

Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

February 2009

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index increased 0.7 percent between January 2009 and February 2009 while the Canada All-items Index also advanced 0.7 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index rose 0.7 percent and 0.8 percent, respectively, during the same period

In Saskatchewan, the February All-items Index increased from January 2009 primarily due to higher prices for gasoline, travel tours, men's clothing and personal care supplies and equipment. Prices also rose for furniture, child care and domestic services and mortgage interest cost.

Moderating these increases were lower prices for fresh fruit, fresh vegetables, sugar and confectionery and preserved fruit and fruit preparations. Prices also fell for home entertainment equipment – parts and services, purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles and fuel oil and other fuels.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 2.6 percent between February 2008 and February 2009 while the Canada All-items Index increased 1.4 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 3.3 percent and 2.4 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The February All-items Index increased from February 2008 primarily due to increased prices for mortgage interest cost, housing replacement cost, rent, property taxes (including special charges) and natural gas. Prices also rose for food purchased from restaurants and fresh vegetables.

These increases were partially offset by decreased prices for gasoline, purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, purchase and operation of recreational vehicles and recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles). Prices also fell for home entertainment equipment – parts and services, telephone services and fuel oil and other fuels.
