Saskatchewan Labour Force Statistics

December 2016

UNADJUSTED DATA

According to the Statistics Canada Labour Force Survey during the week covering December 4th to 10th, 2016, there were 563,000 persons employed in Saskatchewan. This is a decrease of 4,800 from November 2016 and 7,900 less than the number employed in December 2015.

Agricultural employment was 37,400 persons in December 2016, down 1,200 from the November 2016 level and 3,200 less than the December 2015 agricultural employment level of 40,600. Non-agricultural employment was 525,600 persons in December 2016. This is a decrease of 3,600 from the November 2016 non-agriculture employment level of 529,200 and 4,700 less than December 2015.

The Saskatchewan <u>unemployment rate</u> for December 2016 was 6.2 percent. This is a decrease of 0.2 percentage points from the November 2016 rate of 6.4 percent but 1.1 percentage points higher than the December 2015 level of 5.1 percent.

Saskatchewan's <u>labour force</u> decreased by 6,300 to 600,300 persons in December 2016 from 606,600 persons in November 2016. This is 1,100 less than the December 2015 labour force of 601,400 persons.

The Saskatchewan <u>participation rate</u> fell 0.8 percentage points to 68.8 percent in December 2016 from 69.6 percent in November 2016. The December 2015 participation rate for Saskatchewan was 69.5 percent.

There were 37,400 persons <u>unemployed</u> in Saskatchewan during December 2016. This is a decrease of 1,400 from November 2016 but is 6,800 more than the number unemployed in December 2015.

SEASONALLY ADJUSTED DATA

On a <u>seasonally adjusted</u> basis there were 568,200 persons <u>employed</u> in Saskatchewan in December 2016, down 1,100 from the November 2016 level of 569,300 and down 6,900 from the December 2015 employment level of 575,100 persons.

The Saskatchewan <u>seasonally adjusted</u> <u>unemployment rate</u> for December 2016 was 6.5 percent. This is a decrease of 0.3 percentage points from the November 2016 rate of 6.8 percent and 1.0 percentage point higher than the December 2015 rate of 5.5 percent.

CANADIAN DATA

Canadian <u>employment</u> decreased by 46,700 persons in December 2016 to 18,133,000 persons from 18,179,700 persons in November 2016. In December 2015, there were 17,915,000 persons employed in Canada.

Canada's <u>unemployment rate</u> increased 0.1 percentage points in December 2016 to 6.4 percent from the November 2016 level of 6.3 percent. In December 2015, Canada's unemployment rate was 6.7 percent.

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for Canada was 6.9 percent in December 2016. This is 0.1 percentage points higher than November 2016 but 0.2 percentage points lower than the December 2015 level of 7.1 percent.
