# Saskatchewan Quarterly Population Report

Fourth Quarter 2017

### **TOTAL POPULATION**

Saskatchewan's population was estimated to be 1,169,752 as of January 1, 2018, according to Statistics Canada. This is an increase of 1,695 persons since October 1, 2017, and an increase of 13,410 persons from January 1, 2017. The fourth quarter (October 1 – December 31) saw Saskatchewan's population increase 0.15 per cent, the sixth highest of the ten provinces.

Table 1 shows the quarterly population estimates and growth rates for Saskatchewan, Manitoba and Alberta over the past two years.

Saskatchewan's annual population growth rate was the sixth highest of all the provinces. P.E.I. and Ontario had the largest growth rate among all provinces. Table 2 shows the January 1, 2018 population estimates for all provinces and territories along with their quarterly and annual growth rates

## **NATURAL INCREASE**

Saskatchewan had 3,766 births and 2,563 deaths during the fourth quarter of 2017 producing a natural increase of 1,203. The natural increase in same time period last year was 1,188.

### **MIGRATION**

Preliminary data suggests that in the fourth quarter of 2017, 2,543 Canadian residents moved to Saskatchewan as 4,323 Canadian residents left the province for a net interprovincial loss of 1,780 persons. In the fourth quarter of 2016, Saskatchewan had a net interprovincial migration loss of 970 persons.

Alberta was the primary source of interprovincial migration movement (46.5 per cent of in-migration and 47.6 per cent of outmigration). Table 3 provides origin and destination flows of interprovincial migrants for the October 1 to December 31 period.

Net international migration added 2,272 people to Saskatchewan in the fourth quarter of 2017. This is down from 5,012 people in the third quarter of 2017. In the fourth quarter of 2016, net international migration was 2,534.
