

Saskatchewan Labour Force Statistics

February 2016

UNADJUSTED DATA

According to the Statistics Canada Labour Force Survey during the week covering February 14th to 20th, 2016, there were 555,000 persons employed in Saskatchewan. This is a decrease of 8,400 from January 2016 and 3,000 less than the number employed in February 2015.

Agricultural employment was 41,000 persons in February 2016, up 2,400 from the January 2016 level and 2,200 more than the February 2015 agricultural employment level of 38,800. Non-agricultural employment was 514,000 persons in February 2016. This is a decrease of 10,800 from the January 2016 non-agriculture employment level of 524,800 and 5,200 less than February 2015.

The Saskatchewan unemployment rate for February 2016 was 6.7 percent. This is an increase of 0.6 percentage points from the January 2016 rate of 6.1 percent and 1.2 percentage points higher than the February 2015 level of 5.5 percent.

Saskatchewan's labour force decreased by 5,200 to 594,700 persons in February 2016 from 599,900 persons in January 2016. This is 4,000 more than the February 2015 labour force of 590,700 persons.

The Saskatchewan participation rate fell 0.6 percentage points to 68.7 percent in February 2016 from 69.3 percent in January 2016. The February 2015 participation rate for Saskatchewan was 68.8 percent.

There were 39,700 persons unemployed in Saskatchewan during February 2016. This is an increase of 3,100 from January 2016 and 7,000 more than the number unemployed in February 2015.

SEASONALLY ADJUSTED DATA

On a seasonally adjusted basis there were 565,500 persons employed in Saskatchewan in February 2016, down 7,800 from the January 2016 level of 573,300 and down 1,100 from the February 2015 employment level of 566,600 persons.

The Saskatchewan seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for February 2016 was 5.9 percent. This is an increase of 0.3 percentage points from the January 2016 rate of 5.6 percent and 0.8 percentage points higher than the February 2015 rate of 5.1 percent.

CANADIAN DATA

Canadian employment increased by 35,200 persons in February 2016 to 17,697,100 persons from 17,661,900 persons in January 2016. In February 2015, there were 17,582,000 persons employed in Canada.

Canada's unemployment rate increased 0.2 percentage points in February 2016 to 7.7 percent from the January 2016 level of 7.5 percent. In February 2015, Canada's unemployment rate was 7.2 percent.

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for Canada was 7.3 percent in February 2016. This is 0.1 percentage points higher than January 2016 and 0.4 percentage points higher than the February 2015 level of 6.9 percent.
