Saskatchewan Labour Force Statistics

June 2010

UNADJUSTED DATA

According to the Statistics Canada Labour Force Survey for the week ended June 19, 2010, there were 539,700 persons <u>employed</u> in Saskatchewan during June 2010, an increase of 5,600 from May 2010 and 4,100 more than the number employed in June 2009.

Agricultural employment was 43,600 persons in June 2010, down 1,100 from the May 2010 level and 800 less than the June 2009 agricultural employment level of 44,400. Non-agricultural employment was 496,100 persons in June 2010. This is an increase of 6,700 from the May 2010 non-agriculture employment level of 489,400 and 4,900 more than June 2009.

The Saskatchewan <u>unemployment rate</u> for June 2010 was 4.9 percent. This is a decrease of 0.1 percentage points from the May 2010 rate of 5.0 percent but 1.0 percentage point higher than the June 2009 level of 3.9 percent.

Saskatchewan's <u>labour force</u> increased by 4,900 to 567,300 persons in June 2010 from 562,400 persons in May 2010. This is 9,800 more than the June 2009 labour force of 557,500 persons.

The Saskatchewan <u>participation rate</u> rose 0.5 percentage points to 71.7 percent in June 2010 from 71.2 percent in May 2010. The June 2009 participation rate for Saskatchewan was 71.5 percent.

There were 27,700 persons <u>unemployed</u> in Saskatchewan during June 2010. This is a decrease of 600 from May 2010 but is 5,800 more than the number unemployed in June 2009.

SEASONALLY ADJUSTED DATA

On a <u>seasonally adjusted</u> basis there were 528,100 persons <u>employed</u> in Saskatchewan in June 2010, up 2,100 from the May 2010 level of 526,000 and is up 3,500 from the June 2009 employment level of 524,600 persons.

The Saskatchewan <u>seasonally adjusted</u> <u>unemployment rate</u> for June 2010 was 5.5 percent. This is an increase of 0.5 percentage points from the May 2010 rate of 5.0 percent and 0.9 percentage points higher than the June 2009 rate of 4.6 percent.

CANADIAN DATA

Canadian <u>employment</u> increased by 301,300 persons in June 2010 to 17,534,200 persons from 17,232,900 persons in May 2010. In June 2009, there were 17,158,700 persons employed in Canada.

Canada's <u>unemployment rate</u> decreased 0.9 percentage points to 7.4 percent from the May 2010 level of 8.3 percent. In June 2009, Canada's unemployment rate was 8.1 percent.

The <u>seasonally adjusted</u> unemployment rate for Canada was 7.9 percent in June 2010. This is 0.2 percentage points lower than May 2010 and 0.7 percentage points lower than the June 2009 level of 8.6 percent.
