

Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

October 2014

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index increased 0.5 percent between September 2014 and October 2014 while the Canada All-items Index advanced 0.1 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index rose 0.5 percent and 0.6 percent, respectively, during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the October All-items Index increased from September 2013 primarily due to higher prices for the purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, property taxes (including special charges), furniture and homeowners' home and mortgage insurance. Prices also rose for men's clothing, processed meat and fresh or frozen beef.

Moderating these increases were lower prices for gasoline, traveller accommodations, women's clothing and personal care supplies and equipment. Prices also declined for fresh vegetables, preserved fruit and fruit preparations and preserved vegetables and vegetables preparation.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 2.5 percent between October 2013 and October 2014 while the Canada All-items Index increased 2.4 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 2.5 percent and 2.6 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The October All-items Index increased from October 2013 primarily due to increased prices for natural gas, passenger vehicles insurance premiums, gasoline and electricity. Prices also rose for fresh or frozen beef, processed meat and food purchased from restaurants.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for women's clothing, home entertainment equipment, parts and services and non-alcoholic beverages. Prices also dropped for telephone services, travel tours, non-electrical kitchen utensils, tables and cookware and coffee and tea.
