

Saskatchewan Labour Force Statistics

July 2008

UNADJUSTED DATA

According to the Statistics Canada Labour Force Survey for the week ended July 19, 2008, there were 514,900 persons employed in Saskatchewan during July 2008, a decrease of 6,200 from June 2008 and 6,300 more than the number employed in July 2007.

Agricultural employment was 44,300 persons in July 2008, up 1,800 from the June 2008 level but 3,800 less than the July 2007 agricultural employment level of 48,100. Non-agricultural employment was 470,600 persons in July 2008. This is a decrease of 8,000 from the June 2008 non-agriculture employment level of 478,600 but 10,100 more than July 2007.

The Saskatchewan unemployment rate for July 2008 was 4.8 percent. This is an increase of 1.4 percentage points from the June 2008 rate of 3.4 percent but 0.0 percentage points higher than the July 2007 level of 4.8 percent.

Saskatchewan's labour force increased by 1,200 to 540,700 persons in July 2008 from 539,500 persons in June 2008. This is 6,200 more than the July 2007 labour force of 534,500 persons.

The Saskatchewan participation rate rose 0.0 percentage points to 70.4 percent in July 2008 from 70.4 percent in June 2008. The July 2007 participation rate for Saskatchewan was 71.2 percent.

There were 25,800 persons unemployed in Saskatchewan during July 2008. This is an increase of 7,400 from June 2008 but zero more than the number unemployed in July 2007.

SEASONALLY ADJUSTED DATA

On a seasonally adjusted basis there were 505,400 persons employed in Saskatchewan in July 2008, down 4,000 from the June 2008 level of 509,400 and is up 7,500 from the July 2007 employment level of 497,900 persons.

The Saskatchewan seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for July 2008 was 4.4 percent. This is an increase of 0.4 percentage points from the June 2008 rate of 4.0 percent and 0.4 percentage points lower than the July 2007 rate of 4.8 percent.

CANADIAN DATA

Canadian employment decreased by 81,500 persons in July 2008 to 17,417,900 persons from 17,499,400 persons in June 2008. In July 2007, there were 17,214,700 persons employed in Canada.

Canada's unemployment rate increased 0.7 percentage points to 6.3 percent from the June 2008 level of 5.6 percent. In July 2007, Canada's unemployment rate was 6.2 percent.

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for Canada was 6.1 percent in July 2008. This is 0.1 percentage points lower than June 2008 but 0.1 percentage points higher than the July 2007 level of 6.0 percent.
