CHAPTER G-5.1 REG 114

The Government Organization Act

Title

1 These regulations may be cited as *The Department of Property Management Regulations*.

Department of Property Management established

2 The Department of Property Management is established.

Objects and purposes

3 The objects and purposes of the Department of Property Management are to provide the structure wherein and whereby the powers, responsibilities and functions of the Minister of Property Management may be exercised and carried out, and with respect to those objects and purposes, to do the following:

- (a) to acquire, dispose of, develop, provide, construct, alter, repair, maintain, manage, equip and operate property;
- (b) to acquire, hold or dispose of security interests in property;
- (c) to develop, service and improve lands;
- (d) to erect, construct, alter, equip or improve buildings, structures or other improvements;
- (e) to acquire, provide, manage, operate and maintain services, accommodation and facilities;
- (f) to conduct and co-ordinate research, studies, investigations, examinations, analyses, surveys and programs.

Coming into force

4(1) Subject to subsection (2), these regulations come into force on April 1, 2005.

(2) If these regulations are filed with the Registrar of Regulations after April 1, 2005, these regulations come into force on the day on which they are filed with the Registrar of Regulations.
