

Saskatchewan Quarterly Population Report

Second Quarter 2018

TOTAL POPULATION

Saskatchewan's population was estimated to be 1,162,062 as of July 1, 2018, according to Statistics Canada. This is an increase of 3,226 persons since April 1, 2018, and an increase of 11,280 persons from July 1, 2017. The second quarter (April 1 – June 30) saw Saskatchewan's population increase 0.28 per cent, the eight highest of the ten provinces.

Table 1 shows the quarterly population estimates and growth rates for Saskatchewan, Manitoba and Alberta over the past two years.

Saskatchewan's annual population growth rate was the seventh highest of all the provinces. Ontario and P.E.I. had the largest growth rate among all provinces. Table 2 shows the July 1, 2018 population estimates for all provinces and territories along with their quarterly and annual growth rates.

NATURAL INCREASE

Saskatchewan had 3,965 births and 2,306 deaths during the second quarter of 2018 producing a natural increase of 1,659. The natural increase in same time period last year was 1,670.

MIGRATION

Preliminary data suggests that in the second quarter of 2018, 5,721 Canadian residents moved to Saskatchewan as 8,539 Canadian residents left the province for a net interprovincial loss of 2,818 persons. In the second quarter of 2017, Saskatchewan had a net interprovincial migration loss of 1,913 persons.

Alberta was the primary source of interprovincial migration movement (43.6 per cent of in-migration and 44.5 per cent of out-migration). Table 3 provides origin and destination flows of interprovincial migrants for the April 1 to June 30 period.

Net international migration added 4,385 people to Saskatchewan in the second quarter of 2018. This is up from 2,706 people in the first quarter of 2018. In the second quarter of 2017, net international migration was 4,385.
