

Saskatchewan Labour Force Statistics

November 2012

UNADJUSTED DATA

According to the Statistics Canada Labour Force Survey for the week ended November 10, 2012, there were 540,000 persons employed in Saskatchewan during November 2012, a decrease of 1,600 from October 2012 but 15,800 more than the number employed in November 2011.

Agricultural employment was 40,800 persons in November 2012, down 2,900 from the October 2012 level but 2,700 more than the November 2011 agricultural employment level of 38,100. Non-agricultural employment was 499,200 persons in November 2012. This is an increase of 1,300 from the October 2012 non-agriculture employment level of 497,900 and 13,100 more than November 2011.

The Saskatchewan unemployment rate for November 2012 was 4.0 percent. This is unchanged from the October 2012 rate and 0.7 percentage points lower than the November 2011 level of 4.7 percent.

Saskatchewan's labour force decreased by 1,800 to 562,700 persons in November 2012 from 564,500 persons in October 2012. This is 12,700 more than the November 2011 labour force of 550,000 persons.

The Saskatchewan participation rate fell 0.4 percentage points to 68.9 percent in November 2012 from 69.3 percent in October 2012. The November 2011 participation rate for Saskatchewan was 68.4 percent.

There were 22,600 persons unemployed in Saskatchewan during November 2012. This is a decrease of 200 from October 2012 and is 3,200 less than the number unemployed in November 2011.

SEASONALLY ADJUSTED DATA

On a seasonally adjusted basis there were 540,400 persons employed in Saskatchewan in November 2012, down 300 from the October 2012 level of 540,700 but up 16,100 from the November 2011 employment level of 524,300 persons.

The Saskatchewan seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for November 2012 was 4.5 percent. This is a decrease of 0.2 percentage points from the October 2012 rate of 4.7 percent and 0.6 percentage points lower than the November 2011 rate of 5.1 percent.

CANADIAN DATA

Canadian employment decreased by 22,000 persons in November 2012 to 17,605,600 persons from 17,627,600 persons in October 2012. In November 2011, there were 17,316,400 persons employed in Canada.

Canada's unemployment rate in November 2012 was 6.7 percent, unchanged from October 2012. In November 2011, Canada's unemployment rate was 7.0 percent.

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for Canada was 7.2 percent in November 2012. This is 0.2 percentage points lower than October 2012 and 0.3 percentage points lower than the November 2011 level of 7.5 percent.
