

Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

September 2014

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index increased 0.1 percent between August 2014 and September 2014 while the Canada All-items Index was increased 0.1 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index both rose 0.1 percent during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the September All-items Index increased from August 2014 primarily due to higher prices for passenger vehicle insurance premiums, children's clothing (including infants), tuition fees and women's clothing. Prices also increased for purchase and operation of recreational vehicles, child care and housekeeping services and natural gas.

Moderating these increases were lower prices for purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, bakery products, traveller accommodation and gasoline. Prices also fell for furniture, cereal products (excluding infant food) and personal care supplies and equipment.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 2.2 percent between September 2013 and September 2014 while the Canada All-items Index increased 2.0 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 2.2 percent and 2.1 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The September All-items Index increased from September 2013 primarily due to higher prices for natural gas, passenger vehicle insurance premiums, electricity and purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles. Prices also increased for water, food purchased from restaurants and gasoline.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for cereal products (excluding infant food, telephone services, non-alcoholic beverages and coffee and tea. Prices also fell for men's clothing, bakery products and home entertainment equipment, parts and services.
