

Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

August 2010

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index increased 0.3 percent between July 2010 and August 2010 while the Canada All-items Index declined 0.1 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index rose 0.3 percent and 0.2 percent, respectively, during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the August All-items Index increased from July 2010 primarily due to higher prices for electricity, the purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, and fresh fruit. Prices also rose for personal care supplies and equipment, dairy products, processed meat, and prescribed medicines.

Moderating these increases were lower prices for traveller accommodation, gasoline, and women's clothing. Prices also fell for inter-city transportation, men's clothing, cigarettes, and the purchase and operation of recreational vehicles.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 0.8 percent between August 2009 and August 2010 while the Canada All-items Index increased 1.7 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 0.9 percent and 0.8 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The August All-items Index increased from August 2009 primarily due to higher prices for the purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, rent, and electricity. Prices also rose for food purchased from restaurants, replacement (new housing) cost, cigarettes, and water.

These increases were partially offset by decreased prices for gasoline, homeowners' home and mortgage insurance, and prescribed medicines. Prices also fell for property taxes (including special charges), natural gas, home entertainment equipment, parts, and services, and inter-city transportation.
