

Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

November 2011

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index increased 0.3 percent between October 2011 and November 2011 while the Canada All-items Index advanced 0.1 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index both rose 0.2 percent during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the November All-items Index increased from October 2011 primarily due to higher prices for the purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, passenger vehicles parts, maintenance and repairs and clothing accessories, watches and jewellery. Prices also rose for dairy products, fresh vegetables, mortgage interest cost and homeowners' home and mortgage insurance.

Moderating these increases were lower prices for gasoline, traveller accommodations and bakery products. Prices also declined for women's clothing, recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles), cigarettes and paper, plastic and foil supplies.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 2.9 percent between November 2010 and November 2011 while the Canada All-items Index also increased 2.9 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 3.1 percent and 2.6 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The November All-items Index increased from November 2010 primarily due to higher prices for gasoline, telephone services and food purchased from restaurants. Prices also rose for rent, mortgage interest cost, homeowners' replacement cost and homeowners' home and mortgage insurance.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for furniture, household appliances, recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles) and home entertainment equipment, parts and services. Prices also decreased for footwear, prescribed medicines and eye care goods.
