

Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

April 2011

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index increased 0.2 percent between March 2011 and April 2011 while the Canada All-items Index advanced 0.3 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index both rose 0.1 percent during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the April All-items Index increased from March 2011 primarily due to higher prices for gasoline, personal care supplies and equipment, sugar and confectionery and fresh or frozen beef. Prices also rose for cablevision and satellite services, furniture and passenger vehicle parts~ maintenance and repairs.

Moderating these increases were price reductions for women's clothing, men's clothing, children's clothing and footwear. Prices also fell for fresh vegetables, dairy products and traveller accommodation.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 2.6 percent between April 2010 and April 2011 while the Canada All-items Index increased 3.3 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 2.7 percent and 2.3 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The April All-items Index increased from April 2010 primarily due to higher prices for gasoline, electricity, homeowners' home and mortgage insurance, rent, replacement cost and property taxes. Prices also rose for food purchased from restaurants.

These increases were partially offset by price decreases for natural gas, women's clothing, men's clothing and prescribed medicines. Prices also fell for recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles), furniture and passenger vehicle insurance premiums
