### Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

December 2015

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index decreased 0.8 percent between November 2015 and December 2015 while the Canada All-items Index declined 0.5 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index both fell 0.8 percent during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the December All-items Index decreased from November 2015 primarily due to lower prices for gasoline, women's clothing, men's clothing, travel tours and footwear.

Moderating these decreases were higher prices for purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, fresh vegetables, non-alcoholic beverages, homeowners' home and mortgage insurance and cereal products (excluding baby food).

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 1.8 percent between December 2014 and December 2015 while the Canada All-items Index increased 1.6 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 1.6 percent and 1.9 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The December All-items Index increased from December 2014 primarily due to higher prices for purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, homeowners' home and mortgage insurance, fresh vegetables, electricity and water.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for gasoline, furniture, homeowner's replacement cost, recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles) and travel tours.
