Saskatchewan Labour Force Statistics

May 2010

UNADJUSTED DATA

According to the Statistics Canada Labour Force Survey for the week ended May 15, 2010, there were 534,100 persons <u>employed</u> in Saskatchewan during May 2010, an increase of 12,400 from April 2010 and 4,000 more than the number employed in May 2009.

Agricultural employment was 44,700 persons in May 2010, up 3,400 from the April 2010 level but 800 less than the May 2009 agricultural employment level of 45,500. Non-agricultural employment was 489,400 persons in May 2010. This is an increase of 9,000 from the April 2010 non-agriculture employment level of 480,400 and 4,800 more than May 2009.

The Saskatchewan <u>unemployment rate</u> for May 2010 was 5.0 percent. This is a decrease of 0.8 percentage points from the April 2010 rate of 5.8 percent but 0.1 percentage points higher than the May 2009 level of 4.9 percent.

Saskatchewan's <u>labour force</u> increased by 8,200 to 562,400 persons in May 2010 from 554,200 persons in April 2010. This is 4,700 more than the May 2009 labour force of persons.

The Saskatchewan <u>participation rate</u> rose 0.9 percentage points to 71.2 percent in May 2010 from 70.3 percent in April 2010. The May 2009 participation rate for Saskatchewan was 71.7 percent.

There were 28,300 persons <u>unemployed</u> in Saskatchewan during May 2010. This is a decrease of 4,100 from April 2010 but is 700 more than the number unemployed in May 2009.

SEASONALLY ADJUSTED DATA

On a <u>seasonally adjusted</u> basis there were 526,000 persons <u>employed</u> in Saskatchewan in May 2010, down 1,800 from the April 2010 level of 527,800 and is up 4,400 from the May 2009 employment level of 521,600 persons.

The Saskatchewan seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for May 2010 was 5.0 percent. This is a decrease of 0.2 percentage points from the April 2010 rate of percent but 0.1 percentage points higher than the May 2009 rate of 4.9 percent.

CANADIAN DATA

Canadian <u>employment</u> increased by 348,500 persons in May 2010 to 17,232,900 persons from 16,884,400 persons in April 2010. In May 2009, there were 16,952,300 persons employed in Canada.

Canada's <u>unemployment rate</u> decreased 0.1 percentage points to 8.3 percent from the April 2010 level of 8.7 percent. In May 2009, Canada's unemployment rate was 8.7 percent.

The <u>seasonally adjusted</u> unemployment rate for Canada was 8.1 percent in May 2010. This is 0.0 percentage points higher than April 2010 but 0.4 percentage points lower than the May 2009 level of 8.5 percent.
