Saskatchewan Labour Force Statistics

August 2011

UNADJUSTED DATA

According to the Statistics Canada Labour Force Survey for the week ended August 20, 2011, there were 529,000 persons <u>employed</u> in Saskatchewan during August 2011, a decrease of 3,600 from July 2011 and 3,200 less than the number employed in August 2010.

Agricultural employment was 41,300 persons in August 2011, down 200 from the July 2011 level and 2,800 less than the August 2010 agricultural employment level of 44,100. Non-agricultural employment was 487,700 persons in August 2011. This is a decrease of 3,400 from the July 2011 non-agriculture employment level of 491,100 and 400 less than August 2010.

The Saskatchewan <u>unemployment rate</u> for August 2011 was 5.3 percent. This is an increase of 0.1 percentage points from the July 2011 rate of 5.2 percent but 0.4 percentage points lower than the August 2010 level of 5.7 percent.

Saskatchewan's <u>labour force</u> decreased by 3,300 to 558,800 persons in August 2011 from 562,100 persons in July 2011. This is 5,600 less than the August 2010 labour force of 564,400 persons.

The Saskatchewan participation rate fell 0.5 percentage points to 69.7 percent in August 2011 from 70.2 percent in July 2011. The August 2010 participation rate for Saskatchewan was 71.2 percent.

There were 29,700 persons <u>unemployed</u> in Saskatchewan during August 2011. This is an increase of 200 from July 2011 but is 2,500 less than the number unemployed in August 2010.

SEASONALLY ADJUSTED DATA

On a <u>seasonally adjusted</u> basis there were 523,800 persons <u>employed</u> in Saskatchewan in August 2011, down 3,000 from the July 2011 level of 526,800 and is down 2,700 from the August 2010 employment level of 526,500 persons.

The Saskatchewan seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for August 2011 was 4.5 percent. This is a decrease of 0.4 percentage points from the July 2011 rate of 4.9 percent and 0.3 percentage points lower than the August 2010 rate of 4.8 percent.

CANADIAN DATA

Canadian <u>employment</u> decreased by 43,400 persons in August 2011 to 17,588,800 persons from 17,632,200 persons in July 2011. In August 2010, there were 17,354,100 persons employed in Canada.

Canada's <u>unemployment rate</u> increased 0.3 percentage points in August 2011 to 7.9 percent from the July 2011 level of 7.6 percent. In August 2010, Canada's unemployment rate was 8.7 percent.

The <u>seasonally adjusted</u> unemployment rate for Canada was 7.3 percent in August 2011. This is 0.1 percentage points higher than July 2011 but 0.8 percentage points lower than the August 2010 level of 8.1 percent.
