Saskatchewan Labour Force Statistics

August 2009

UNADJUSTED DATA

According to the Statistics Canada Labour Force Survey for the week ended August 15, 2009, there were 521,400 persons <u>employed</u> in Saskatchewan during August 2009, a decrease of 4,900 from July 2009 but 1,800 more than the number employed in August 2008.

Agricultural employment was 44,500 persons in August 2009, down 700 from the July 2009 level but 300 more than the August 2008 agricultural employment level of 44,200. Non-agricultural employment was 476,900 persons in August 2009. This is a decrease of 4,200 from the July 2009 non-agriculture employment level of 481,100 but 1,500 more than August 2008.

The Saskatchewan <u>unemployment rate</u> for August 2009 was 6.1 percent. This is an increase of 0.9 percentage points from the July 2009 rate of 5.2 percent and 0.7 percentage points higher than the August 2008 level of 5.4 percent.

Saskatchewan's <u>labour force</u> increased by 200 to 555,100 persons in August 2009 from 554,900 persons in July 2009. This is 5,700 more than the August 2008 labour force of 549,400 persons.

The Saskatchewan <u>participation rate</u> was 71.1 percent in August 2009, unchanged from July 2009. The August 2008 participation rate for Saskatchewan was 71.4 percent.

There were 33,700 persons <u>unemployed</u> in Saskatchewan during August 2009. This is an increase of 5,100 from July 2009 and is 3,900 more than the number unemployed in August 2008.

SEASONALLY ADJUSTED DATA

On a <u>seasonally adjusted</u> basis there were 516,900 persons <u>employed</u> in Saskatchewan in August 2009, down 3,200 from the July 2009 level of 520,100 but is up 3,800 from the August 2008 employment level of 513,100 persons.

The Saskatchewan seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for August 2009 was 5.0 percent. This is an increase of 0.3 percentage points from the July 2009 rate of 4.7 percent and 0.5 percentage points higher than the August 2008 rate of 4.5 percent.

CANADIAN DATA

Canadian <u>employment</u> increased by 9,600 persons in August 2009 to 17,080,400 persons from 17,070,800 persons in July 2009. In August 2008, there were 17,391,900 persons employed in Canada.

Canada's <u>unemployment rate</u> increased 0.1 percentage points to 9.0 percent from the July 2009 level of 8.9 percent. In August 2008, Canada's unemployment rate 6.5 percent.

The <u>seasonally adjusted</u> unemployment rate for Canada was 8.7 percent in August 2009. This is 0.1 percentage points higher than July 2009 and 2.5 percentage points higher than the August 2008 level of 6.2 percent.
