's electricity consumption. Saskatchewan consumed 23,424 GWh in 2014, a new record, surpassing the previous record set in 2013 of 23,155 GWh.

Most of the increase in electricity demand was met by natural gas turbines. Natural gas powered supply increased from 6,460 GWh in 2013 to 6,883 GWh in 2014.

Coal as a power source peaked in 2009 at 12,317 GWh and has since fallen to 10,219 GWh.

Conclusion

The Saskatchewan economy had a good year in 2014, led by record oil production, retail trade and cattle prices. Growth has pushed up wages and created new jobs, both fueling continued population growth.

Construction began on a new stadium in Regina and construction was completed on the world's first commercial scale CCS power plant in Estevan.

Saskatchewan continues to invest in new capital at rates more than double the Canadian average, which bodes well for future prosperity.


















































































Table 44: Average Farm Price of Principal Grains, Saskatchewan




