

Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

June 2017

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index remained unchanged between May 2017 and June 2017 while the Canada All-items Index declined 0.1 percent. The Regina All-items Consumer Price Index remained unchanged whereas the Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price climbed 0.1 percent during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the June All-items Index remained unchanged from May 2017, despite remaining unchanged, prices increased for: purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles; fresh vegetables; travel tours; food purchased from restaurants; and personal care supplies and equipment.

These increases were offset by lower prices for: gasoline; men's clothing; traveller accommodation; footwear; and women's clothing.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 0.5 percent between June 2016 and June 2017 while the Canada All-items Index increased 1.0 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 0.4 percent and 0.7 percent respectively, during the same period.

The June All-items Index increased from June 2016 primarily due to higher prices for: food purchased from restaurants; electricity; travel tours; water; and cigarettes.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for: gasoline; telephone services; traveller accommodation; purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles; and cereal products (excluding baby food).
