Saskatchewan Labour Force Statistics

July 2015

UNADJUSTED DATA

According to the Statistics Canada Labour Force Survey during the week covering July 12th to 18th, 2015, there were 575,300 persons <u>employed</u> in Saskatchewan. This is a decrease of 13,800 from June 2015 and 2,100 less than the number employed in July 2014.

Agricultural employment was 42,300 persons in July 2015, up 1,900 from the June 2015 level but 4,800 less than the July 2014 agricultural employment level of 47,100. Non-agricultural employment was 533,000 persons in July 2015. This is a decrease of 15,700 from the June 2015 non-agriculture employment level of 548,700 but 2,700 more than July 2014.

The Saskatchewan <u>unemployment rate</u> for July 2015 was 5.4 percent. This is an increase of 1.2 percentage points from the June 2015 rate of 4.2 percent and 1.8 percentage points higher than the July 2014 level of 3.6 percent.

Saskatchewan's <u>labour force</u> decreased by 6,600 to 608,300 persons in July 2015 from 614,900 persons in June 2015. This is 9,400 more than the July 2014 labour force of 598,900 persons.

The Saskatchewan participation rate fell 0.8 percentage points to 70.6 percent in July 2015 from 71.4 percent in June 2015. The July 2014 participation rate for Saskatchewan was 70.2 percent.

There were 33,000 persons <u>unemployed</u> in Saskatchewan during July 2015. This is an increase of 7,200 from June 2015 and 11,500 more than the number unemployed in July 2014.

SEASONALLY ADJUSTED DATA

On a <u>seasonally adjusted</u> basis there were 568,700 persons <u>employed</u> in Saskatchewan in July 2015, down 7,400 from the June 2015 level of 576.100 and is down 2,700 from the July 2014 employment level of 571,400 persons.

The Saskatchewan seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for July 2015 was 5.2 percent. This is an increase of 0.5 percentage points from the June 2015 rate of 4.7 percent and 1.9 percentage points higher than the July 2014 rate of 3.3 percent.

CANADIAN DATA

Canadian <u>employment</u> decreased by 74,300 persons in July 2015 to 18,240,300 persons from 18,314,600 persons in June 2015. In July 2014, there were 18,077,400 persons employed in Canada.

Canada's <u>unemployment rate</u> increased 0.6 percentage points in July 2015 to 7.1 percent from the June 2015 level of 6.5 percent. In July 2014, Canada's unemployment rate was 7.3 percent.

The <u>seasonally adjusted</u> unemployment rate for Canada was 6.8 percent in July 2015. This remained unchanged from June 2015 and is 0.2 percentage points lower than the July 2014 level of 7.0 percent.
